Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of February 2025



Feb 1

Officer informed Sergeant of a pursuit in front of Perry Township PD headquarters involving Columbus PD and a stolen Mercedes. The car had been reported stolen by Dublin PD. Suspects turned east on Billingsley and turned off their lights as they approached Smoke Row Rd. CPD helicopter followed the suspects as they ditched their car near Snouffer and Queensbridge. Occupants fled on foot towards the railroad tracks between Snouffer and the I-270 overpass. Perry Officer established a north perimeter at Kilbourne Highschool with CPD. Perry Sergeant assist Sharon Twp PD with established a south perimeter at the Snouffer Rd railroad crossing. The driver was wearing a red shirt and the passenger was wearing a white shirt. The suspects remain at large and unidentified at this time. Investigation is being conducted by Dublin PD and Columbus PD.

Feb 2

Officer provided mutual aid to Sharon Twp PD on a suspicious vehicle located in the 7800 block of Olentangy River Rd. Sharon Officer suspected that the occupant of the vehicle was being impaired and in physical control of a motor vehicle. Sharon Officer had the occupant perform Standard Field Sobriety Tests. The occupant refused all tests and was placed under arrest by Sharon Officer. Perry Officer assisted in inventorying the vehicle and witnessed the reading of the BMV 2255 form.

Feb 3

Officer responded to a request from Blendon Twp PD Officers to run an Intox DMT breath test at their headquarters. After two attempts to get a sample from the suspect, his test was marked as a refusal.

Feb 3

Officers responded to a crash on US-33 at the intersection with Lane Rd. Unit 1 was northbound on US-33 approaching Lane Rd. Due to a medical condition rendering the driver unconscious, unit 1 drove off the right causing the car to flip and strike a utility pole and finally come to rest on its driver's side. The vehicle was impounded for safekeeping. The driver and two juvenile passengers were treated on scene by Upper Arlington Medic 71. Hospital transport was refused at the time.

Feb 4

Officer was requested by dispatch to contact a male in regard to his son being threatened at school.

Feb 5

Officers responded to a deer struck by a car on US-33 at the intersection with Scioto View Ln. Unit 1 was traveling north and struck a deer crossing the roadway. The vehicle had minor damage but was drivable. The deer was removed from the roadway.

Feb 5

Officer observed a vehicle traveling westbound on Hayden Run Rd at the intersection with Riverside Dr with a visible license plate showing an expiration date of August 2024. A traffic stop was initiated and the driver was found to have an expired driver's license. The driver was cited for expired registration and expired driver's license. The vehicle was released to a friend of the driver on scene.

Feb 5

Officer observed a vehicle traveling westbound on Hayden Run Rd with a temporary registration that was unreadable in the back window. Officer approached the vehicle and verified that the temporary registration had expired on 8/22/2024. The driver said the vehicle was in the process of being repaired and that he was simply driving to test the repairs. He further said that the vehicle did not have valid insurance. Upon further investigation, officer learned that the driver had received a citation from Whitehall PD in November 2024 for expired registration in the same vehicle. The driver was notified that his vehicle would be impounded and he was issued a citation for expired registration. The vehicle was impounded and the driver was given a courtesy ride to his residence.

Feb 7

Officers responded to Cleveland Ave and Chester Dr on mutual aid to Columbus Police and Westerville Police. Officers were fighting with a suspect who had a firearm and potentially had bailed out of a stolen vehicle. After clearing the scene of the officer in trouble, both Perry Officers provided mutual aid to Westerville Police by using the thermal cameras on their cruisers to help locate the other suspects who had bailed from the stolen vehicle. Officers were not able to locate the suspects and cleared the scene without further involvement.

