Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of May 2019

May 1, 2019

Officers were dispatched to Riverside Drive on a disabled vehicle. The vehicle was found but the registered owner / driver was not there and could not be located. Based on the location of the car and the hazard it presented, Officers towed the vehicle. A copy of the impound form and a copy of report was faxed to FCSO.

May 2, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the area of SR 315 and Bethel Road to assist Sharon Township Police on a suspicious person walking northbound. An Officer arrived and spoke to a Columbus man who stated he had just left the hospital and his ride was about to pull up. Moments later the man's brother arrived to give him a ride as he stated.

May 2, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the area of Riverside Dr and Lane Ave on an injury crash. Officers arrived and located the crash that occurred at the intersection within the Columbus City jurisdiction. Both parties had exchanged information prior to the Officer's arrival and declined a crash report from Columbus PD.

May 3, 2019

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of Billingsley Road and Sawmill Road after multiple traffic moving violations. After further reviewing the driver's information he was found to have a suspended driver's license. The man was then cited and released on a summons to appear in court. The vehicle was released to a driver with a valid license.

May 4, 2019

Officers were dispatched the Brookside Country Club on a business alarm. The drop was on the athletic complex basement door. Officers arrived and checked all exterior doors and windows and all was found secure.

May 4, 2019

An Officer was flagged down in the area of Sawmill Road and Billingsley Road by a passerby stating a crash had just occurred at the intersection. The Officer contacted Columbus Police and requested they respond as well then went to check on the involved parties. All parties were OK and the officer stood by until Columbus Officers arrived on scene.

May 5, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 4000 block of Charlbury Dr on a suspicious person in a vehicle. Officers arrived and located a vehicle matching the description given. While speaking to the driver he explained he hit a pothole in the road on Henderson Road and pulled onto Charlbury to change his tire. Officers assisted him with changing the tire change. He was then able to continue on his way.

May 6, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 6000 block of Merwin Road on an assistance to the medics. The homeowner was having a hard time breathing and her son was having difficulty moving the patient. Officers and medics arrived on scene at approximately the same time. Medics decided to transport the homeowner to the hospital for evaluation.

May 6, 2019

A Columbus woman was stopped in the area of Bethel Road and Jasonway for a speeding violation. After further reviewing the driver's information she was found to have a suspended driver's license. The woman was then cited and released on a summons to appear in court. Her vehicle was released to the passenger who had a valid license.

May 6, 2019

An Officer on patrol in the area of Smoky Row Rd and Queensbridge Dr came across an injury accident that occurred within the City of Columbus jurisdiction. The Columbus Fire Department arrived and blocked traffic while evaluating the occupants. Perry Township Officers assisted with traffic control while Columbus Police Officers arrived and gathered information for the crash report.

May 6, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 5500 block of Riverside Drive on report of a residential alarm. Officers arrived and check the exterior windows and doors and found the property to be secure.

May 7, 2019

An Officer was flagged down and advised that a vehicle was in an accident and on its top near the 7100 block of Sawmill Road. The Officer responded and assisted while waiting for Columbus Police to arrive. Upon the arrival of Columbus Officers, the scene was turned over to them and the Perry Township officer went back on patrol.

May 7, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 5500 block of Riverside Drive on an alarm drop. Officers checked the house and found no signs of forced entry. All doors and windows were locked and secure. Officers cleared the scene.

May 7, 2019

Officers were dispatched to Worthington Hills Elementary School on a report a child had fallen and could not get up. Officers stabilized the girl and waited for medics to arrive. The child was transported Children's Hospital for observation.

May 7, 2019

Officers came upon an accident scene near the 700 block of Bethel Road. Officers held the scene until Columbus Police arrived. Officers then cleared the scene.

May 7, 2019

An Officer conducted a traffic stop for a license plate violation. Further review of the driver's information revealed that the driver's license was expired. The driver was cited for expired plates and driving without a driver's license. The vehicle was driven away by her boyfriend.

May 7, 2019

An Officer was dispatched to the area of Riverside Dr and Lane Ave on a pedestrian walking in the roadway. The Officer located the subject in question and provided a courtesy transport to the McDonalds on Sawmill Road.

May 8, 2019

Officer were dispatched to Worthington Hills Elementary school on a special needs child not wanting to come out of the bathroom stall. Officers and the principal were able to talk the child out. The child was explained the rules. Officers left the scene.

