Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of May 2025



May 1

Officer was dispatched to the 840 block of Clubview Blvd N on an alarm drop. Officer spoke with the daughter of the resident. She stated that she accidentally set the alarm off. Officer cleared the scene and returned to patrol.

May 1

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr between Fairfax Dr and Lakinhurst Dr. Unit 1 was southbound on Riverside Dr approaching Fairfax Dr. Unit 2 was northbound on Riverside Dr. Unit one failed to yield and turned left in front of unit two. Unit two struck the front passenger side of unit one. The passenger of unit two complained of chest pains and was transported in stable condition to the hospital. Occupants of unit one were also transported in stable condition to the hospital. Both vehicles were impounded for safekeeping. The operator of unit 1 was issued a citation for failure to yield on left turn.

May 2

Officer was conducting traffic enforcement in Brookside Estates. Officer observed a gray hatchback north on McVey Blvd fail to stop for a stop sign at the intersection with Merwin Rd E. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The operator complied and pulled over before reaching Snouffer Rd. The driver stated that he did not speak English, so officer utilized a language interpretation line for the remainder of the stop. Officer was able to establish that the driver did not have a valid license. Officer issued a summons for failure to obey a traffic control device and for operating a motor vehicle without a valid operator's license. The vehicle was impounded for safekeeping. A licensed friend arrived to pick up the driver and his family.

May 3

Officers were dispatched to Riverside Dr and Fishinger Rd on an injury accident. Upon arrival, it was discovered that the accident occurred west of Riverside Dr in the City of Columbus. Upper Arlington officers were already on scene. When Columbus Police arrived, they had both parties exchange information without an incident report.

May 3

A resident wished to speak to an officer concerning an occurrence with her garage.

May 4

Officer was dispatched to a tree in the roadway in the 6200 block of McVey Blvd. Officers arrived on scene and started clearing the roadway. Worthington Engine 101 was called, and they helped cut the tree up. The roadway was cleared and officers returned to patrol.

May 5

Officer was monitoring UAPD radio and heard that an officer was actively in foot pursuit in the area of the Upper Arlington High School. Officer advised Dispatch that he was enroute to assist the UAPD officer. UAPD had set up a perimeter and requested a drone. Perry officers used their

drone to assist in searching for the suspect. Nothing of interest was observed and officers cleared the scene.

May 6

Officers were dispatched to the 3300 block of Scioto Bluff on a theft of car keys complaint. Officer met with the complainant, who advised that she could not find her keys and, when she called her mother, her mother stated that she had them. Officer advised he would contact her mother and speak to her about the keys.

May 6

Officer located a blocking disabled vehicle on SR-161 at Brookdown Dr. Officer stayed with the vehicle until the driver put gas into it. Officer cleared with no further involvement.

May 7

Officer was dispatched to the 4600 block of Shuster Rd on report of a theft. Officer arrived on scene and made contact with the victim, who stated that he had a check stolen.

May 8

While monitoring UAPD radio Traffic, UAPD advised that there was a stolen vehicle northbound on Riverside Dr from the Trabue Rd area. Officer was on Riverside Dr and observed a northbound vehicle matching the description provided. Officer caught up to the vehicle and confirmed the plates matched those of the stolen vehicle. Officer attempted to make a traffic stop. The vehicle did not stop and began to speed up. Once on Sawmill Rd, the vehicle began accelerating to 80 to 90 MPH. Officer lost sight of the car and terminated the pursuit. The vehicle was later found abandoned in the middle of the street on Krier Rd. CPD recovered the car.

May 9

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and McCoy Rd. Unit 2 was northbound on Riverside approaching McCoy. Unit 1 was northbound behind unit 2. Unit 1 failed to maintain assured clear distance ahead and struck the rear of unit 2. Unit 1's driver admitted fault and was cited for ACDA. No injuries were reported. Both vehicles were drivable and no tow service was required.

May 9

Officers were dispatched to a blocking disabled vehicle on Riverside Dr at Clifton Rd. Dispatch advised that the male driver had exited the vehicle and was laying in the grass next to the roadway. Upon arrival, UA Medic 72 had the male in the rear of the ambulance and was undergoing a medical evaluation. Officer spoke to a witness, who stated that he observed the vehicle stop in the roadway and approached the male to see if he needed help. He said the vehicle was out of gas and the male appeared to be confused. The witness helped get the vehicle off the roadway and stated with the male until medics arrived. Officer spoke with the male. He stated he was going home in Reynoldsburg and, when asked where he was currently, he stated that he did not know. When told he was on Riverside Dr, he could not explain how he had gotten to Riverside Dr or why he was on Riverside Dr. Medics informed the officer that the male would be transported to the hospital for medical treatment.

