Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of October 2024



Oct 2

Officers were requested by Sharon Township PD to assist in attempting to serve multiple felony warrants on an individual. Officers approached the house while a fourth officer secured the rear. A female answered after officers knocked on the door. She was identified as the individual's ex-wife. She stated her ex-husband did not live there but allowed officers to search the home. Sharon officers spoke with the resident to gain information while Perry officers cleared without further involvement.

Oct 2

Officer was dispatched to the 1200 block of Clubview Blvd N on report of a found iPad. Officer met with the caller. She stated that her son found an iPad in the front yard while mowing the grass. They had hoped someone would come by looking for it, but no one ever did. The iPad was impounded as found property.

Oct 3

Officer arrived at Perry Twp HQ to speak with an individual who wanted to file a report that he had been threatened. The individual explained that he and another individual knew each other through business sales. At some point, the other individual stopped paying the balance on his account. There is an open civil lawsuit between the two. Officer obtained pertinent information about alleged threats received by the reporting individual and cleared the call.

Oct 3

Officer responded to an accident on Riverside Dr. Unit 1 was traveling south on Riverside Dr and stopped for traffic ahead. Unit 2 was also traveling south and was unable to come to a complete stop before striking the rear of unit 1. All involved parties stated that they were uninjured and refused medical treatment at the scene. Operator of unit 2 was issued a citation for ACDA.

Oct 4

While traveling north on Riverside Dr, officer observed a vehicle traveling south from Canterbury Rd at a high rate of speed. Officer's radar confirmed a speed of 64 mph. Officer initiated a traffic stop. Officer discovered that the driver had a non-compliance suspension on a Franklin County citation. Officer issued a citation for speed and driving under suspension.

Oct 5

Officer observed a vehicle traveling westbound on SR-161 in the 2300 block. Officer could not observe a registration plate on the vehicle. Officer observed the vehicle pass two vehicles ahead of, going left of the double yellow lines near Federated Blvd. Officer observed the vehicle turn left and run the red light at the intersection. Officer was able to initiate a traffic stop. The suspect quickly parked and exited the vehicle and ignored multiple officer commands to get back in the vehicle. Officer informed the suspect that he was being detained and the suspect attempted to resist multiple times. Suspect finally complied when officer removed taser from holster. Officer placed the suspect in the rear of his cruiser for the remainder of the traffic stop.

Officer discovered that the driver did not have a valid license and had an active judgement suspension. Suspect admitted that he had observed that officer was behind him and that he was scared and trying to get away. Officer explained that the reckless driving was the reason for the stop. The driver was issued a citation for P118787 for operating a motor vehicle without a valid license, driving under suspension, passing on a double yellow, and failure to obey a traffic control device.

Oct 5

Officer assisted Sharon Twp OD on mutual aid in their search for a protection order violator still in the area. Officer joined Sharon Officers in their search for a male & female who caused a disturbance in an attempt to take their children from the children's legal guardians. Officer deployed a UAS for the search. Officer did not locate anything of interest during the search. The suspects were not located, but Sharon Officers impounded the vehicle associated with the male and female.

Oct 8

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Rd. Unit 1 was traveling south on US-33. Unit 2 was traveling north and turning onto Hayden Run Rd. Unit 2 failed to yield making the left turn, causing the front of unit 2 to strike the front of unit 1. Unit 2 was taken to the hospital for treatment by Norwich Township medics. Unit 2 was cited for failing to yield on a left turn. Unit 1 was cited for not having a license.

Oct 8

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Rd. Unit 1 failed to maintain their lane of travel and made contact with unit 2. Unit 1 was cited for rules of a turn and no operator's license.

Oct 9

Officer observed a minivan run a solid red light at the intersection of Fishinger Rd and Riverside Dr. Officer conducted a traffic stop in the McDonald's parking lot. The driver spoke limited English. The driver admitted that she did not have a valid license in the United States. She presented a Mexico license which expired in 2004. The driver had two previous violations in Franklin County for driving without a license. The driver's license plate was also expired. Officer issued a citation for driving without a license plate.

Oct 10

Officer responded to a call reporting damage/vandalism to a vehicle. The caller stated that he believes his car's paint was intentionally scratched down both doors on the passenger side.

Oct 11

Officers were dispatched to the 1600 block of Gables Ct on a report of a possible suicide attempt. Officers met with the individual and provided aid resources after counseling with them.

Oct 14

A caller called Columbus Police to tell them about an online threat to shoot up a school. CPD notified Perry PD as there are schools in Perry's jurisdiction.

