Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township  
Month of March 2018

### **March 1, 2018**

An Officer on patrol in the area Linworth Road and Olentangy River Road came across a vehicle pulled off the side of the roadway. When he stopped to check on the driver, the Columbus man stated he struck a bucket that was in the roadway and was just checking his vehicle for damages. The Officer stood by while the driver checked for damage. After no damage was found, he cleared the roadway.

### **March 2, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 8000 block of Fairway Drive on a residential alarm. Officers arrived and found the home to be secure. An alarm notice was left for the homeowner on the door.

### **March 2, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Scioto View Lane on a suspicious vehicle. Officers arrived and searched the area and were unable to locate any vehicle matching the description given. The call was anonymous so officers stayed and patrolled in the area for a while before clearing.

### **March 3 – 4, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 5000 block of Charlbury Drive on a report of vandalism. Upon arrival the Officers spoke with one homeowner who stated his mailbox and three other homes within his block had their mailbox knocked down and/or broken overnight. He further stated another neighbor told him that the neighbor who lives across the street has a teenage daughter who had a party the evening of March 3 and there was lots of noise between the hours of 11 p.m. and 12:30 a.m. Officers made contact with that teenage female to gather further information. Detectives will be looking into this with the intent of filing future charges.

### **March 4, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the area of Riverside Drive and Clifton Road on a disabled blocking motorist. The Officer arrived on scene and was able to use the push bumper to push the vehicle off the road until a tow truck could arrive to assist the driver.

### **March 4, 2018**

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of Riverside Drive and Canterbury Road for a speeding violation. After further checking the driver's information he was found to have a suspended driver's license. The man was then cited and released on a summons to court.

**March 4, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the area of State Route 161/West Dublin Granville Road and Linworth Road on report of a non-injury accident. Officers arrived in the area and were unable to locate any vehicles matching the description given nor was anyone making themselves known from any of the parking lots nearby. At the same time Sharon Township Police advised they found a non-injury crash at the next major intersection east of his location on Olentangy River Road. The Officer followed up at that location along with Sharon Township police officer and was able to determine the accident did occur within Sharon Township. The Sharon Township officer then took the crash report.

**March 8, 2018**

An Officer, while on patrol in the area of State Route 315 and Hard Road can across an injury crash. The Officer called for medics and Sharon Township Police to respond the scene. Perry Township officers then assisted with traffic control until the roadway could be reopened.

**March 9, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to meet with Upper Arlington Police to take custody of a Columbus woman with an active warrant out of the Perry Township Police Department. The woman was then transported to Franklin County Clerk's office where she paid out the warrant in full and was then released to her mother.

**March 10, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to Police Headquarters to meet with a Columbus woman who has been harassed by an ex-boyfriend. The woman stated she and the ex boyfriend lived together until recently but he continues to come by her home knock on her door and wait for her in the parking lot. Officers made contact with the ex-boyfriend and advised him to no longer contact the woman.

**March 10, 2018**

Perry Township Officers, along with their canine, provided mutual aid to Dublin Police Department for a security sweep of an outdoor recreation area.

**March 10, 2018**

An Officer assisted an unmarked police car with a possible drunk driver in the area of Sawmill Road near interstate 270. A Dublin man had been stopped after he was driving on the wrong side of the road. The man was subsequently given field sobriety tests and arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol. The man was then cited and released on a summons to court for multiple traffic violations

**March 11, 2018**

An Officer on patrol in the area of US 33/Riverside Drive and Lane Avenue came across a disabled/blocking auto. The Officer assisted the stranded motorist by pushing his vehicle out of the roadway until a tow truck's arrival.

**March 11, 2018**

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of Bethel Road and Jasonway Avenue for an expired registration violation. After further checking the driver's information he was found to have a suspended driver's license. The man was then cited and released on a summons to court.

**March 11, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the area of Clubview Boulevard South near Fairway Drive on report of a hit-skip accident involving a parked vehicle. Officers arrived in the area and the caller/witness stated the victim had left just prior to Officer's arrival not knowing their vehicle had been struck. Caller/witness gave Officers a description of the vehicle that hit the parked car.

Officers searched the area and did come across a vehicle matching the description given blocking the intersection of Fairway and Oakview Drive. The Officers were able to perform field sobriety test and the Columbus woman was subsequently arrested for operating under the influence of alcohol. The woman was then cited and released on a summons to court for several traffic violations. The vehicle that was parked and struck was eventually reported and added to the crash report that the Columbus woman was involved in.

**March 11, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 7000 block of Sawmill Road on a dispute between ex boyfriend and ex girlfriend. The ex girlfriend stated that her ex boyfriend won't leave her alone. She did not want to file charges just a report with the police. The ex boyfriend was contacted by the police and advised him to leave her alone.

**March 13, 2018**

Officer was dispatched to the 700 block of Lake Shore Drive to assist Sharon Twp on an open door. Officers searched the residence and found nothing disturbed. Both officers secured the door and went back on patrol.

