Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of April 2025



Apr 2

Officer was dispatched to the 1300 block of Clubview Blvd N to assist medics on an unconscious elderly male. Upon arrival, Worthington Medic 101 was getting ready to leave. Officer was informed by the family that the individual was going to the hospital. Officer verified with his wife that the family did not need anything and was heading to the hospital.

Apr 2

Officers responded to a multi-vehicle accident on Riverside Dr near Palatas Pl. Unit 1 was southbound on Riverside Dr and struck the rear of stopped unit 2, which pushed unit 2 into the rear of unit 3. The driver of unit 1 was cited and summoned to the Franklin County Municipal Couty for assured clear distance ahead.

Apr 3

Officer responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Fishinger Rd. Unit 1 was east on Fishinger and waiting to turn right. Unit 2 was west on Fishinger and waiting to turn left. Both operators had a fit of road rage once they began traveling northbound. Both units collided in a same direction sideswipe some point before the merge lane ended. Unit 1's front driver side contacted the rear passenger side of unit 2. Neither operator stopped after the crash. Both operators were called to report the crash. No involved parties sustained any injury and no citation was issued.

Apr 4

Officer was dispatched to Perry Township Police Department HQ on a theft. Officer spoke with the reporter, who stated that his granddaughter's cell phone was stolen from her backpack at Brookside Elementary School.

Apr 5

Officers responded to reports of water blocking the roadway on Riverside Dr north of Scioto View Ln. Officers blocked the easternmost lane due to a large amount of water and debris in the roadway. ODOT was requested to put out high water signage. Officers cleared after ODOT placed high water signage.

Apr 5

Officers were dispatched to Brookside Elementary School on a complaint of a white male in a Jeep yelling at kids. Upon arrival, officers determined that the complainant had an active warrant out of Delaware County OSHP for expired plates. The warrant was confirmed good, and the officer was transported to US-23 to meet OSHP. A check of the area for the Jeep in question turned up negative results.

Apr 5

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr. Unit 3 was northbound on Riverside Dr and slowed to a stop just north of Scioto View Ln to avoid hitting a "high water" sign. Unit 2 was also north on Riverside Dr and came to a stop behind Unit 3. Unit 1 was traveling north on Riverside

Dr behind an uninvolved unit, then changed lanes, and unit 1 struck the rear of unit 2. The collision pushed unit 2 into the rear of unit 3. The driver of unit 1 was transported by Upper Arlington Medic 71 to the hospital in stable condition. The other operators were uninjured. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for assured clear distance ahead.

Apr 5

Officer was dispatched to the 2500 block of Olde Hill Ct on a report of vandalism to a motor vehicle. Officer met with the complainant, who stated that she and her family had been out of town since April 1st. They noticed damage on their vehicle that had been parked while they were out of town. The damage appeared to be from another car that scraped up against it, causing a white paint transfer.

Apr 6

Officer was patrolling Arlington Pointe Apartments and heard on the radio that the Franklin County Sheriff's Office was chasing a vehicle that had just crashed into one of their patrol cars. The suspect's vehicle crashed near the intersection of Trabue and Dublin Rd, then took off running towards Quarry Trails. Officer set up a perimeter at Quarry Trails Apartments located on Quarry Trails Dr with multiple units from CPD and FCSO. The suspect was captured near Quarry Trails Metro Park's lake area a short time later.

Apr 6

Officer was dispatched to the Brookside Country Club on a report of theft from a vehicle. The victim had returned to his vehicle and discovered that someone had gone through it, and that a backpack was missing. He was able to recover his backpack near the entrance to the country club, but his wallet was missing.

Apr 7

Officer located an Ohio license plate lying in the roadway on SR-161 at Linworth Rd. The license plate was placed into the temporary holding locker at the Perry Township Police Department. The officer called the business and spoke with an employee. He informed the employee that they could retrieve the license plate during Perry Township business hours and provided them with the Police Department's address and phone number.

Apr 7

Officers responded to a multi-vehicle accident on Riverside Dr approaching Henderson Rd. Unit 1 was northbound on Riverside Dr and failed to maintain assured clear distance ahead as traffic stopped, striking unit 2 in the rear. Unit 2 was pushed into unit 3 and unit 3 was pushed into unit 4. The driver of unit 1 was cited for ACDA.

