Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of APRIL 2020

April 2, 2020

Officers were dispatched to return a phone call concerning harassment to the homeowner in the 8200 block of Fairway Dr over contracted work. The contractor was contacted and advised to cease contact with the home owner and to seek legal assistance for civil action.

April 2, 2020

Officers were dispatched to the 8200 block of Breckenridge Drive on assistance to Worthington Fire Department with a gas leak. Officers stopped traffic at nearby intersections until the scene was determined safe.

April 5, 2020

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Scioto View Lane on a report of theft. Officers arrived and collected all required information and referred the case to detectives for follow up.

April 6, 2020

Officers were dispatched to the 6700 block of McVey Boulevard on a reckless driver who had been involved in a single vehicle crash. Once on scene, Officers determined the driver was suffering from an overdose. After medics arrived, he was transported to a local hospital for additional tests. The man was subsequently charged with for operation under the influence of drugs and failure to control. He was then provided a summons for future court date.
