Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of November 2024



Nov 1

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Run Rd. Unit 2 was eastbound on Hayden Run Rd. Unit 1 was westbound on Hayden Rd. Unit 2 failed to yield while turning north on to US-33 and was struck by unit 1. Unit 2 was cited for failure to yield on left turn. Both units were towed by Capital Towing. The two occupants in unit 1 were transported to the hospital.

Nov 2

Officers were dispatched to the area of Riverside and Cranston on a pedestrian walking on the side of Riverside Dr. Officers made contact with the individual. He appeared to be a little disoriented. He advised that he is depressed and was off his medication. Officers called for a medic and UA Medic 72 arrived on scene. The individual was transported to the hospital for a mental evaluation.

Nov 3

Officer was dispatched to Fishinger Rd and Riverside Dr on a non-injury traffic crash involving four vehicles. Officers confirmed that there were no injuries. Officer determined that the accident occurred on the Fishinger Rd bridge in the eastbound lanes of traffic approaching Riverside Dr which is in CPD's jurisdiction. Officer completed an investigation and verified that all parties exchanged information.

Nov 3

Officer was working speed enforcement on Henderson Rd and observed a vehicle traveling westbound on the area of Charlbury Dr at an estimated speed of 51 MPH. Officer initiated a traffic stop. Officer made contact with the driver, who stated that he did not have an Ohio drivers' license and only had a Honduras driver's license. Officer stated that he has lived in Ohio for approximately two years. Officer was cited for speed and no operator's license.

Nov 4

Officer was dispatched to the 6100 block of McVey Blvd on a theft from a motor vehicle. Officer spoke with the homeowner, who stated that unknown person(s) pried open the window of a locked work van and removed tools totaling \$2670.00.

Nov 4

Officer met with the president of the Civic Association for Arlington Point, who stated that an unknown person struck the brick wall just south of the 2500 block of Riverside Dr, removed all political signs along the road, and threw them behind the wall that was hit.

Nov 4

Officer observed a motorcycle pass on a double yellow line, a marked lanes violation. Officer initiated a traffic stop and discovered that the rider only had a temporary endorsement and was riding at night.

Nov 5

Officer responded to a report of a theft in the 1170 block of Circle on the Green. Officer spoke with the homeowner, who stated that he was on vacation for two weeks. While on vacation, a neighbor discovered two political signs of the opposite party on his lawn and removed them for him. The homeowner also stated that a Harris political sign and an anti-Trump sign were stolen from his yard. He also stated that signs were taken from other neighbors as well.

Nov 5

Officers responded to an accident on US-33 south of the intersection with Fishinger Rd. Unit 2 was traveling north in the same direction as unit 1. Unit 2 failed to notice unit 1 causing the front of unit 2 to strike the rear of unit 1. Unit 2 was cited for ACDA. Unit 2 stated that unit 1 backed into her.

Nov 8

Officers responded to an accident in the 6500 McVey Blvd. Unit 2 was attempting to back out of her driveway. The driver of unit 2 stated she thought she cleared the roadway and attempted to back out of her driveway when she struck the passenger side rear of unit 1. Due to unit 2's vehicle still being in the driveway, no private property was issued.

Nov 8

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of US-33 and McCoy Rd. Unit 2 failed to maintain assured clear distance ahead and struck the rear of unit 1 in the right turn lane of McCoy Rd. Unit 2 was issued a citation for ACDA. Both vehicles were drivable and released to the owners at the scene.

Nov 10

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Snouffer Rd and Bride Water Blvd. Unit 2 was traveling east on Snouffer at a speed unsafe for the conditions and was unable to come to a complete stop before striking the rear of unit 1. The passenger of unit 1 and sustained minor injuries. They were transported by Worthington Medic 103 to the hospital. Unit 2 was issued a citation for ACDA.

Nov 13

Officers were dispatched to US-33 and Cranston Dr on a report of a driver who was passed out behind the wheel in the middle of the roadway. While enroute, officers received updated information from responding medics that the driver was possibly impaired. Officers arrived on scene and observed two Dublin Police cruisers, UAFD Medic 72, and Norwich Township Fire Engine 83. The vehicle was parked in the middle of the roadway facing southbound. The vehicle appeared to be traveling southbound but stopped as the vehicle was entering the northbound lanes. Officer observed medics speaking to the driver, who was yelling at them. Upon approach, officer observed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage, and that he had slurred speech, bloodshot and glassy eyes. Officer placed the driver under arrest for OVI. The driver refused a breath test and stated he wished to talk to his attorney. The driver signed a BMV 2555.

Nov 14

Officers responded to the 2400 block of Merbrook Rd on report of an individual possibly being harassed by a known suspect. Officer spoke with the caller and she stated that, over the past few days, she has received multiples, text messages, and phone calls from a pro-abortion group implying that she had signed up to join these groups. The caller stated that she was pro-life in her beliefs and that she suspected that an individual who previously had tried to get her removed from a local organization may be responsible for adding her name. The caller was

advised to continue unsubscribing from these communications and report any other suspicious activity.