Feb 8

Officer observed a white male, who appeared to be extremely intoxicated, stumbling and nearly falling multiple times on the sidewalk located at Riverside Dr and Banker Dr. Officer stopped with the male and determined that he was in fact extremely impaired. While speaking with the male, he appeared extremely uneasy on his feet. Officer asked him to sit down. The man explained that he was there for a work party and had been drinking. Officer asked if he had a ride and he said that his wife was at Pins. Officer requested medics to check to make sure he was not suffering from a medical condition. Washington Township Medic 92 arrived on scene and checked his vitals. Medics stated his vitals were elevated due to intoxication, which was normal. Officer called the man's wife, who arrived and took custody of him. She completed a care and custody waiver. Officers cleared the scene without incident.

Feb 8

Officers were dispatched to the 1200 block of Clubview Blvd S to assist medics. The caller stated that his wife wasn't breathing and they started CPR. Officers and Worthington Medic 101 arrived on scene. Worthington Medic 101 took over the scene and started life-saving measures. Officer attempted to gather information from both the caller and the caretaker. Worthington Medic 101 was able to get a pulse. The patient was transported to the hospital in critical condition.

Feb 8

Officers assisted Sharon Twp Officers per mutual aid on a person overdosing on an unknown substance in the 20 block of Roslyn Dr. Upon arrival, Officers secured the home and advised medics that they could enter. The person overdosing was located on the floor. She had shallow breathing so Sharon Officers initiated CPR as Worthington Medics entered the home.

Medics administered Narcan to the victim and were able to help regain consciousness. She was transported to the hospital for further medical attention. Officer spoke on scene with the resident. When asked what happened, she stated they had been snorting cocaine. She went to get her laundry and upon returning observed the victim on the floor. She stated that had found two bags of an unknown white substance which she believed to be fentanyl. County SIU was called on scene. They collected the drugs for further testing. All units cleared without incident.

Feb 10

Upper Arlington PD Officer aided an officer in trouble at Lane Ave and Northstar Rd. Prior to Perry arrival, two suspects were detained, and one was still outstanding. Officer arrived on scene and made contact with UAPD sergeant on scene. The sergeant advised that Perry Officer could search with a drone. The sergeant accepted the mutual aid and stated the suspect was last seen running northbound towards OSU farms. Officer deployed the UAS and searched the field east of Kenny Rd and around the WOSU facility. Nothing of interest was observed. No videos or photos were captured. Officer cleared the scene.

Feb 11

While parked at the Arlington Pointe Apartment complex, officer was approached by a US Postal employee. He advised that while placing mail in the mailboxes on Scioto View Ln, suspect pulled up beside him and advised about a package that was supposed to be delivered. The man advised that the suspect was upset and that when he had his back turned, he felt something hit it. He turned around and had seen the suspect holding a water bottle with water inside. The man advised he want to file assault charges on the suspect from the advice of his supervisor. Officer then went to the suspect's home. The suspect advised that she did throw water at the man but he was too far away to be hit by any water. She complained that there has been an ongoing issue with mail delivery and had filed complaints with the US Post Office. She also advised that two federal agents had shown up at her residence to speak with her about the postman. Officer advised both parties that a report would be taken.

Feb 13

Officer responded to an accident on Riverside Dr approaching River Park Dr. Unit 1 and unit 2 were traveling southbound on Riverside Dr. Unit 2 stated she had just stopped in traffic when she was struck in the center rear by unit 1. The driver of unit 1 stated she was attempting to plug her cell phone charger in. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for ACDA. Both parties declined medical attention.

Feb 14

Officers were dispatched to the area of Olde Hill Ct on a car in the woods. Officer was told by a resident that the car was on top of the hill near Greycliff Ln. Officer located the vehicle stuck on a big boulder in the tree line on Greycliff Ln. When Officer put their spotlight on the vehicle, a female popped her head up from the driver's seat. Officer advised dispatch of the same. When officer got to the passenger side door, officer asked the female to roll her window down. Officer noticed that her voice was heavily slurred. Officer then asked her to turn the vehicle off hand them the keys. When asked if she needed medics, she said she didn't, but Officer could tell she was under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Officer advised dispatch to start a medic and to advise that the accident was in Columbus Police's jurisdiction. After Upper Arlington Medic 72 cleared, the driver was released to CPD Car 153. Perry Officers cleared the scene without further involvement.