Apr 7

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr north of West Case Rd. Unit 1 failed to maintain reasonable control, ran off the road to the right, and struck a utility pole. The driver was suspected of operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or a combination thereof. The driver and juvenile occupant were transported to the hospital by Medic 83 for further evaluation.

Apr 8

Officers responded to SR-315 at the I-270 westbound ramp on a mutual aid for Sharon Township for an injury accident. Officers provided assistance with traffic control.

Apr 8

Officer located a blocking disabled vehicle that had gone off the roadway and into a construction zone on Sawmill Rd at Bright Rd. The driver stated that she already had AAA on the way. Officer advised that he would stay on scene until they arrived to lift her vehicle off the curb. Officer cleared without incident.

Apr 8

Officer responded to a possible non-injury accident in the area of McVey Blvd and SR-161. Officer located the vehicle across from 6149 McVey Blvd in the ditch. The driver said that he was attempting to turn around when he backed up too far and went into the ditch and got stuck in the mud. Officer stayed on scene until he was able to get the vehicle out of the ditch then cleared without further involvement.

April 10

Officers were dispatched to the 3000 block of Brookdown Dr for a well-being check.

April 10

Officer responded to a single-car accident on Riverside Dr at Clifton Rd. Unit 1 took the bend too and left the roadway right into the dirt berm causing them to lose control. Unit 1 operator was transported in stable condition to the hospital by Upper Arlington medics. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for failure to maintain reasonable control.

April 11

A resident in the 890 block of Clubview Blvd N informed officer that his vehicle was stolen from his driveway between the hours of 1200 and 0700. There are no known suspects at this time.

April 11

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of US-33 and Zollinger Rd. Unit 1 was traveling southbound on US-33 approaching Zollinger Rd. Unit 2 was traveling northbound on US-33. Unit 1 attempted to make a left turn onto Zollinger Rd, causing the center front of unit 2 to strike the passenger front of unit 1. Both units declined medical attention on scene and a witness was able to capture the incident on dash cam. Unit 1 was issued a citation for failure to yield on a left turn.

April 14

Officers were dispatched to the 2600 block of Billingsley Rd on a burglary in progress. Officers arrived on scene and located the individuals at the front gate standing next to a pick-up with a U-Haul trailer attached. Another individual was coming back to the trailer. Officer told the person on the four-wheeler to exit the facility and provide his ID. Additional officers arrived on scene and started to gather information. Officers were able to verify that the individuals did rent a unit. Officers advised that the individuals should leave and return during regular business hours to retrieve the rest of their property from the unit. All parties agreed.

April 14

Officers responded to the 8000 block of Flint Rd on mutual aid to Sharon Township PD for a domestic violence call. There was no physical violence, only a verbal argument. No action was taken by officers other than standing by for safety and listening to the involved parties. Officers cleared without incident.

April 14

Officer was dispatched to assist Sharon Township PD on an alarm drop at the Rusty Bucket. A check of the building was clear and a delivery driver from Michael's was at the delivery door in the rear of the restaurant.

April 14

Officers assisted Sharon Township PD in the 7700 block of Olentangy River Rd on a disturbance.

April 15

Officers marked out on a disabled vehicle on Riverside Dr and Nottingham Rd. Capital towing responded and towed the vehicle back to the Enterprise Rental on W 5th Ave in Columbus.

April 16

Officers responded to a crash on US-33. Unit 2 was traveling south in the curb lane. Unit 1 was also traveling south in the inside lane. Unit 2 reported that unit 1 crossed into the curb lane and side swiped unit 2. Unit 2 pulled into a nearby parking lot to report the accident and unit 1 continued southbound.

April 17

UAPD officers attempted a traffic stop of a suspicious vehicle. The driver fled and eventually bailed out of the vehicle. The driver and passengers fled on foot in the area of Tremont Rd and Lane Ave. Perry PD officers assisted with perimeter while Hilliard PD officers deployed their K9 and Worthington PD officers deployed their drone. Two suspects were apprehended by UAPD officers.

April 17

Officers responded to SR-315 and Mt. Airyshire Blvd regarding a reported crash involving lane blockage and injuries. Upon arrival, the vehicle was out of the roadway and no blockage was observed. The injured party declined treatment at the scene.