May 8, 2019

An Officer was working a traffic detail in Brookside Estates when a vehicle failed to stop at a stop sign. It was discovered that the driver was driving on a suspended license. She was cited for no operator's license, stop sign violation, and driving under suspension. The vehicle was released to the passenger.

May 8, 2019

Officers assisted Columbus police on a fight between two females at 7200 Sawmill Road. When Columbus Police arrived and took control of the scene, the Officers cleared.

May 9, 2019

Officers were dispatched to Brookside Elementary School on 3 suspicious people standing by one of the doors. Officers arrived and found 3 people who stated they were standing under the overhang for shelter until the rain let up a little.

May 9, 2019

An Officer was dispatched to meet with Westerville Police in the 1000 block of West Dublin Granville Road. Dispatch stated Westerville Police had a female in custody with an active warrant out of Perry Township. The officer arrived and took custody of the Columbus woman. She was then transported to the Franklin County Clerk of Courts office where she posted bond on her warrants and was then released.

May 9, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the area of Riverside Dr and Fishinger Rd on report of a hit skip crash. The Officer arrived on scene and made contact with the victim of the crash stating he was struck by a Local Waste garbage truck. The driver of the garbage truck told the victim to contact Local Garbage Company headquarters to handle the incident and then left the scene. The Officer found out the crash actually occurred within Upper Arlington jurisdiction. Perry Officers were able to contact a supervisor at Local Waste and have them contact the truck driver and have him return to the scene. An Arlington Officer was requested to respond to the scene to take care of the crash report.

May 10, 2019

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of Sawmill Road near West Case Road for an equipment violation. After further reviewing the driver's information he was found to not have a valid driver's license. The man was also found to have two valid felony warrants for his arrest. The man was subsequently arrested and transported to the Franklin County jail to be slated on those warrants.

May 10, 2019

An Officer on regular patrol found a wallet in the area of Summer Drive and Sawmill Road near the gutter. The Officer found identifying information on cards within the wallet and a driver's license. The Officer attempted to make contact with the owner and later found out The Columbus man was in jail. A message was left for him to come to Perry Township headquarters to pick up his property when he gets released from jail.

May 10, 2019

An Officer on patrol in the area of Henderson Road and Henderson Heights came across a blocking disabled vehicle. When the Officer stopped to check on the driver, a Columbus woman, she informed the officer she had run out of gas. A courtesy transport was provided to the nearest gas station and back to the woman's vehicle. The woman was able to then continue on her way after obtaining gas.

May 13, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 5000 block of Postlewaite Drive on an assistance to Sharon Township Police with a domestic violence call involving a husband and wife. Officers arrived on scene and separated the husband and wife to gather information about what had happened. After speaking with both parties and seeing no injuries had been suffered by anyone, the Officers were able to make a determination no arrests were warranted at this time. Both parties were separated for the night to avoid further issues.

May 13, 2019

A Dublin woman was stopped in the area of Bethel Road and Sawmill Road for a speeding violation. After further reviewing the driver's information she was found to have a suspended driver's license. The woman also was found to have active warrants in two separate counties. The woman was then arrested transported and slated at the Franklin County jail. Her vehicle was impounded.

Officers were dispatched to the 1600 block of Dolliver Drive to assist the Worthington Fire Department on a report of possible electrical fire. Officers arrived and found the Worthington Fire department was already on scene and had the situation contained. Officers cleared and return to patrol.

Officers arrived spoke with the man and also requested Worthington Fire and Franklin County crisis unit to respond to the scene. A Netcare worker evaluated him. The man was found to not be a harm to himself or others. His wife was advised to call at any point for assistance in the future.

May 13, 2019

Officers were dispatched to SR 161 and McVey Boulevard on a disabled vehicle stuck in the ditch. Officers arrived and spoke with the driver who stated he drove off the side of the road to avoid collision. A tow truck was called to remove the vehicle and the driver was given a courtesy transport home.

May 13, 2019

An Officer on patrol in the area of Clubview Boulevard South noticed the Worthington Fire Department turning towards Worthington Hills. The Officer requested information concerning the fire departments whereabouts. Dispatcher's advice they were in route to Worthington Hills elementary school on a fire alarm. Officers advised they would be in route as well. They arrived on scene and learned the fire department was able to contain the situation.

