Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township  
**Month of June 2019**

### **June 1, 2019**

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of 999 Bethel Road for an expired registration violation. After further reviewing the driver's information he was found to have an expired driver's license as well. The man was then cited and released on a summons to appear in court.

### **June 1, 2019**

Officers were dispatched to the Brookside Country Club on a business alarm which was triggered from the athletic complex. Once on scene officers were able to confirm the alarm was going off and had been triggered by employees who were working in the pool area. The cook manager stated she would make sure to activate the alarm once the club closes for business.

### **June 1, 2019**

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Old Hill Court South on an assistance. Once on scene Officers spoke with the caller who stated she left a note given to her by the condo complex to place on a vehicle that was parked in her paid reserved spot. She stated the owner of that vehicle then placed the note on her front porch and flipped the middle finger to her camera. She wasn't sure what to do so she reported it to police. She was told if the man returned or caused any issues to contact police again.

### **June 1, 2019**

An Officer on patrol in the area of Estell Road witnessed a dog running towards another dog who was being walked by his owner. The dog that was not on a leash began to attack the other dog that was on a leash. The Officer turned around to provide assistance and the homeowner ran out to collect his dog that was not on a leash at the same time. The owner of the dog on a leash had picked up her dog to stop the other from biting it and incidentally was bite by her own animal in the process. Worthington medics were called to scene to evaluate her but she declined treatment. Franklin County Animal Control was called to verify registration and vaccinations and to deal with the dog bite.

### **June 3, 2019**

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of Sawmill Road, near Perry Township headquarters, for an expired registration violation. After further reviewing the driver's information he was found to have a child support suspension on his license. The man was then cited and released on a summons to appear in court.

### **June 4, 2019**

Officers were dispatched to the 900 block of Highview on an alarm drop. Officers checked the house and found nothing out of the ordinary. Both Officers went back on patrol.

**June 6, 2019**

Officers were dispatched to the area of 6000 Merwin Road on a report of possible fraud. Once on scene the Officer spoke with the homeowner and was able to determine they had been victimized by a phishing scheme. The homeowner was told to make a visit to their personal bank and turn over any evidence to the police department and their own bank.

**June 6, 2019**

Officers were dispatched to the 1400 block of Clubview Boulevard North on report a suspicious person. The caller stated someone rang her doorbell numerous times and when she looked outside, they had disappeared. Officers circulated the area and didn't find anyone.

**June 6, 2019**

Officers were dispatched to the 1600 block of Oakview on a telecommunication harassment. The caller states she is being harassed on Facebook by someone she met in Europe in 2017. Officer advised her to contact the German police department when she does her travels there.

**June 7, 2019**

An Officer conducted a traffic stop on Billingsley Road for a speed violation. It was discovered that the driver had no driver's license. He was cited for speed, not having a valid license. The owner of the vehicle knew that the driver had no license and she was issued a citation or wrongful entrustment.

**June 7, 2019**

Officers were dispatched to the 1600 block of W Case Road on an individual being taken advantage of by a contractor. The caller said she would be willing to pay \$100 less than what the contractor wanted. There was nothing in writing just verbal between the two. The contractor agreed to allow the home owner to pay \$100 less.

**June 7, 2019**

An Officer was dispatched to the 3700 block of Snouffer Road on a theft from a storage unit. The incident occurred on May 25, but the victim was out of town and is now reporting it. It appears that the lock was picked because it was undamaged.

**June 7, 2019**

An Officer conducted a traffic stop for a speed violation. It was discovered that the driver was driving on a suspended license. He was cited for no operators license, driving with a suspended license and speed.

**June 7, 2019**

An Officer conducted a traffic stop for a headlight violation on Sawmill Road. It was discovered that the driver was suspended. She was cited for not having a license, driving under suspension and driving with no headlights. The vehicle was driven away by the owner.

**June 8, 2019**

Officers were dispatched to the 6700 block of McVey Boulevard on a residential alarm. **June 9, 2019**

Officers arrived and the medics had an injured person loaded in the rear of the medic already. Medics then transported the person to a nearby hospital for further evaluation.

The Officer arrived and spoke with a caller who stated her mother's cell phone was stolen a few days ago and she believes she knows who had taken it. An Officer was contacted by the Perry Township Administrator concerning a person who dropped off a large amount of prescription drugs at the administrative building. The Officer arrived, took possession of all medications, and impounded them for destruction.

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Snouffer Place on a report of suspicious vehicle. The Officer arrived and was able to locate the owner who was the babysitter of the caller's neighbor. The babysitter was asked to move their vehicle from blocking any mail boxes. The responding Officer then returned to patrol.

**June 20, 2019**

Officers were dispatched to the 3000 block of Brookdown Drive on report of a threat. Officers arrived and spoke with the homeowner who stated her grandson had threatened to hurt her if she did not give him money. He has been told in the past not to call or come over but continues to do so. The Columbus man was given a trespass warning over the phone and was advised he would be arrested if he came to the victim's residence again. He acknowledged understanding the consequences of future visits.

**June 20, 2019**

Officers were dispatched to the Brookside Country Club on a business alarm coming from the kitchen area. Officers arrived and checked the exterior and did find an unlocked door to the kitchen. The interior of the building was then checked and Officers did not find anything that appeared out of place. Officers secured the door and made contact with the fitness director, in the fitness center building, to advise him of the alarm and the open door.

**June 21, 2019**

A Columbus man was stopped in the area of State Route 161 and McVey Boulevard for an expired registration violation. After further review of the driver's information he was found to have a suspended driver's license. The man was then issued a citation and released on a summons to appear in court.

Officers were dispatched to the 1300 block of Candlewood Drive on an assist to medics. Officers arrived and were met by Worthington Medic 101 and a probate pre-screener with Net Care. A Canal Winchester man was stopped in the area of 3000 Snouffer Road for multiple traffic violations. After further reviewing the driver's information he was found to have a suspended driver's license and a felony warrant for his arrest. The man was then asked to turn off his vehicle at which time he took off from the stop location at a high rate of speed. The Officers pursued he man a short distance, but due to traffic and conditions, it was unsafe to continue. Officers already had the man's information and warrants for his arrest were filed and issued for fleeing and obstructing.

An Officer working special duty in the area of Linworth Road and State Route 161 at a church event had a concerned coordinator inform him of possible domestic issues between a church goer and her estranged husband. Additional special duty officers were called in case an incident did occur.
