Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of November 2021



Nov 1

Officers were dispatched the 4700 block of Shuster Rd on an alarm drop. Officers arrived on the scene and checked all the doors and windows. After determining that the business was secure, officers cleared the scene and resumed patrol.

Nov 2

Officers were dispatched to the 3400 block of Skyline Drive on a stolen vehicle. Officers spoke with the resident, who stated that their red ford had been taken from his driveway by unknown person(s) that morning. The resident stated that the doors were locked and there was a set of keys underneath the floor mat. The vehicle was entered as stolen by Franklin County Records.

Nov 4

Officers were dispatched to the 8400 block of Netherlands Place on report of damage to a car. Officers made contact with a male who stated that he had gone left of center and struck something with the front side of his vehicle. He advised he was okay and refused medics when asked. Officers gathered pertinent information and photographs and located the scene of the crash, discovering damage to a tree and debris from the male's car. After photographing the scene, officers cleared the scene.

Nov 4

While on patrol, officers noticed a blocking injury accident at the intersection of Bethel Road by Olentangy Commons. Officers blocked traffic and aired for Columbus Police to respond. One involved driver was on the scene complaining of injuries while the other driver had fled. Columbus Fire and Police arrived on scene to check for injuries and investigate the crash. Officers cleared the scene after assisting with moving the vehicles.

Nov 4

Officers were dispatched to the area of Winston Ct on a theft report. Victim reported they had seen what they believed to be their tools in a photo on Facebook and investigated their shed, noticing said tools were missing. Officers advised the victim to contact the police if anything else was noticed to be missing.

Nov 7

Officers were notified that Upper Arlington Police had stopped a drunk driver and was dispatched to Riverside Drive by Fishinger Road. Officer remained on the scene to assist with traffic control as UAPD conducted field sobriety tests. UAPD placed the suspect under arrest for OVI and officers cleared the scene.

Nov 9

Officers were dispatched to the 8400 block of Fairway Drive on a burglary alarm that was set off by interior motion. Officers checked the doors and windows found them to be secure. Officers left an alarm notice on the front door and cleared the scene, then resumed patrol.

Nov 9

Officer was dispatched to the area of Water Bank Street and River Hallow Road on report of a streetlight that was struck by a trailer or vehicle. Officer investigated the scene and took pictures. Officer cleared the scene and resumed patrol.

Nov 9

On routine patrol, officers observed a disabled vehicle in the left lane of travel. The driver stated that her car had stopped for an unknown reason. Officers were able to push the vehicle off the road into a spot where the driver could wait for assistance. Officers cleared the scene and resumed patrol.

Nov 9

Officers were dispatched to the area of Riverside Dr and McCoy Rd on report of an injury accident. Officers discovered a three-vehicle accident with Upper Arlington Fire Department vehicles on scene. Officers performed field sobriety tests on one of the drivers, a male, believed to be at fault in the accident. After determining the male was intoxicated, officers placed the male under arrest.

Nov 10

Officer was dispatched to the 1700 block of W. Case Rd on report of a theft from a motor vehicle. Upon arrival, officer met with the victim, who advised that items had been stolen from the center console of their SUV. Officer recorded information about transactions from the stolen credit cards and other evidence from the victim.

Nov 10

While on routine patrol, officers observed two vehicles pull to the side of the road on Sawmill Rd close to Snouffer. Officers learned it was a minor ACDA crash with no injuries. One of the drivers involved was found to not have a valid driver's license. Due to the location of the incident taking place in Columbus, officers requested a Columbus Police Officers to respond. After a CPD officer arrived at the scene, officers cleared the scene without further involvement.

Nov 11

Officers were dispatched on report of a non-injury accident in the area of Riverside Dr and Lane Rd. Officers made contact with one driver, who informed officers that the other driver involved had left the scene after providing her name and phone number. Officers contacted the other driver and asked she provide her insurance information in a timely manner. After receiving the information, officers cleared the scene.

