Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of June 2025



June 1

Officer was traveling southbound on Riverside Dr from Fishinger Rd and observed multiple vehicles traveling at a high rate of speed. The lead vehicle was traveling notably faster than the rest of the vehicles, which were traveling at 60 MPH. Officer activated emergency lights and sirens to conduct a traffic stop on the lead vehicle, stopping on Riverside Dr at Trabue Rd. Upon making contact with the driver, he admitted that he does not have a valid license and that he has warrants out for his arrest. It was discovered that he has six active suspensions and that he had one outstanding warrant within the pickup radius through Hilliard. The warrant was confirmed and the driver was placed under arrest. An officer from HPD arrived on scene and took custody of the suspect. The suspect was issued a citation for speed, operating a motor vehicle without a license and driving under suspension.

June 1

Officer was requested for mutual aid to Columbus Police for a BAC test. The suspect successfully provided a breath test and the officer cleared without incident.

June 1

Officer responded to a hit-skip on Blackstone Dr. Unit 2 was parked unoccupied on Blackstone Dr near Greyrocks Way. Unit 1, an Amazon delivery truck, was traveling northbound on Blackstone Dr attempting to navigate between multiple parked cars, striking the rear driver side of unit 2, and left after making deliveries. Residents nearby witnessed the truck roadway and heard the crash as the truck was passing the parked car. It is unknown if the Amazon driver realized that they struck the parked car.

June 2

Officer responded on mutual aid for Sharon Township on a report of domestic violence.

June 2

Officer was approached while parked at the Worthington Hills Country Club to notify them that several kids were operating small motorbikes in neighbors' yards and on Country Club property.

June 2

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Bethel Rd. Unit 2 was northbound on Riverside Dr and came to a stop in traffic. Unit 1 was directly behind unit 2. Unit 1 failed to maintain assured clear distance ahead and struck the rear of unit 2. Unit 1 was cited for assured clear distance ahead.

June 4

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Hayden Run Rd. Units 2 and 3 were eastbound on Hayden Run Rd and proceeding through the intersection. Unit 1 was northbound on Riverside Dr, failed to stop for the red light, then struck unit 2 on the

passenger side front, causing unit 2 to strike unit 3 on the passenger side front. Unit 1 was cited for failure to stop at a red light.

June 4

Officer was advised to contact a complainant regarding harassment.

June 4

Officer was requested to do a follow-up regarding a theft. Officer met with the caller, who advised that sometime between the evening of June 2nd and the morning of June 3rd that his garage door opener was taken from his vehicle.

June 4

Officers responded to a blocking disabled vehicle on Riverside Dr at Hayden Run Rd. Officers located the vehicle blocking the right turn lane to Hayden Run Rd from Riverside Dr southbound. A tow was requested.

June 5

Officers responded to an accident on SR-161. Units 1 and 2 were traveling westbound. Unit 1 struck the center rear of unit 2. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for assured clear distance ahead.

June 5

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of SR-161 and Strathaven Dr. Unit 1 was west on SR-161 behind an uninvolved vehicle. Unit 2 was south on Strathaven Dr waiting to turn left onto SR-161. Westbound traffic on SR-161 was at a standstill and unit 2 entered the westbound lane then stopped to look for traffic. Unit 1 then entered the opposite lane of travel over a double yellow line and began driving west at the same time unit 2 continued their left turn eastbound. Unit 1 struck the front of unit 2 at an angle. No parties were injured. Unit 1 was issued a citation for a marked lanes violation.

June 5

Officers were dispatched on a complaint of a solicitor in the area of the Ravello community. Officer checked the area but did not find anyone solicited, then checked the area of the Courtyards on Riverside and located an individual matching the description and appeared to be going door to door. Officer verified that he did not have a solicitation permit. Officer advised the individual of the requirement and that he would have to discontinue.

June 6

Officer was dispatched to the 2500 block of Winston Ct N to stand by for Worthington medics.

June 6

Officer observed an individual with a warrant for his arrest in the 900 block of Bethel Rd. Officer initiated a traffic stop. Officer was able to verify that the passenger was the suspect and he was subsequently placed in custody. He was also cited for failing to wear a safety belt.

June 7

Officer was dispatched per mutual aid to assist Sharon Township PD with a domestic complaint.

June 8

Officer received a video from the victim of a theft. The video was emailed to the Detective Bureau.