May 10

Officers responded to an accident on SR-161 approaching Linworth Rd. The driver of unit 1 stated that the driver of unit 2 wasn't paying attention and was on her phone. The driver of unit 1 said he attempted to drive around unit 2 to get in front of her. Unit 1 said that he drove into the

left turn for Linworth Rd from SR-161 before attempting to re-enter the straight lane for SR-161. This caused the passenger front of unit 1 to strike the left front of unit 2. Unit 1 was issued a citation for a marked lanes violation. All parties declined medical attention.

May 10

Officer was dispatched to the 4700 block of Shuster Rd on a an alarm drop. Officer arrived on scene and checked every door and window of the building. Everything was tight and secure. Officer cleared without further involvement.

May 10

Officers were dispatched to Sharon Twp on mutual aid on an injury accident. Upon arrival, officers conducted traffic control until informed they could clear the scene.

May 11

Officers observed a Jeep traveling southbound on SR-315 at I-270. Officer recognized the vehicle as one that had previously fled from Sharon Twp PD the same night. Officer followed the vehicle and confirmed that the license plate matched the vehicle that had fled from Sharon Twp PD. Officer observed the vehicle make multiple marked lanes violations. Officer activated emergency lights and sirens to conduct a traffic stop. The Jeep moved int on the right lane but continued driving southbound. The Jeep took the exit to Bethel Rd and continued westbound on Bethel Rd. The Jeep stopped at the red light at Olentangy River Rd. Officer exited his cruiser, drew his firearm, and gave multiple orders for the driver to put his hand out the window and to put the vehicle in park. The driver did not comply. Officer continued to order him to put the vehicle in park and to show his hands, but he continued to not comply. The suspect was starting straight ahead and did not appear to acknowledge that the officer was there even though his windows were open. Officer holstered his firearm, unlocked the and opened the suspect's door, unbuckled his seatbelt, placed his left arm into a straight armbar and removed him from his vehicle. Officer informed the suspect that he was under arrest for failure to comply with order or signal of a police officer. Additional Perry and Sharon officers arrived on scene. The driver was searched, then evaluated by Worthington Fire & EMS Medic 101. Medic 101 stated that, other than elevated blood pressure, the suspect's vitals were normal.

May 11

Officers were called to the 2500 block of Olde Hill Ct on a possible domestic violence. The caller stated that a male and female were arguing loudly on their back porch. Both parties were interviewed separately. Both parties stated that they are planning a wedding and that they got involved in an argument regarding the planning. Both acknowledged that they were being loud and stated that no physical violence had taken place. There were no signs of a physical altercation on either party. Both officers cleared.

May 12

Officer was advised of mulch that was smoldering in the 1000 block of Blindbrook Dr. Officer attempted to make contact with the owner with no success. Officer poured water on the mulch and move same around but the mulch continued to smolder. Officer contacted dispatch to have Worthington Fire response. Worthington Fire responded and removed the smoldering mulch from the flower bed. The homeowner was advised of the findings.

May 12

Officer was dispatched to the Police HQ on a found wallet. A search of the wallet turned up a Mexican identification card with no known address. Two phone numbers were found inside the

wallet and called. Neither knew of the name on the Mexican identification card. The wallet and belongings were placed in an evidence locker for safekeeping.

May 13

Officers were dispatched to the 1300 block of Oakview Dr on a death notification.

May 13

Officers responded to a call from Clinton Township PD units that were attempting to stop a stolen vehicle. Once in position, CTPD initiated a traffic stop and Perry officers assisted Clinton officers with a felony stop. Weapons were drawn and the subject was taken into custody. Subject was cooperative with verbal commands and handcuffs were applied without struggle. Cuffs were appropriately gapped and double locked and the subject did not register any complaint or injury. Officers completed a search, incident to arrest, and custody was passed off to CTPD. Perry officers remained on scene until released by CTPD.

May 13

Officers observed a gray Hyundai driving southbound on SR-3 at Innis Rd. The vehicle made multiple marked lanes violation, including driving left of center into oncoming traffic. Officer activated emergency lights and initiated a traffic stop. The driver was found to be driving under multiple suspensions and without a valid license. The tag on the vehicle, which was expired, did not come back to the Hyundai and instead came back to a 2014 Chevrolet. The driver was issued a citation for marked lanes, driving under suspension, operating a motor vehicle without a valid license, and fictitious plates. The vehicle was impounded.