Nov 11

Officer was dispatched to SR-315 by Hard Road on an injury accident. After arriving on scene, officer moved one vehicle from the roadway and stood by until a towing unit arrived. Officer cleared the scene.

Nov 12

Officer was dispatched to the 2600 block of McVey Blvd West on a suspicious vehicle complaint. Officer made contact with the complainant, who advised that a male had come to her door asking if she had cameras outside her home. The male said that he had parked his white Lexus on the side of the street and that it had been side swiped an hour ago. The male continued to go around asking if there were cameras. Officer made contact with an additional resident, who advised they had not been home all day, but did have a painter over. Officer was not able to locate a white Lexus in the area.

Nov 12

Officers were dispatched to a possible burglary at the 3300 block of Wolf Ridge Dr. Upon arrival, officers checked the interior of the home for intruders. Officers found no one, and nothing appeared out of place. Officers made contact with the homeowner, who advised the rear first floor window had been broke. After investigating, officers discovered a small lamp post outside that was missing the top portion and appeared broken. The top portion was discovered close to the shattered window. Officer determined that the lamp had broken and shattered the window. Officers took pictures and cleared the scene.

Nov 14

Officer was dispatched to assist Sharon Township Police in the area of North High St over I-270 with a vehicle on fire. Upon arrival, officer found the fire department had doused the fire completely and debris from the car covered three lanes of travel. Officer assisted Sharon Township with traffic control while the vehicle and debris were cleared. Once the roadway cleared, officers cleared the scene and resumed patrol.

Nov 14

Officer was dispatched to the Brookside Country Club on an interior motion alarm. Upon arrival, officer met with a club member, who advised that another club member had entered the building and set the alarm off by mistake and advised all was ok. Officer cleared the scene and resumed patrol.

Nov 19

Officer was dispatched to the 1500 block of Shelly Ct on an identity theft report. Upon arrival, officer spoke with the victim, who advised that her an unknown person filed a change of address with the post office, then applied for a new credit card three days later. Victim already closer her credit card account and was dealing with the change of address. Officer took a report and cleared the scene.

Nov 20

On routine patrol, officer observed a vehicle speeding on Riverside Drive (71 mph in a 45 mph zone). After safely initiating a traffic stop, officer discovered the driver was not the registered owner of the vehicle and did not have a driver's license in the United States. Officer requested assistance from UAPD and other Perry units. Officers issued citations to the driver, impounded the vehicle, and contacted the legal owner of the vehicle. Officers cleared the scene.

Nov 21

Officers were dispatched to the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Run on report of a person slumped over behind the wheel of a vehicle. Officers arrived on scene and attempted to the wake the driver. After performing sobriety tests, officers found the driver to be intoxicated and placed him under arrest and his vehicle was impounded.

Nov 21

Officers were dispatched to assist Sharon Township Police on a domestic complaint. Upon arrival, officers met with a Sharon Township Officer and made contact with two males. The two were separated and provided similar explanations to what had occurred: there was an argument over dog training, and one male struck the other and the other retaliated. After statements and pictures were gathered by Sharon Township PD, Perry Township Officers were informed they could clear the scene. Officers cleared the scene without incident.

Nov 22

Officer was dispatched to the 8200 block of Copperfield Drive on an alarm drop. Officer spoke with the homeowner, who stated their wife accidentally set the alarm off and there was no emergency. Officer cleared the scene and resumed patrol.

Nov 22

Officer was dispatched to the 8100 block of Blind Brook Court on report of a suspicious of vehicle. Upon arrival, officer observed the vehicle and made contact with the driver. The driver advised that she also lived in the Hills and was dropping off her friend but were talking a bit beforehand. Officer apologized for the inconvenience and cleared the scene.

Officer arrived on the scene and blocked the roadway at Clubview Blvd and Colony Way while fire engines arrived on the scene and put out the fire. After the fire was put out and there was no further need to have the roadway blocked, officer cleared the scene.

Officer issued a citation, and the vehicle was impounded. The driver was picked up by a friend from the scene. Officer cleared the scene without further incident.