April 18

Officers were dispatched to the 1600 block of Gables Ct on a suspicious vehicle. Upon arrival, officer looked up the vehicle's information and spoke with the owner. Officer spoke with the caller and informed him that the vehicle belonged to a neighbor.

April 18

Officer responded on a mutual aid request from Sharon Township PD on a blocking disabled vehicle. Officer arrived on scene and was able to push the vehicle off of the roadway with his cruiser's push bumper. Officer cleared with no further involvement.

April 19

Officer arrived in the 900 block of Colony Way on a report of vandalism to a vehicle. Officer met with the caller and vehicle owner. Someone had used marker to write an expletive, four images of male genitalia, and a swastika. There are no suspects at this time.

April 19

Officers were dispatched to the 3300 block of Scioto Bluff Ave on a report of a possible threat of suicide.

April 20

Officers were dispatched to the 3300 block of Scioto Bluff Ave to assist medics on an ill female.

April 21

Upper Arlington Police advised that there was a stolen vehicle in the area of Riverside Dr and Cambridge Rd. Arriving in the area, Perry officer checked the Arlington Pointe apartment and condo complex. Officer located the vehicle abandoned on the side of the road. Officer found a large amount of papers and miscellaneous items with some broken glass. The vehicle was impounded by Capital towing. The miscellaneous items were impounded for safekeeping. Officers were able to make contact with the registered owner of the vehicle.

April 21

Officers were dispatched to the 3300 block of Scioto Bluff Ave on mutual aid to medics.

April 22

Officers responded to a request for mutual aid from the Madison Township Police Department. A Madison officer arrested an individual for OVI. The suspect had four previous convictions for OVI including a felony conviction through the Franklin County Common Pleas Court. The Madison officer requested a DICE officer for a search warrant. Perry officer obtained a search warrant and met with the Madison officer at the hospital. Two vials of blood were drawn by hospital staff and turned over to the Madison officer to be placed in Madison Township Police evidence. Perry officer cleared without incident.

April 23

Officer was dispatched to contact an individual in regards to being harassed by a neighbor. The contact stated that her neighbor has been harassing her since March of 2024 since they got a puppy.

April 24

Officers were dispatched to the Brookside Country Club on report of two Dodge Challengers driving on the golf course. Upon arrival, officers located a white Dodge Challenger driving on the main road towards SR-161. Officer was able to stop the vehicle. Upon asking, the driver stated that they had passed an AirBnB and had gotten lost. He stated that they had passed the home when they drove onto the Brookside Country Club property and accidentally pulled onto a cart path. Another officer located a black Challenger on the cart path and conducted a traffic stop after exiting. The driver of the black Challenger gave a similar story to the first. They stated that they were following the GPS and attempting to turn around to get back to the AirBnB which led them to get lost. A witness provided officers with videos of the incident. Officers were unable to locate any damage to the path due to limited visibility. Officer met with the closing manager and explained the situation.

April 25

Officer observed a blue sedan traveling at high speed southbound on Sawmill Rd near Bridge Park Ave. The sedan was failing to maintain its lane and appeared to be hydroplaning, leaving its lane multiple times and one point nearly striking a white SUV that was also traveling southbound. Officer activated emergency lights and sirens to conduct a traffic stop near Kays Ave while still southbound on Sawmill Rd. The vehicle sped up to 74 miles per hour before coming to a stop as it approached Bethel Rd. Officer made contact with the driver, who did not have a valid driver's license and admitted to taking the vehicle without permission. The driver stated that he was 15. When asked for date of birth, he provided 8/10/2008, which would make him 16. When told this, the driver changed the date to 08/10/2009. It was later determined

that his birthdate was 08/10/2011, making him 13 years old. When asked for his name and spelling, neither matched. Officer asked for parents' phone numbers, and he stated that he only had a mother. Another officer was able to make contact with the registered vehicle's owner, but was unable to make contact with the suspect's mother as he had provided the wrong address. The suspect provided the correct address after being informed that if he could not, or would not, provide the correct information that he would be taken into custody until his mother could be located. Officer made contact with a neighbor, who provided the correct information for the suspect. She stated that he had been very problematic recently and that she worried about his future. Officer provided the suspect with a citation for speed, failure to maintain marked lanes, operating a motor vehicle without a valid license, and reckless operation.