Oct 16

Officer was dispatched to the 5500 block of Riverside Dr on a theft. Officer spoke with the homeowner, who stated that an individual stopped by her house and removed items from her property that is under construction on two separate occasions. While she was showing video,

the individual appeared at the house again. Officer spoke with the individual and learned that he has been doing work on the property for weeks and that the homeowner knows him. The homeowner confirmed and stated that she didn't recognize him. No crime was committed and officer cleared the scene.

Oct 16

Officers were dispatched to the 8300 block of Fairway Dr to assist Worthington Fire on a carbon monoxide alarm that was reading 54. Worthington Fire had to force entry to the side door of the garage. Attempts to reach the homeowner were unsuccessful.

Oct 18

Officers were dispatched to the 6600 block of Merwin Rd on reports of two 13-year olds who were picked up by an uber driver at the UDF gas station on Hard Rd at Smoky Row Rd. Officer met with the driver, who asked that officers make sure both juveniles make it home safely. Officers took custody of the juveniles and transported them home. Officers made contact with the grandmother of one of the juveniles. She was understandably upset and took custody of the juvenile. Officer transported the other juvenile to her home, where officer made contact with her mother. The mother was upset and stated she wanted a restraining order. Officer advised that he was taking a report and explained how to contact Columbus Police and Franklin County Courts to look at the possibility of getting a restraining order.

Oct 18

Officers responded to an accident on US-33 at the intersection with Fishinger Rd. Unit 1 was traveling northbound on US-33 approaching Fishinger. Unit 2 was attempting to turn eastbound on Fishinger from US-33 southbound. The driver of unit 1 stated he had a green light and entered the intersection when he was struck in the center front of Unit 1 by the center front of Unit 2. The driver of unit 2 was issued a citation for failure to yield when turning left and driving under a non-compliance suspension with a summons to appear. The driver of unit 2 was transported to the hospital by UA Medic 72. Unit 1 refused medical attention.

Oct 19

Officers observed a motorist with a cell phone while operating a motor vehicle on Riverside Dr. Officers initiated a traffic stop. Officer discovered that the driver was driving with a temporary operator's permit without a valid driver in the vehicle. She was issued a summons for operator a motor vehicle without a valid license and texting while driving. The vehicle was impounded.

Oct 19

While traveling south on Riverside Dr, officer observed a northbound vehicle in the curb lane passing Fishinger Rd traveling at a high rate of speed. Officer activated his front radar and received a digital reading and audio doppler tone confirming a speed of 55 MPH which increased to 60 MPH. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The driver did not have a license in her possession. Officer could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the vehicle interior. When asked if there was alcohol in the car, the driver said "no." Officer illuminated the interior of the backseat and could see a large bottle of vodka, nearly empty, sitting at the feet of the rear passenger. The passenger immediately denied the bottle was his. When asked, he stated he was 17 and presented his ID. Officer observed both an Ohio and Pennsylvania ID. When asked for the PA ID, he was evasive and reluctant to present it, stating it belonged to his sister. Officer demanded that it be handed over, to which he reluctantly replied. The PA ID had his picture and name but a varied stated of birth indicate that he was 22 years old. Officer also observed a vape tobacco device, which he also denied was his. His parents arrived within minutes and he was released to their custody. The other rear seat passenger was released to

her parent. Officer had the driver dump the alcoholic containers into the grass. The PA ID and vape were destroyed. The driver was issued a citation for speeding and she was advised that the juvenile court would notify her for the necessary appearance information. She exhibited no signs of impairment and was allowed to drive home from the scene.

Oct 20

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Run Rd. Unit 1 southbound on US-33 approaching the intersection. Unit 2 was northbound on US-33 and failed to yield while turning onto Hayden Run Rd west, causing both units to collide in the intersection. Unit 2 was cited for failure to yield on a left turn.

Oct 23

Officers were dispatched to the 6500 block of McVey Blvd for a possible suicide attempt or overdose. The caller stated that he received a call stating one of his patients who lived at the address possibly took the wrong medication and was lying on the floor. Officer arrived on scene and received no answer after knocking on the front door. Officer advised dispatch and went to the rear of the house in an attempt to gain access. Officer located the rear sliding door which was unlocked and announced his presence. Officer made contact with the subject with the female on the floor. She stated that she took nighttime pills instead of daytime pills. Her husband stated he was the one who had called the doctor. Worthington Medic 101 arrived on scene and cleared without further treatment or transport.

Oct 24

Officers responded to a multivehicle accident on US-33 south of the intersection with McCoy Rd. All units were heading northbound on US-33. Driver of unit 2 stated he was stopped at the red light and was struck in the rear by unit 3. The impact sent the front of unit 2 into the rear of unit 1. The driver of unit 3 admitted fault. The driver of unit 3 was issued a citation for ACDA. Unit 1 left the scene prior to officers arriving.