May 13, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the Worthington Hills elementary school concerning an anonymous greeting card they received in the mail indicating possible child abuse allegations concerning one of their students. The Officer arrived and collected the information along with the greeting card as evidence. Detectives and Franklin County children's services were contacted for follow up of the allegations.

May 14, 2019

An Officer was dispatched to Police headquarters on a fraud report. Upon arrival Officers spoke with the victim who stated that a Verizon account was opened without his consent and someone added four new Iphone's totaling \$4660.00. There are no known suspects at this time.

May 16, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 2000 block of West Dublin Granville road on a 911 hang up with an open line. Officers arrived and spoke with the in-charge person who stated it is a result of children playing on the elevator. They will be following up with the elevator company to get the button removed.

May 16, 2019

Officers were dispatched to assist Sharon Township Police with a domestic violence call in the 300 block of West Kanawha. Officers arrived and determined who the aggressor was and were facilitating an arrest when the suspect stated they needed a medic for chest pain. Worthington medics arrived on scene and did take one person to a nearby hospital for evaluation. Charges were filed and a warrant issued.

May 16, 2019

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of Smoky Row Road and Queensbridge Drive after random registration checks showed the owner having a suspended driver's license. After verifying the driver's information, he was then cited and released on a summons to appear in court.

May 17, 2019

An Officer was dispatched to the 1100 block of Clubview Boulevard South concerning services rendered by a tree company that was not requested. The home owner stated her neighbor contacted her about a tree company cutting portions of her tree away. The woman stated she spoke to this company but had not agreed to services nor signed any contract to authorize the work. Since no money had been exchanged the Officers determined this was a civil matter and explained to the home owner what her options were.

May 17, 2019

An Officer was dispatched to the 1400 block of Clubview Boulevard South on recovered property. The Officer arrived and the caller handed over a gold color purse that was found in the roadway in the area of Clubview Boulevard South and Colony Way. The Officer was able to locate the owner in the 900 block of Clubview Boulevard South and return the property to the rightful owner who stated nothing was missing out of the purse.

May 17, 2019

A Columbus woman was stopped in the area of US 33/ Riverside Drive and Hayden Road after random registration check showed the owner as being suspended. After verifying the drivers Identity, the woman was then cited and released on a summons to appear in court.

May 18, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 7000 block of Olentangy River Road on an assistance to Sharon Township Police concerning an autistic juvenile. The Officers were notified the juvenile was having an episode and the father was unable to get the child to calm down to be able to safely drive. Officers arrived and were able to work with the juvenile's mother who arrived shortly after to calm down the child and allow them to drive away safely.

May 18, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 6000 block of McVey Boulevard on a suspicious person. Officers arrived and searched the area but were unable to locate anyone matching the description given. The caller refused to see an Officer.

May 18, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 5000 block of Riverside Drive on a residential alarm. Officers arrived and checked the exterior and found the home to be secure. A notice of alarm was left for the homeowner.

May 19, 2019

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of 999 Bethel Road for an expired registration violation. After further reviewing the driver's information he was found to only possess a temporary driving permit. The driver did not have a licensed adult in the passenger seat. The driver was then cited and released on a summons to appear in court.

May 19, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 5500 block of Riverside Drive on a residential alarm. Officers arrived, checked the exterior and found the home to be secure.

May 19, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the area of Riverside Drive and Henderson Road on a suspicious male walking in the roadway. Once the Officers arrived, they did locate a man who stated he was walking home. The man was offered a ride to his residence but he declined. The man was permitted to continue walking but warned to stay out of the roadway.

Officers were dispatched to the 3000 block of Brookdown Dr on an assistance to the medics. Once on scene Officers spoke with a female with a compound fracture who was being evaluated by medics. She informed them she accidentally fell by her outdoor pool. She was transported to an area hospital for further care.

Officers were dispatched to the area of US 33/Riverside Dr and Zollinger Road on a report there was a metal rack on the roadway. Officers cleared the obstruction and were able to reopen the roadway.

May 20, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 6000 block of Merwin Rd on a residential alarm. Officers arrived and checked all exterior doors and windows. No signs of force or attempted force were seen.

May 20, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 1200 block of Candlewood Drive on an assistance to the medic with a juvenile having a possible seizure. Officers arrived and Worthington medics were already on scene administering aid. The juvenile's mother then chose to transport him in a private vehicle.

May 20, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the area of McVey Boulevard and West Dublin Granville Road on a possible tree in the roadway. The Officer arrived and was able to locate the tree and reroute traffic until the Road department could arrive to remove the tree and reopen the roadway.