April 25

Officer responded with Sharon Township Police on a mutual aid request for a possible injury accident on SR-270 westbound near US-23. Officer located the victim's vehicle off the roadway just west of SR-71. The victim stated that he was not injured and the at-fault vehicle fled the scene. Officer advised dispatch and cleared without further involvement. The victim remained on scene to wait for CPD.

April 25

Officer was dispatched on a harassment complaint in the 7900 block of Greenside Ln. The caller stated that his son was being harassed or threatened on Instagram. He stated he wanted to document the incident.

April 25

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr near Palatas Pl. Unit 1 was traveling southbound on Riverside Dr approaching Palatas Pl. Unit 2 was on Riverside Dr attempting to make a left turn onto Palatas Pl. Unit 1 failed to stop for unit 2 causing the center front of unit 1 to strike the center rear of unit 2. Unit 2 declined medical attention on scene. Unit 1 described a head injury to Worthington Medic 92. The driver was transported to the hospital for further evaluation. Unit 1 was issued a citation for failure to maintain assured clear distance ahead.

April 26

Officer was flagged down in the parking lot of police headquarters. He wanted to turn over a loaded pistol magazine he found in the parking lot of the AutoZone off of Sawmill Rd near Cranston Dr in the City of Columbus. Officer made contact with Columbus Zone 4 dispatch for them to send an officer to retrieve the magazine. Columbus Cruiser 173 arrived and took the property without incident.

April 27

Officer observed a vehicle traveling northbound on Riverside Dr near Edgewood Rd at a high rate of speed. Officer observed the vehicle's speed to be 60 MPH in a 45 MPH zone. Officer activated emergency lights and conducted a traffic stop. It was determined that the driver was driving in violation of his temporary permit restriction requiring a licensed 21-year old passenger. Officer called the language line for a French interpreter. The driver was issued a citation for speed and driving in violation of a temporary permit restriction.

April 28

Officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of Circle on the Green on report of a domestic violence incident. After speaking with involved parties, officer issued warrants for domestic violence and assault.

April 28

Officer was dispatched to the 950 block of Clubview Blvd N on found property. Officer spoke with the resident, who stated that a landscaper found a car key fob and wanted to turn it in. Officer observed that the key fob still had the stock number on it. Officer called Ricart Buick. Ricart Buick was able to locate the owner in their system and officer was able to return the key fob.

April 28

Officers were dispatched to the 1400 block of Park Ridge Dr on a report of domestic violence. Officers spoke with the involved parties regarding the verbal argument that occurred. One of the parties agreed to leave the residence for the rest of the day. Officers cleared after the party left.

April 28

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Hayden Rd. Unit 1 was northbound on Riverside Dr in the left turn lane at the intersection of Hayden Rd. Unit 2 was southbound on Riverside Dr approaching Rd in the inside lane. Unit 1 failed to yield when turning left and struck/was struck by unit 2. The driver of unit 1 was cited for failure to yield on a left turn. The driver of unit 1 was transported to the hospital. All other occupants were treated or refused treatment from Upper Arlington medics.

April 29

While on patrol, officer was advised to report to the OSU Airport for a briefing with HSI relative to a warrant for a wanted fugitive. Following the briefing, officers posted at agreed upon locations and the suspect vehicle was sighted leaving the area. Officers affected a traffic stop, with assistance from HSI, on Sawmill Rd south of Cranston Dr. The driver was identified as the wanted subject. HSI took custody of the vehicle and the occupants. Officers assisted with transport.

April 29

Officer responded to the area of Olde Hill Ct S and Shore Line Ln on a stolen vehicle. The officer found that the vehicle was being driven by its registered owner and that the driver had failed to notify the Police Department that he had recovered his vehicle.

April 30

Officers responded to a multi-vehicle accident in the 4800 block of Riverside Dr. Unit 1 stated that he attempted to slow down, because the driver of unit 4 stopped abruptly, but was unable to. Unit 1 then struck the center rear of unit 2. The impact caused unit 2 to strike unit 3, and unit 3 to strike unit 4. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for ACDA.

April 30

Officer was requested by dispatch to meet a caller at Police HQ who had located a wallet. The finder said the wallet fell of a car on SR-161 at Linworth Rd. Officer located the address for the owner of the wallet and returned it.

April 30

Dispatched received a call from an employer requesting a well-being check for an employee. Officers met with the individual, who did not express any desire to harm themselves, and provided them with resources if necessary.