**March 13, 2018**

A wallet containing three credit cards and a driver's license was found and turned in to the Perry Township Police Department. The owners were found and the police department is waiting to hear from them.

**March 13, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 6000 block of Merwin on a well being check of an elderly female. Everything checked ok. Officers went back on patrol.

**March 14, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 800 block of Clubview Blvd on an domestic assistance. Upon arrival Officers spoke with mom who states that her daughter was out of control and had not taken her medication and refused to go to school. Officers spoke with the seventeen year old and convinced her to go to OSU Hospital for treatment.

**March 15, 2018**

An Officer who was observing traffic in the 2000 block of Billingsley Road was approached by a man who was walking through the lot. The Columbus man engaged in conversation with the officer about law enforcement officers. The Officer determined the man was intoxicated and did not want him walking any further. He instructed the man to call a friend for a ride, so the man decided to take an Uber which arrived shortly after and took the man home.

**March 16, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the area of US 33/Riverside Drive and Lane Avenue on a non-injury accident. The officer arrived on scene and found two vehicles on the side of the road with their hazard lights on. After speaking with the drivers it was determined the accident occurred within Columbus Police jurisdiction. The officer then requested for a Columbus Police Officer to the respond to the scene.

**March 16, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Scioto View Lane on report of suspicious person attempting to open the front door to the home. Officers arrived and spoke with a Columbus woman who was babysitting her grandson. The woman stated she was not alarmed but her grandson was alarmed because his mother and stepfather are in the middle of a divorce. The boy stated two people that associate with the step-father were seen by the juvenile when he looked out the front window. No one was in the area by the time the officers arrived to the address.

**March 16, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of Circle on the Green on a residential alarm. Officers arrived on scene and spoke with a Columbus woman who was the housekeeper. She was cleaning the home and set off the alarm.

**March 17, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 900 block of Bethel Road on a possible stolen weapon. The owner of the business stated that a man came in to do a trade on a weapon and was acting very suspicious and nervous. The store owner requested that a check of the serial number be done by the Officer. A check was done through LEADS and came back not stolen.

**March 18, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 6000 block of Merwin Road on a well-being check. Officers arrived and spoke with the resident whose well being was in question. They found the resident to be fine. The resident was advised to contact their daughter who was concerned about them.

**March 19, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to the area of North High St and Interstate 270 to assist Worthington Police Department with a search of a female arrestee. The Officer arrived and completed a search without incident.

**March 20, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to the area of Linworth Road and West Dublin Granville Road to assist Worthington Police Department with a search of a female arrestee. The Officer arrived and completed a search without incident.

**March 20, 2018**

An Officer observed two vehicles that were involved in a crash at Bethel and Olentangy River Road. Neither party was injured. Columbus Police arrived on scene and took control of the accident scene. The Officer then cleared.

**March 20, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to the 800 block of Blindbrook Dr on an alarm drop. The homeowner stated it was accidental. The Officer went back on patrol.

**March 21, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to the 2500 block of Riverside Drive to assist the Upper Arlington Fire department. Upon arrival the hallway was full of smoke because someone burned their pork chops. The Officer cleared.

**March 21, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to the 7000 block of Sawmill Road on an interference with custody. One of the parties involved stated that they were not bringing the child. The Officer advised he would take a report documenting the incident.

**March 21, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to the 2500 block of Riverside Drive on an unlocked door. Upon arrival the resident stated that this was the second time this had happened. They were advised to change the locks to ensure nobody has a key. Residents said they were going to install a security camera.

**March 21, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to the 1300 block of Hickory Ridge on a theft. Upon arrival he spoke with the homeowner who stated that someone stole some gold plated pieces from her Scrabble game. They suspect it's a family member.

**March 21, 2018**

An Officer made traffic stop on Sawmill Road for driving without lights. It was discovered that the driver had a suspended license. The driver was cited for not having a license, driving under suspension, and driving with no headlights. The driver was summoned into Franklin County Municipal Court.

**March 22, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Riverside Drive on report of a suicidal man. Officers were requested to respond by a doctor at Ohio State University who was the psychiatrist of the man. The psychiatrist stated the man made threats to kill himself and requested he be brought into the hospital for further evaluation. Officers arrived on scene and were able to transport the man to Ohio State University hospital without incident.

**March 22, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 6700 block of McVey Boulevard on report of a child whom was followed to school by a suspicious vehicle. The information was passed on to the Officers who sit in the school zone every morning and every afternoon. The school was also advised to be on the lookout for any vehicle matching the description that was given.

**March 23, 2018**

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of Bethel Road and Jason Way Boulevard for an expired registration violation. After further checking the driver's information he was found to only be in possession of a temporary driving permit and did not have a valid driver in the vehicle with him, making that permit invalid. The man was then cited and released on a summons to court.

**March 23, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Summit View Road on report of a possible injury crash. When Officers arrived on scene they found a vehicle on the side of the road and stopped to speak with the driver. The driver explained she was not involved in a crash but in fact had a seatbelt emergency with her granddaughter in the back seat. She stated the seatbelt had gotten wrapped around her neck. Columbus Fire Department was called to evaluate the minor child who checked out okay. The child just had minor bruising.