Nov 15

Officer was dispatched to the 2600 block of Billingsley Blvd on report of a suspicious person refusing to leave the business. Officer arrived and made contact with an employee. The employee stated that the suspect was at the business to complain about a collections bill. The suspect became argumentative and refused to leave. The employee stated that the suspect left before officer's arrival. No further action is required at this time.

Nov 16

Officer was running traffic at McVey Blvd W and McVey Blvd and observed a stop sign violation. Officer initiated a traffic stop. After making contact with the driver, it was determined that he had a suspended license. The driver was cited for failing to stop at a stop sign and driving under a non-compliance suspension, and the vehicle was impounded by Capital Towing.

Nov 16

Officer assisted Upper Arlington Fire with locating and investigating a suspicious fire near Arlington Pointe apartments.

Nov 16

Officers responded to a single car accident on Linworth Rd near the intersection with Meeklynn Dr. Unit 1 went off the right side of the road striking the guard rail end head on. Unit 1 was cited for failure to control, no operator's license, and driving under suspension. Unit 1 advised no valid insurance. The vehicle was towed by Speedy Gonzales Towing.

Nov 17

While traveling southbound on Sawmill Rd, officer observed a vehicle traveling south drifting out of their lane. The vehicle was varying drastically in speed, up to 45 and to 27 at times. When the driver turned left onto West Case Rd, they failed to use a turn signal. Officer watched as the driver continued this unsafe pattern. Officer observed as the vehicle drifted into another lane, so officer activated cruiser emergency lighting and initiated a traffic stop. Upon approach, officer observed a single male driver and no other occupants. The man had glossy bloodshot eyes and officer detected the odor of an alcoholic beverage and several open cans of Model brand beer. The man spoke little English, so officer used knowledge of Spanish and a translator device to converse. The man acknowledged that he had consumed about five beers and that he wasn't sick or injured. Officers conducted field sobriety tests. He was unsteady and officer discontinued the test for the suspect's safety. Officer placed the man under arrest for OVI. He was transported to Worthington Police Dept for a breath test. The man revealed a .217% intoxication level.

Nov 17

Officer was dispatched to the 1500 block of Oakbourne Dr on a theft of registration complaint. The caller advised that someone was using his license plate in Cincinnati. He received a notification of parking infraction from the City of Cincinnati Parking Violation Bureau. He showed the vehicle with the license plate, a historic vehicle which is not operable due to mechanical issues. Officer discovered that a vehicle in Kentucky near Cincinnati bore the same registration number, and a clerical error incorrectly identifying the plate as an Ohio plate was probably responsible for the incorrect issuance of the fine. Caller advised that he would contact the Cincinnati Parking Violation Bureau on Monday.

Nov 17

Officers assisted Sharon Township on a non-injury crash on SR-315 northbound north of Bethel Rd. Officers assisted in blocking traffic and using the cruiser push bumper to push the damaged vehicle off the side of the road in order to get traffic flow going.

Nov 17

Officers assisted Sharon Township on an injury accident at US-23 northbound just north of I-270. Officers assisted in blocking traffic while OSHP conducted their investigation.

Nov 17

Officers observed a blue Chevrolet Silverado traveling southbound on US-33 near Fishinger Rd. Officer discovered that the registration plate was reported as stolen. Officer also observed a marked lanes violation. Officer initiated a traffic stop and met with the driver. Officer explained that he was being detained due to the vehicle's registration plate being reported as stolen. The driver stated that he is a partner at a car dealership that owns the plate and that he had reported the plate as stolen. He stated the plate on his vehicle was the reissued plate from the BMV and that it bore the same number. He also provided the Columbus Police Report and a check of the paper registration with the tag. Officer advised that he needs to get the tag removed as stolen through CPD or the BMW, otherwise he may run into similar issues in the future. Officer provided a warning for a marked lanes violation.

Nov 18

While on patrol on Skyline Dr, officer could hear a very loud engine noise with excessive revving. Officer located a motorcycle that was the source of the loud engine noise and excessive revving. Officer initiated a traffic stop. Officer also observed the registration sticker had been defaced and unreadable. The driver identified himself because he did not have a driver's license. When questioned, he stated he had no motorcycle endorsement. The driver was wearing no safety helmet or gear. He stated that it was not his motorcycle. Officer issued a citation for operating a motorcycle without an endorsement, driver's license not on person, and for operating an unregistered motor vehicle. The motorcycle was impounded.

Nov 19

Officers were dispatched to the 6700 block of McVey Blvd on a neighbor complaint. The caller stated that a neighbor was yelling at them and making rude gestures while outside.

Nov 20

Officer was dispatched to a domestic dispute in the 7900 block of Greenside Ln.

Nov 21

Officers were dispatched to a non-injury four-vehicle accident at the intersection of US-33 and Fishinger Rd. Unit 4 was southbound on US-33 and failed to yield when turning left onto Fishinger Rd east. Unit 4 began making their left turn when unit 1 entered the intersection and struck the passenger side of Unit 4. This collision pushed unit 1 slightly into the lane of unit 2, causing unit 2 to strike the rear quarter-panel of unit 1. The collision also left unit 4 facing south in the right northbound lane and unit 3 struck unit 4 head-on. Upper Arlington medics responded but no parties involved were injured. Unit 4 was issued a citation for failure to yield.