Feb 16

Officers were dispatched to Brookside Estates on reports of a deceased, elderly female. Upon arrival, Officers met with the reporting wife, the deceased's husband. Worthington Medic 101 pronounced the victim deceased. Officers conducted a DOA report and documented the scene. A Franklin County Forensic Investigator arrived on scene and advised that Officers could contact a funeral home on behalf of the family. Officers cleared once funeral home staff arrived.

Feb 16

Officers responded to an accident on US-33 south of Canterbury Rd. Unit 2 was north on US-33. Unit 1 was south on US-33. Unit 1 lost control of the vehicle and it began rotating around and over into the northbound lane. Unit 2 attempted to avoid unit 1. The vehicles collided on the roadway and then continued after the impact into the ditch on the east side of the road. Both parties were examined on scene by Upper Arlington Medic 71. Unit 1 was issued a citation for failure to maintain reasonable control.

Feb 17

Officer was dispatched to the 8100 block of Markhaven Dr on a harassment complaint. Officer spoke to victim's parents.

Feb 18

Officer observed a vehicle traveling northbound on Riverside Dr approaching Courtyard Landing with no visible registration. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The driver was cited for expired tags and operating without a valid license.

Feb 18

Officers responded to an accident on Snouffer Rd at Merwood St. Unit 2 was westbound on Snouffer Rd stopped in traffic and waiting to turn south onto Merwood St. Unit 1 was westbound on Snouffer Rd behind unit 1. The driver of unit 1 advised that they had reached down to pick up a cell phone that had fallen and when they looked back up it was too late to stop. Unit 1 struck the rear of unit 2. Unit 1 was cited for ACDA.

Feb 19

Officers from Sharon Township asked Perry officer to assist in dispatching an injured deer.

Feb 19

Officer initiated a traffic stop on McVey Blvd after observing a vehicle fail to come to a complete stop at the intersection of Millbrae Dr and McVey Blvd. Officer determined that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. The driver admitted that she did not have a valid driver's license. Officer issued a citation for disobeying a traffic control device and driving without a valid license after failing to reinstate.

Feb 19

Officers were dispatched to the 900 block of Bethel Rd for an aggressive person refusing to leave the property. The caller stated that a male Hispanic was sitting in the middle of Shuster. Caller said that he was in the store being aggressive towards customers and was asked to leave. Officers located the man. He stated he was trying to speak with the owner of LEPD. He said he didn't like how they were talking to him and he was asked to leave. Officer asked for ID, but he refused to provide it. He requested a ride home. Officer stated he needed to ID himself first. Officer was able to ID him. The suspect was trespassed from the business and was told that if he came back he could be arrested. CPD had trespassed the suspect from several businesses on Jasonway.

Feb 20

Officer were dispatched to the 900 block of Clubview Blvd S on an investigative complaint. Officer spoke with the golf superintendent of the Worthington Hills Country Club. He stated that he will be cutting down a tree behind a home on Circle on the Green. He stated that the resident that lives there comes out of his house and gives the workers a hard time by yelling and cursing at them. The superintendent requested an officer to standby while the tree was being cut down to alleviate any issues. No issues occurred. Officer cleared.

Feb 20

Officer observed two vehicles with their hazard lights on at Snouffer Rd and McVey Blvd. Officer observed a white minivan with a flat rear tire. The driver was looking for the spare tire but was unable to locate it. Officer contacted Capital Towing to tow the vehicle to the nearest tire repair store to repair the flat tire. Officer stayed on scene until Capital Towing arrived then cleared.