**March 23, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the area of 2400 Merwood Street on report of suspicious person going door-to-door. Officers arrived in the area and located the door to door salesman who had all the correct paperwork and a permit in his possession. He was then allowed to continue his door-to-door sales.

**March 23, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 900 block of Bethel Road on a business alarm. Upon arrival officers checked the exterior and found no signs of forced entry and everything to be secure.

**March 24, 2018**

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of Bethel Road and Sawmill Road for an expired registration violation. After further checking the driver's information he was found to have a suspended driver's license. The man was then cited and released on a summons to court.

**March 24, 2018**

An officer while on regular patrol in the area of Sawmill Road and Banker Drive came across two vehicles blocking the intersection. The officer made contact with the drivers who stated they were involved in a crash and needed medical assistance. The Officer requested for Columbus Fire Department and Columbus Police Department to respond. The Perry Twp Officer stayed on the scene until both CFD and CPD arrived.

An officer was dispatched to Police headquarters to assist Columbus Police in using the BAC machine. Both jurisdictions arrived and a BAC test was performed. The building was secured after Columbus Police exited.

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Scioto View Lane on report of a domestic dispute. Officers arrived on scene and spoke with all parties involved on scene and over the phone. Both parties stated they were going through a divorce and things are kind of heated on both sides. It was determined no physical violence had happened on this date and the parties had already separated prior to police arrival. A report was filed to document the incident that occurred.

**March 26, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 8000 block of Evangeline Drive on report of a sick or injured skunk. Upon arrival the skunk had already left the area and the caller explained to the officer the skunk was having a hard time walking into the wooded area and she was concerned.

**March 26, 2018**

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of Clubview Boulevard North and Clubview Boulevard South for a red light violation. After further checking the driver's information he was found to not have a driver's license or car insurance. The man was then cited and released on a summons to court.

**March 27, 2018**

An officer while patrolling the area of Sawmill Road near Interstate 270 did a random registration check on a vehicle driving in front of them. The registered owner returned showing a suspended license. A traffic stop was made on a Columbus woman. The woman was the owner was subsequently cited and released on a summons to court.

**March 27, 2018**

An Officer stopped to check on an accident at Sawmill and Emerald Parkway. The fire department arrived on scene as well as Columbus police. The Officer cleared the scene.

**March 27, 2018**

An Officer was advised by a motorist that an individual at the 700 block of Bethel Road was passed out. When the Officer arrived the man was drinking water. The man was transported to Riverside Hospital for observation.

**March 27, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to 161 and Strathaven on a road rage incident. The Officer spoke with both parties. One of the parties was a tow truck. The Officer advised the caller to call the tow truck company and advise the company that he is not pleased with the way the driver was driving.

**March 27, 2018**

An Officer made a traffic stop at the 7000 block of Sawmill Road. During the stop it was discovered that the driver was under suspension. Citations were issued and the vehicle was impounded. The driver was picked up by a friend at the scene.

**March 28, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to the 7000 block of Sawmill Road on lost dog complaint. The individual states he lost his dog at the Frisbee park and has yet to be found. A police report was needed so he could file a claim.

**March 28, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to the 800 block of Blindbrook. The caller stated that an unknown person hacked her personal computer. It was later determined that the caller failed to pay for a software she ordered so the company was trying to remove the ordered software from her computer. She stated she never bought any type of software from this company.

**March 28, 2018**

An Officer was dispatched to the 1000 block of Circle on the Green on a loud music complaint. The officer spoke with the home owner who feels they are being harassed by the neighbors and now the police. The Officer advised the resident that the police have to respond on all calls to investigate and that they were not breaking any law. The officer went back on patrol.

**March 29, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the area of State Route 161 and the railroad tracks on report of the crossing gates stuck in the down position causing traffic issues. Officers directed traffic until CSX could arrive and correct the issue.

**March 29, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the area of State Route 161 and Thompson Drive on report of a non-injury accident. Columbus Police arrived on scene as well. Columbus Police Department requested to take the crash report for training purposes since it was so close to jurisdictional boundaries.

**March 30, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of Circle on the Green on a neighbor complaint concerning loud music. Officers arrived and spoke with the caller about the issue. At that time there was no loud noise going on but the officer stated he would have third shift do extra patrol in the area.

**March 30, 2018**

Officers were dispatched to the 5000 block of Henderson Heights Road on an a call for assistance to the fire department. When Officers arrived on scene, fire department was already there rendering care for a minor medical emergency. No transport to hospital was required.

**March 31, 2018**

A female officer was dispatched to Worthington Police Department to assist in searching a female prisoner. The Officer arrived and was able to complete the search without complications.

**March 31, 2018**

An Officer on patrol in the area of Sawmill Road and Summer Road came across a blocking disabled motorist. The officer stopped to check on the driver and about the same time her husband arrived on scene. The officer assisted the couple with getting the vehicle off of the roadway and onto a parking lot until further assistance could get to them.