May 17

Officers responded to a mutual aid request from the Worthington Police Department on a pedestrian struck at SR-161 and Hartford St. Officers were redirected to assist Worthington PD with an unrelated incident. Officer remained on scene to assist with traffic control before clearing.

May 18

Officers responded to an accident on US-33. Units 1 and 2 were both northbound on US-33. Unit 2 was in the left turn lane just south of the intersection with Hayden Run Rd when unit 1 changed lanes without safety and sideswiped unit 2. No injuries were reported. Unit 1 was cited for an unsafe lane change.

May 18

Officers responded to a report of an accident on US-33. Units 1 and 2 were both southbound on US-33. Unit 2 was in front of unit 1. Both units were in continuous motion when unit 1 drove into the opposite lane of travel and struck the driver's side door in a side swipe. Unit 2 states that unit 1 never stopped or slowed down and continued south through the Hayden Run intersection. Unit 2 continued home before attempting to report the crash.

May 19

Officers responded to an accident on US-33 at the intersection with Zollinger Rd. Unit 2 was southbound on US-33 waiting to turn left onto Zollinger Rd. Unit 1 was southbound on US-33 approaching Unit 2 from behind. Unit 1 struck the rear of unit 2. Unit 1 was cited for ACDA. Both vehicles were able to drive away from the scene.

May 24

Officers were directed to respond to the Sharon Woods Metro Park to assist the Sharon Township Police Department on a missing person call. Multiple agencies responded to assist. CPD located a crashed and abandoned white pickup truck off of I-71 just north of I-270, on the east side of the roadway between the sound wall and the western edge of Sharon Woods Metro Park. Officers determined that it had been there for a prolonged period of time and was unrelated to the missing person call. CPD officers stated that they had received a similar call of a missing woman in labor a few weeks prior and suspected that this was a prank call. Perry units cleared and returned to patrol.

May 24

Officers responded to an accident on US-33 near Scioto View Ln. Unit 1 was north on US-33 in the inside lane. Unit 2 was also north on US-33 in the outside lane. Unit 1 did not maintain assured clear distance ahead to the vehicle in front of them and swerved to the right to avoid that vehicle. As unit 1 entered the outside lane, unit 2 attempted to avoid by swerving to the right but still struck the passenger side of unit 1. Unit 2 then came to rest off the roadway to the right. Unit 1 was issued a citation for unsafe lane change and operating a motor vehicle without a valid license.

May 24

Officer observed several items lying in the roadway at Fairway Drive and Oakview Dr. Officer called a number located on a recovered business card and left a message about locating the property and asking for a callback. The property was impounded and placed in a temporary locker at the Perry Township Police Department.

May 27

Officers responded to a crash at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Hayden Rd. Unit 1 and unit 2 were heading eastbound on Hayden Run Rd and were stopped in the turn lane to go north on Riverside Dr. Unit 1 came to a stop then proceeded to back up, striking the center front of unit 2 with the center rear of unit 1. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for backing up in a roadway.

May 28

A mutual aid request was made to assist Sharon Township PD on a possible burglary in progress. Officer was given a suspect description. The suspect was located in the 200 block of Rosslyn Ave and was detained. Sharon Township Officer took custody of the male juvenile.

May 28

Officers were dispatched to assist Worthington Fire in the 2500 block of Winston Ct N on a medical assist.

May 29

Officers were dispatched to Riverside Dr and Ravello Dr on a non-injury crash. Upon arrival, Officer noticed two vehicles on Ravello Dr with minor damage. Both parties had exchanged information with each other.

May 29

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr at the intersection with Hayden Run Rd. Units 1 and 2 were traveling northbound on Riverside Dr. Unit 1 struck the rear of unit 2. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for ACDA.

May 30

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Riverside Dr on report of a domestic complaint.

May 31

Officers responded to the area of the 1200 block of Clubview Blvd N on reports of a domestic violence.

May 31

Officer was dispatched to the 900 block of Bethel Rd on a dog bite. Officer spoke with the victim, who stated that he was bit on his left wrist by a Weimaraner as he came around the corner. A call was made to the Franklin County Dog Warden. They stated that the victim would have to follow up with them and file a report so they can look into the dog's history and vaccination records.

May 31

Officers responded to an accident on US-33 south of Stratford Dr. The operator stated that they dropped their electronic cigarette and attempted to retrieve it. The vehicle entered the opposite lane of travel then ran off the road to the left and crashed into a stone wall in the embankment in front of 4172 Riverside Dr. The operator appeared unharmed and refused medical treatment from Upper Arlington Medics. The vehicle was removed from the wall and impounded with Capital Towing for safe keeping. Unit 1 was issued a citation for failure to maintain reasonable control of a motor vehicle.