Feb 22

Officers were requested for mutual aid by the Ohio State Highway Patrol to the area of Clydesdale Avenue and Ambleside Dr. OSHP had a stolen vehicle flee from them and stop, three suspects had bailed from the vehicle and fled on foot. One suspect stayed in the vehicle. Shortly after arrival, officer observed one of the suspects being chased on foot. Officer exited vehicle and engaged in the chase shortly behind a CPD officer. The Columbus Officer tackled the suspect and was working on detaining him in a parking lot. Officer stood by while other CPD officers arrived to assist. Officer returned to the scene of the arrest and was informed by OSHP and CPD that it was alright to clear. Officers cleared the scene without further interaction.

Feb 22

Officer assisted Columbus Police process an arrestee for OVI at Perry Township Police Headquarters. A test kit was utilized for a urine sample.

Feb 22

Officers responded to a crash at the intersection of Hayden Run Rd and Riverside Dr. Unit 1 was traveling northbound on Riverside Dr approaching Hayden Run Rd directly behind unit 2. Unit 2 stopped for the red light at the intersection. Unit 1 stopped directly behind unit 2. When the light turned green, unit 1 began to drive, striking the rear center of unit 2. Unit 1 was issued a citation for assured clear distance ahead. Both units exchanged information and declined medical attention.

Feb 22

Officers responded to the 3300 block of Scioto Bluff Ave to assist Upper Arlington Medics. The patient had consumed about 750ml of vodka in a time span of no more than two hours. The mother of the victim called medics. The victim was transported to the hospital.

Feb 23

Officer was dispatched to the 1000 block of Clubview Blvd S on a follow-up requested from the Columbus Regional Airport Authority Police Department requesting that Perry Police check a residence for a vehicle. Officer did not locate the vehicle.

Feb 24

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr approaching Cranston Dr. Unit 2 was southbound approaching Cranston Dr and slowing down. Unit 1 was also southbound on Riverside Dr and did not see unit 2 slowing down and struck unit 2 in the rear. The driver of unit 1 was cited for ACDA.

Feb 24

Officer was dispatched to the 3400 block of Skyline Dr on an identity theft complaint.

Feb 24

Officer was conducting traffic enforcement in the area of Riverside Dr and Nottingham Rd. Around 1830 hours, officer observed a black two-door vehicle traveling south on Rivferside Dr at what appeared to be 60 MPH in a 45 MPH zone. Officer checked the vehicle's speed with a laser speed measuring device and the display read 62 MPH. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The driver did not provide an operator's license but did provide an SSN. Officer discovered that the driver's operator's license was suspended for non-compliance. Officer issued a citation for speed and operating with a suspended license. The vehicle was impounded.

Feb 24

Officer responded to an accident on US-33. Unit 1 was south on US-33 in the left through lane approaching Hayden Run Rd. Unit 1 attempted to enter the left turn lane but did not yield to unit 2. Unit 1's left front fender swiped unit 2's right rear fender. There were no injuries. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for unsafe lane change.

Feb 24

Officer responded to an accident on US-33. Unit 2 was northbound on US-33 approaching Werst Case Rd when he came to a fast stop in traffic due to the car in front of him stopping for a blocking disabled vehicle. Unit 1 did not maintain assured clear distance ahead and struck the rear of unit 2. This pushed unit 2 into unit 3 which did not stay at the scene. Unit 2 was evaluated and released at the scene by UA Medic 72. Unit 1 was cited for ACDA.

Feb 25

Officer was flagged down by a customer at Blue Sky carwash. She stated that she locked her car keys in her vehicle. The driver agreed to let officer use his unlock tool. Officer was able to open the door with no damage to the car.

Feb 26

Officer came across a non-injury crash blocking the road at Bethel Rd and Sawmill Rd. Officer had dispatch advise Columbus Police of the crash. Dispatch advised that CPD would not be responding and asked to have the drivers involved exchange information.

Feb 28

Officer responded to a complaint of vandalism in Brookside Estates. The caller stated that she witnessed someone walking by her mailbox and intentionally pushed on the mailbox.