June 9

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr south approaching Wickliffe Rd. Unit 2 stopped for traffic ahead. Unit 1 failed to stop and rear-ended unit 2. All parties were checked for injuries on scene by Upper Arlington Medic. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for assured clear distance ahead.

June 10

Officer was dispatched to the 8300 block of Fairway Dr on a vandalism complaint. Officer was met by the complainant, who advised that sometime between June 9th and June 10th that unknown persons entered her unlocked vehicle and stole a pair of earbuds.

June 10

Officer was dispatched to assist Columbus Police on a missing 5-year old child. Upon arrival, the child had already been found.

June 10

Officers were dispatched by FCSO on an alarm drop. Upon arrival, officer found two individuals outside the location speaking with their boss about the alarm. The boss indicated that the property owner was out of town and they did not realize that the alarm was set when they entered.

June 10

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Henderson Rd. Unit 2 was northbound on Riverside Dr stopped in traffic. Unit 1 struck the rear of unit 2. The driver of unit 1 was cited for failure to maintain assured clear distance ahead.

June 11

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Hayden Run Rd. Unit 1 was eastbound on Hayden Run Rd turning south onto Riverside Dr. Unit 1, while looking for crossing traffic while turning, did not see unit 2 stopped in the merge lane due to heavy traffic. Unit 1 struck the rear of unit 2. No citation was issued due to traffic conditions and congestion.

June 11

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr. Unit 1 struck the rear of unit 2 while traveling southbound. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for failure to maintain assured clear distance ahead.

June 13

Officer was on patrol and observed a vehicle fail to turn into the nearest lane when turning onto US-33 from Lane Ave. Officer discovered that the temporary registration on the vehicle was expired and the owner was shown as suspended. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The driver was cited for no operator's license and expired registration.

June 14

Officers located a white Acura SUV stopped and blocking the right lane of Riverside Dr northbound near John Shields Parkway. Officer made contact with the driver, who was asleep behind the wheel, and a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage was emitting from the vehicle. Before attempting to wake the driver, officers boxed the SUV in to prevent it from driving away. Officer unlocked the vehicle doors and observed vomit on the inside of the driver's side door and on the legs of the driver. Upon waking the driver, the driver admitted to the consumption of

a large quantity of alcoholic beverages of various types. He believed that he was near OSU's downtown campus area. Dublin Police arrived and took control of the scene.

June 14

Officer was traveling westbound on West Henderson Rd east of Kenny Rd. Officer observed a gray Mercury blocking the right lane with its hazard lights on. Officer made contact with the driver who indicated that his vehicle was broken down. Officer advised that he could use push bumpers and push his vehicle into a parking lot out of the roadway.

June 15

Officer stopped out with Ohio State Highway Patrol on a traffic stop on I-270 westbound east of Sawmill Rd. The Trooper had arrested a suspected for an OVI. The suspect was transported to the Perry Township Police Department for chemical breath testing.

June 16

Officers were dispatched to assist Worthington Medic 101 on an intoxicated person in the block of 1000 Clubview Blvd S. Officer made sure the scene was safe for the Medics then advised that they could come in. Worthington Medic 101 transported the victim to the hospital.

June 16

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Zollinger rd. Unit 2 was southbound on US-33 slowing down to turn eastbound onto Zollinger Rd. Unit 1 was traveling northbound on Riverside Dr and went left of center striking unit 2 head on. The driver of unit 1 was treated and released by Norwich Medic 83. Unit 1 was cited for left of center. Both vehicles were towed.

June 16

Officers were dispatched to Brookside Estates concerning multiple solicitors going door-to-door soliciting for a roofing company. Officer arrived and located two trucks with logos for Hendo Roofing & Repair. Officer met with the solicitors and explained that they cannot solicit in the area without a permit. Officer explained how to apply for a permit and that they would have to vacate until they could obtain one. They were all cooperative and immediately left the area.

June 16

Officers responded to the area of Harrisburg Puke and Laurel Ave at the request of Franklin Twp Police to assist them. FTPD was searching for a male who fled from officers during a traffic stop. Officer deployed the drone for use and searched the area. The search concluded and FTPD had the suspect in custody.