Oct 25

Officer was driving on Clubview Blvd N and witnessed a vehicle driving erratically without headlights. The vehicle kept slowing down, speeding up, and almost stopping in the roadway. Officer also discovered that the license plate was not registered to the vehicle it was on. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The driver stated that he had just bought the vehicle from a friend. Driver did not have a bill of sale. Officer determined that the plates did belong to him. Officer spoke with the driver's friend and determined that the driver had not bought the vehicle yet but was planning to the following week. Officer advised the driver that it is illegal to have license plates that are registered with another vehicle on a vehicle that he does not yet own. The driver was issued a citation for driving without headlights at sunset and driving a vehicle with fictitious plates that belonged to another vehicle with a summons to appear in court.

Oct 26

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Clifton Rd. Unit 1 was southbound on US-33 stopped in traffic. Unit 2 failed to stop in time and struck the rear of unit 1. The driver of unit 2 was cited for ACDA. Unit 2's vehicle was towed by Capital Towing.

Oct 28

While conducting traffic enforcement in the area of Brookside Estates. Officer observed a vehicle fail to stop at a stop sign on McVey Blvd north at Merwin Rd. Officer initiated a traffic stop. Officer discovered that the driver was driving with a license forfeiture. The driver was able to pay out the bench warrant on scene and officer confirmed the payment was successful. Due

to a juvenile and infant in the vehicle, a licensed driver was allowed to drive the vehicle from the scene. The unlicensed driver was issued a citation for disobeying a traffic control device with a mandatory court appearance.

Oct 28

Officer observed a vehicle traveling north on Riverside Dr near Edgewood Rd at a high rate of speed. Officer observed the vehicle's speed to be 65 MPH in a 45 MPH zone. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The driver was able to provide his license but not proof of insurance. Officer discovered that the driver had a non-compliance suspension. Officer also discovered that the driver had been stopped previously for window tint and driving under suspension. The driver was issued a citation for speed, driving under suspension, and operating a motor vehicle without a valid license. The driver was given notice of a mandatory court appearance, his license was confiscated, and the vehicle was impounded.

Oct 28

Officer observed a vehicle traveling westbound on Henders Rd near Charlbury Dr at a high rate of speed with its high beams on a failing to dim for multiple other vehicles. Officer observed the vehicle's speed to be 49 MPH in a 35 MPH zone. Officer conducted a traffic stop. The driver provided insurance and an international driving permit stating that she was from Nigeria. Officer discovered that the permit could be purchased online by anyone. When officer requested a government issued license, the driver did not have one. Officer issued a citation for driving without a license and speed with a mandatory court appearance.

Oct 29

Officer was dispatched to the 1000 block of Clubview Blvd S on a vandalism. The reporting party stated that someone keyed the driver's side door on a his vehicle while it was sitting in his driveway Sunday night. He further stated that he made another report when someone keyed the passenger side several weeks ago.

Oct 30

Officer was dispatched to the 3000 block of Brookdown Dr on a reported identity theft. The caller stated that his wife was receiving letters from debt collectors regarding multiple unpaid debts in Georgia using her name and information. Officer collected pertinent information about the purchases and advised the affected parties that that the detective bureau would be in contact with them.

Oct 30

Officers responded to a single car accident at the intersection of US-33 and Lane Rd. Unit 1 was traveling southbound on US-33. Witnesses stated that the vehicle started to swerve before driving off the right side of the roadway and struck the end of a guardrail. Unit 1 then continued into the entrance of Griggs Reservoir Park before coming to a stop in the parking lot. Upper Arlington Medic 72 later determined that the driver suffered a medical emergency due to low blood sugar. The driver was cleared by medics without transport and picked up by her husband. No citations were issued.

Oct 31

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of US-33 and Chateau Cir. Southbound unit 2 failed to stop in time and struck the rear of unit 1. Driver of unit 2 was cited for ACDA.

Oct 31

While patrolling on Clubview Blvd S for Beggars Night, officer was flagged down by a pedestrian that she saw someone exit a white BMW sedan, run up to a house, steal a bowl of candy, and drive off at a high rate of speed eastbound on Clubview Blvd S form Southview Dr. Officer located the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop. Officer advised the driver and passenger of the complaint. The driver admitted to stealing from two-three houses in the area. Officer issued a warning for speed and confiscated the stolen bowls of candy. The suspects were released pending further investigation. Officer canvassed the neighborhood and tried to locate the theft victims. Officer was able to return two of the bowls to one of the addresses but could not locate the third victim.