Nov 22

While traveling south on Riverside Dr, officer observed a northbound vehicle failing to dim their high beams. Officer initiated a traffic stop and discovered that the driver did not have a valid

driver's license. The vehicle was inventoried and impounded and the driver was cited for driving without a valid license and failure to dim high beams.

Nov 22

Officer observed a vehicle with expired registration driving in the area of Worthington Hills. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The driver informed Officer that her license was suspended. Officer confirmed the license suspension and expiration of vehicle registration. Officer issued a summons for operating a motor vehicle with a suspended license and the vehicle was released to a valid driver.

Nov 23

Officer observed a vehicle driving south on Mooney St, the wrong way on a one-way street near SR-161. Officers initiated a traffic stop. Upon approach, officer could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from within the vehicle. Other occupants, a driver and passenger, confirmed they were involved in a crash in the SR-161 & US-33 roundabout. Officer requested additional officers to respond on scene. A Dublin PD officer arrived on scene for the crash investigation. Once Dublin Police were finished, Perry Officers asked if he would participate in standardized field sobriety tests. The driver replied no. When asked if he had been drinking, he replied yes. He stated that he had a few beers at the Buckeye game. He refused to submit to a BAC test. He was placed under arrest for OVI and his license was seized.

Nov 24

Officers were dispatched to Grandview Ave at the Sunoco gas station for a female who had an active warrant out of Perry PD. Officers arrived on scene and met with the woman. Officers advised that they would be issuing resummons.

Nov 25

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of US-33 and Oxford Dr. Unit 2 was westbound on Oxford stopped at the stop sign. Unit 2 went to turn southbound onto US-33 and was struck by southbound Unit 1. Unit 2 was cited for failure to yield on a left turn. Unit 1 was cited for no operator's license and expired plates.

Nov 26

Officer was dispatched to 5400 block of Havenhill Dr on a theft from a motor vehicle. Officer spoke with the homeowner, who stated that unknown person(s) opened the doors of his vehicles and stole undetermined amounts of change from the vehicles.

Nov 26

Officers responded to a multi-vehicle accident on Snouffer Rd east of Smoky Row Blvd. Unit 3 failed to maintain an assured clear distance ahead and struck the rear of unit 2, causing unit 2 to strike the rear of unit 3. The driver of unit 3 was cited for ACDA.

Nov 27

Officers were dispatched to a possible DOA in the 6600 block of McVey Blvd. The detective and coroner's office determined that the victim died of natural causes and did not believe there was any foul play.

Nov 28

Officer observed a vehicle traveling 25 MPH in a 50 MPH zone and made a marked lanes violation. Officer conducted a traffic stop and found that the temporary learner's permit and was violating multiple permit restrictions including operating a motor vehicle between the hours of

midnight and 6 AM and operating without a license parent or guardian in the passenger seat. Officer issued the driver a citation with a mandatory appearance.

Nov 28

Officers were dispatched to a burglary in progress at the 7700 block of Indianwood Ct. Officers set a perimeter and observed lights on upstairs. Officer knocked on the door but received no response. All exterior doors were secure and no signs of forced entry could be found. Officers spoke with the caller, who advised that his camera sent a notification about activity in the home and he thought he could hear several voices. Caller was satisfied by the officer's search and advised to contact the police if anything was missing or out of place.

Nov 29

Dispatch was called by a caller who was following a possible impaired motorist. The witness stated that the vehicle was on SR-161 approaching Linworth Rd and was unable to maintain a single lane and frequently drifted left of center. Witness recorded the situation with a vehicle dashboard camera. Officer arrived on scene and observed the suspect vehicle entering an apartment complex from Godown Rd. The driver eventually came to a stop on their own with no LEO direction. Officer conversed with the driver, a Hispanic male. Officer immediately observed slow moving and bloodshot eyes. Officer could smell a strong odor of alcoholic beverage and observed open containers of Modelo within reach of the driver. Officer believed the driver was impaired. The driver conceded that he did not have a US driver's license. Officer conducted field sobriety tests. Officer placed the suspect under arrest for OVI. A BAC test resulted in a breath sample of .166%.

Nov 29

Officers were dispatched to the 8100 block of Fairway Dr on a vandalism report. The caller stated that she had just returned home and found items destroyed at their house. She observed that her daughter's blue SUV had four flat tires, four small lights bulbs in the gas tank lid, and a broken rear window wiper blade. Additionally, their grill was pushed over and flower pots with dirt were dumped. The caller was advised to contact the police if she discovered anything else.

Nov 29

Officers were dispatched to AMC theaters on mutual aid for Dublin PD regarding an active fight involving security and unknown suspect(s). Officers were unable to locate or positively identify the suspect. The investigation was turned over to Dublin PD once they were able to respond and take control of the scene.