May 20, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 5000 block of Riverside Drive on a residential alarm. Once on scene all exterior doors and windows were checked. No signs of force or attempted force were found. An alarm notification was left on the door for the homeowner.

May 21, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 6700 block of McVey Boulevard on report of suspicious persons. Officers arrived and were able to locate two people that matched the description given. Officers made contact with the two males who work for a pest control company. They did not have a permit and were advised to leave the area until they obtained a permit from Perry Township Administrative offices.

May 21, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 900 block of Clubview Boulevard North on a residential alarm. Officers arrived, checked all exterior windows and doors and found the home to be secure. An alarm notice was left for the homeowner.

May 22, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 2900 block of Brookdown Drive along with Worthington medics on a 911 hang up from a person who sounded like they could not breathe or talk. Officers arrived and found the fire department had forced entry after not being able to get anyone to answer the door. One of the homeowners came to the door for Officers. She was upset after the entry was made and stated nothing was wrong. It was determined the other homeowner, who has COPD a breathing issue, had accidentally called 911 didn't realize he was on line with 911 dispatchers.

May 23, 2019

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of Linworth Road and Larkstone Drive for a speeding violation. After further reviewing the driver's information he was found to not possess a driver's license. The man was then cited and released on a summons to appear in court.

May 24, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 1500 block of Beechlake Drive on a man claiming an Uber driver pulled a weapon on him. Officers arrived and spoke with the man who stated he took an Uber from a nearby country club home and when he arrived the driver pulled a weapon and demanded he go in his home. He had no information on the driver or the vehicle besides the color. A report was taken at this time to document the events.

May 24, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the area of US 33/Riverside Drive and Hayden Run on a non-injury blocking accident. Once on scene Officers were able to determine the crash occurred within the Columbus City jurisdiction so a Columbus Police officer was requested to respond to scene. Columbus Police were not taking non injury crashes at the time and the parties were advised to exchange information.

May 25, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 1300 block of Oakview Dr on a 911 hang up call. Officers arrived and spoke to the homeowner who stated his son was caught playing on the phone and everything was ok.

May 26, 2019

A Columbus man was stopped for an equipment violation in the 7000 block of Sawmill Road. After verifying the driver's information, he was found have a suspended driver's license. The man was then cited and released on a summons to appear in court.

May 26, 2019

An Officer on patrol in the area of Sawmill Road and Billingsley Road came across an injury crash within the City of Columbus. The Officer requested Columbus Police and Fire respond to the scene. The Officer stayed at the scene until Columbus arrived to complete the crash report.

May 27, 2019

Officers were dispatched multiple times to the 1400 block of Beechlake Dr on a garage door that keeps going up and down. The neighbor stated the homeowner was out of town and this keeps happening. The garage door was mechanically disconnected to prevent the door from opening until the homeowner returns from vacation to have it serviced.

May 29, 2019

An Officer conducted a traffic stop in Worthington Hills for a stop sign violation. It was discovered that the driver had no valid driver's license. He was cited for not having a license and a stop sign violation and summoned into court. The vehicle was driven away by the passenger.

May 30, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the area of McVey Boulevard and Cutter Court on report of teenagers using a machete to cut the brush back. Officers arrived in the area and searched but were unable to locate anyone matching the description given or anyone on foot in the area of the tree line.

May 31, 2019

Officers were dispatched to the 6000 block of Merwin Road on assistance to the medics on a person with difficulty breathing. Officers arrived along with Worthington medic 101. The man was then transported to an area hospital for further evaluation and observation.

May 31, 2019

An Officer on patrol in the area of Sawmill Road near West Case Road came across a blocking disabled vehicle. The officer stopped to check on the stranded motorist who stated AAA was in route but that she had been waiting for over 2 hours. Columbus Police were unable to respond due to heavy call volume so the Officer assisted by pushing the vehicle out of the way of traffic to a safe location to wait until AAA could arrive.

May 31, 2019

An Officer was dispatched to the Perry Township headquarters on report of a bottle of pills found in the parking lot. Once on scene the Officer spoke to the caller who was a Columbus Police Officer. The CPD Officer stated it could have belonged to a suspect that he was dealing with but he could not prove it so he contacted Perry Township to impound the property that was found. The bottle had two unknown pills inside. It was impounded for destruction.