June 16

Officer provided mutual aid to Dublin Police on a traffic stop on Dale Dr at Banker Dr. Officer stood by for officer safety while Dublin Police conducted a search of the vehicle that they had stopped. The driver of the vehicle was cited by Dublin Police and officer cleared the scene without further incident.

June 17

Officer was dispatched to Riverside Dr at Henderson Rd on a deer that had been struck by a vehicle and was still alive. Upon arrival, a passerby advised that the deer had passed away. The City of Columbus Road Department arrived and removed the deer.

June 17

Officer was dispatched on a reported theft in the 900 block of Colony Way. The victim stated that she had several rings and earrings stolen from her home.

June 18

Officer was dispatched to the Speedway on Riverside Dr at Zollinger Rd on report of vandalism to a vehicle. Officer met with the caller, who state that he was heading northbound on Riverside Dr when a white van was heading southbound. The caller stated that the white van threw a water bottle out of the driver's side window, striking his windshield and causing it to crack.

June 18

Officer was dispatched to the 890 block of Blind Brook dr on an alarm drop. Officer was met by an individual on scene, who advised that she is the cleaner for the homeowner. She was given the garage code but not the alarm code. She was able to contact the homeowner and they were able to silence the alarm.

June 18

Officers responded to an accident in the 4800 block of Riverside Dr. Unit 2 was traveling northbound on Riverside Dr. Unit 1 was traveling southbound on Riverside Dr. The driver of unit 1 stated that she was attempting to turn onto a driveway but didn't see unit 2 traveling northbound. Unit 1 then struck the center front of unit 2. The driver of unit 2 was transported to OSU hospital with minor injuries by Upper Arlington Medic 72. The driver of unit 1 and the passenger of unit 2 were both treated and released on scene. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for failure to yield while turning left.

June 19

Officers were dispatched to the 2700 block of Snouffer Rd on a suspicious person. The caller stated that she located an older female in the front yard that appeared lost. The caller stated that the female appeared to have dementia. Officers located and greeted the female. She provided her first name. When asked where she lived, she stated that she did not remember. She was also unable to provide any phone numbers for her children. She provided her last name, and officer was able to locate her residents. CPD was also requested since she lived in their jurisdiction. She was transported by CPD back to her place of residence.

June 20

Sharon Twp Police asked for Perry Twp Police to assist in locating an individual that left the scene of an accident on Hard Rd and SR-315. Officers circulated the area and no one matching the description was found. Both officers returned to patrol.

June 20

Officers responded to a suicide.

June 20

Officer was dispatched to the 900 block of Bethel Rd on a theft report. Officer met with the caller who stated she dropper her wallet in the parking lot and did not realize that she had dropped it until the next morning. Officers were able to obtain security footage showing a suspect that picked up the wallet, went through it, then left the parking lot. It is unknown what she did with the wallet or the belongings.

June 21

Officers were dispatched to SR-161 and Riverside Dr to assist Dublin Police in closing the roadway due to a fatal crash on West Bridge St near Dublin Rd. While crossing the bridge and speaking with Dublin Police, a black Honda Civic traveling northbound on Dublin Rd drove through two police barricades, around a CPD and DPD cruiser, nearly striking a Columbus Officer, a Hilliard Officer, and a Dublin Officer. The Civic ran over cones that were blocking the roadway and drove through the police line before turning eastbound on West Bridge St towards Perry Officers. Perry Officers were able to avoid being struck by the vehicle. All officers gathered and determined that there were no injuries. Suspect information was aired to Columbus, Upper Arlington, Hilliard, and Dublin police.

June 21

Officer was dispatched to the 8000 block of Fairway Dr on report of a hit-skip accident. Unit 2 was parked on the road facing southbound on Fairway Dr. At some time between 2300 hours on June 20th and 1100 hours on June 21st, unknown unit 1 sideswiped unit 2 going southbound on Fairway Dr and leaving the scene. Unit 1 has not been identified.

June 21

Officers were dispatched to assist Sharon Twp Police on a reported domestic violence in a vehicle in the 7800 block of Olentangy River Rd. Upon arrival, officers made contact with the vehicle matching the description to the call. Both parties denied having any physical altercations. Sharon Twp Officers handled the investigation form that point forward.

June 21

Officer was dispatched on a potential mental health emergency. Worthing Medic 101 also responded and the subject voluntarily went with Medic 101 to the hospital.

June 24

Officers were dispatched to a disabled vehicle on Riverside Dr. The driver explained that his vehicle had stopped working while traveling southbound on Riverside Dr. Officer offered to use cruiser push bar to move the vehicle out of the roadway until a tow could arrive. The driver agreed and the vehicle was moved from the roadway.

June 25

Officer was advised of potential road damage on Ravello Dr east of Riverside Dr that was caused by a construction company that was paving a driveway in the area. A check of the area showed small gouge marks and oil stains on the roadway.

June 27

Officer was flagged down on a report of someone following them. The concerned individual advised that she was being followed. She observed the officer's cruiser and attempted to flag the officer down. She stated that when she got behind the officer's vehicle, the suspect left the area.

June 27

Officer responded to an injury accident in Sharon Township on mutual aid. Upon arrival, officer determined that the at-fault driver had fled the scene. Officer was unsuccessful in locating the suspect.

June 28

Officers were dispatched to the area south of the Arlington Pointe apartments to assist UAPD with a perimeter. Their units had a pursuit of a stolen car which crashed in a parking lot. Perry officers assisted by checking parking lots for the escaped driver. No further action was taken by Perry officers.

June 28

Officer was dispatched to the 6700 block of McVey Blvd on vandalism. Officer spoke with the homeowner, who advised that between the hours of 0800 and 1200 an unknown person or object struck his mailbox causing it to fall off of the post. There are no known suspects at this time.

June 28

Officers responded to the I-270 eastbound at SR-315 on mutual aid to Sharon Twp Police. Officers remained on scene to assist with traffic control until OSHP arrived. The scene was released to OSHP with no further involvement by Perry officers.

June 28

Officer responded to reports of a firework that had struck a house and possibly caused damage in the 8100 block of Fairway Dr. Officer patrolled the area in an attempt to locate a possible suspect but did not find any.

June 29

Officer observed a disabled vehicle blocking the right lane of US-33 and Hayden Rn Rd. Officer stood by to see if the owner would return and an individual arrived on scene stating that he was waiting for a tow to come. Officer asked if they could put the vehicle in the nearby parking lot and the driver agreed. Officer put the vehicle in neutral and another officer pushed it with a patrol car into the lot. Officer cleared and returned to patrol.

June 29

Officer responded to the area of I-270 and SR-315 after an FCSO deputy had made a traffic stop and requested an additional officer due to a possibly impaired driver. A Sharon Two officer arrived on scene shortly before Perry officer and aird that the location was actually I-270 westbound east of US-23. The driver was placed under arrested for operating a motor vehicle while under the influence after standard field sobriety tests were conducted.

June 29

Officer was assisting with the Brookside Bike Parade in Brookside Estates. While in the 2400 block of Merbrook, a juvenile struck a mailbox while riding his bike and fell to the ground. His knee had a minor abrasion but he did not need a medic. Officer applied two band-aids and a neighbor provided Gatorade. Officer contacted his mother and she responded to the scene.

June 29

Officer was dispatched to the 8100 block of Fairway Dr on a vandalism complaint. The complainant advised that an unknown person drove by her home northbound on Fairway Dr after throwing an explosive into the flower bed near the garage causing damage to the flowers, mulch, and spraying explosive powder onto her vehicle parked in the driveway.

June 29

Officer observed a black Hyundai traveling northbound at a high rate of speed on Riverside Dr near Eastleft Dr. Officer clocked the vehicle at 61 MPH, then 59 MPH. Officer initiated a traffic stop. Upon contact, the driver stated that she did not have a driver's license. Officer confirmed that the license was expired as of March 8th, 2025. The driver was cited for expired license less than six months. The driver's brother, a valid driver, arrived on scene to drive the vehicle.

June 30

Harrisburg Police initiated a pursuit from the area of US-62 and Harrisburg Rd. Eventually, the pursuit reached SR-315 and Hard Rd around 1549 hours. The suspect vehicle continued driving around Hard Rd and Linworth Rd and Perry Twp Police assistance was authorized. Officer began responding to the area of the last transmitted location of Worthington Row Dr and Bridewater Blvd. Harrisburg PD advised that the occupants were running south towards the electrical station from Golden Springs Dr. Sharon Twp Police were able to detain one of the fleeing suspects. Perry officers began patrolling the area of Brookside Estates in search of the suspect. The suspect was not located and Harrisburg PD called off the search.
