Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of July 2022



July 1

Officers were dispatched on a mutual aid for Sharon Township. Officers spoke with the caller and resident, who stated that she and her spouse were arguing about a pile of clothes that had been in the same place for some time and was attracting mice. The husband stated they belonged to his son and agreed to move the clothes elsewhere and call his son.

July 2

Officer was requested to respond to an address in the 1400 block of Clubview Blvd S at the request of Worthington Police. Worthington stated they were out with a vehicle and wanted to know if the owner knew where it was. Officer made contact with the homeowner, who advised him that the vehicle at one time belonged to his sister and that it was donated. Officer contacted Worthington police and advised them of this information.

July 3

Around 0031, officer observed three persons out on the Brookside Country Club golf course. They attempted to hide in the grass but quickly gave up. All three males, presumably teenagers, were fully cooperative, and stated they were looking for golf balls. Officer gathered brief information and advised the group to go home. They complied, and officer left the scene.

July 3

Officers were dispatched to the 2900 block of Greenvale Dr to assist Worthington Fire on a smoke alarm. The house was checked and cleared by Worthington Fire; no smoke or fire was located. Officers cleared the scene.

July 4

Officers responded to a single car, injury accident at the intersection of Henderson Rd and US 33. Upper Arlington Medic and Engine #72 were on scene and shut down the roadway. The driver was determined to be under the influence of alcohol and was issued a citation with a mandatory court appearance for driving under the influence.

July 5

Officer responded to a non-injury hit-skip on US 33 near McCoy Rd. The at-fault vehicle crossed the double yellow line and struck the front of the second vehicle while attempting to pass. The second vehicle's driver was able to obtain a license plate number.

July 5

Officers were dispatched to the Brookside Country Club on report of two males with fishing poles. Officers located the men on scene and explained the location was private property and asked them to leave. Both men were completely cooperative and apologized, explaining they were not aware. They packed up their supplies and left the area without incident.

July 6

While patrolling US-33, officer located a potential danger to motorists in front of 6310 Riverside Dr. It appeared flooding washed large rocks into the northbound lane, which were not visible to motorists as they were submerged. Officer remained on scene until Dublin PD arrived and ODOT was notified.

July 6

Officer observed a black SUV failing to obey a red light southbound on US-33 at Hayden Run Rd. Officer performed a traffic stop and learned the driver did not have a valid license. Officer issued a citation to the driver and to the owner of the vehicle for wrongful entrustment.

July 8

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Scioto View Ln to investigate a complaint. Officer met the caller, who stated she had returned to her apartment and found her vehicle running and the TV on upstairs. She stated her roommate was out of town. Officer entered the apartment with caller's consent and found the apartment to be secured. Officer cleared and returned to patrol.

July 8

Officers were dispatched on alarm drop at the Worthington Hills Country Club. Officers arrived on scene and located two males in the parking lot. They were identified as club members and stated they had just walked outside. They stated no one else was inside, perhaps an employee. Officers checked the exterior doors of the clubhouse and found them to be secure.

July 9

Officers assisted Sharon Township Police on a possible burglary in the 800 block of Clubview Blvd S. The house was secure and no signs of tampering of any windows or doors.

July 9

Officer was dispatched to the 2500 block of Riverside Dr on a theft from a motor vehicle. Officer spoke with the victim, who stated that he noticed the driver side window was shattered and the steering column appeared to be tampered with.

July 9

Officers were dispatched to the 1200 block of Northport Dr on a loud noise complaint. Upon arrival, the home appeared quiet, and officers did not observe a party. Officers made contact with the homeowner and asked if he was having a party. Homeowner stated he had just finished having a cookout. Officers advised the homeowner that there had been a noise complaint. Homeowner apologized and stated he would keep it down next time. Officers cleared the scene without incident.

July 10

Officers responded to an OVI accident in the 3300 block of US-33. The driver was traveling southbound and went left of center, then struck a fire hydrant and street sign on the left side of the street. The vehicle then crossed all lanes of travel and left the roadway to the right. It finally crossed all lanes of travel again and parked. The driver was checked on scene by Upper Arlington Medic 72, then arrested for OVI.

July 10

Officers were dispatched to US-33 and Hayden Run Rd on a blocking disabled vehicle. Officers spoke with the owner/driver, who said that he had a tow on the way. Officers asked if they could push the vehicle up to Old Bethel. The driver agreed. Officers cleared the intersection and pulled the vehicle up Old Bethel Rd. Driver was happy to be out of the roadway. Officers cleared and returned to patrol.

July 10

Officers responded to a possible domestic violence in the 2500 block of Scioto View Ln. Upon arrival, officers discovered it was a verbal argument and both parties had already separated. Officers contacted both parties and spoke with them about the incident. Officers cleared the call with no further action.

July 11

Officers were dispatched to the 6800 block of McVey Blvd on report of a missing person. Officers spoke with a family member and took the missing person's information. Officers requested assistance from surrounding agencies. Officers located the missing person 30 minutes later. All units cleared.

July 11

Officer was dispatched to May Ct on an attempted identity theft. Officer took a report for the victim so he could provide it to the bank.

July 12

Officer was dispatched to the 2500 block of Snouffer Pl at the request of the Franklin County Engineer's Office. While working on the special use path project, workers identified several arrows and arrowheads on the ground and protruding through the fence. Officer contacted the homeowner and he agreed to clean them up. Officer thanked the homeowner for his cooperation and understanding.

July 12

Officers were dispatched to the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Rd on an injury crash. A driver attempted to make a left turn onto US-33 from Hayden Rd and drove in front of an oncoming vehicle, causing the crash. The at-fault driver was cited for failure to yield when turning left.

July 13

Officer was dispatched to assist UAPD on locating suspects in a theft. Officer assisted UAPD patrol the area before UAPD cleared all officers.

July 14

Officers were dispatched to SR-161 near Flora Villa Dr on report of a traffic accident. One vehicle rear ended another at the intersection after failing to stop in time. The at-fault driver was issued a citation for assured clear distance ahead.

July 16

Units were dispatched to the area of Riverside and West Case Rd on a report of a blocking non-injury crash. Units found the crash occurred in the city of Columbus. Both parties to the accident exchanged information.

July 16

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Darwin Dr on report of a dog attack and bite. Officer spoke with the caller, who explained her dog had been attacked by a neighbor's dog. Officer collected information and contacted the Franklin County Dog warden. Their dispatch took all the information and confirmed they would send an officer out and follow up with all parties involved.

July 17

Officers were dispatched to the area of Fairway Dr and Oakbourne Dr on a report of suspicious persons. Officers located the people in question and found they were looking for a vehicle. The male did not have a valid driver license. After clearing the call, Sharon Township Police informed Perry Township Police that they were waiting for a valid driver to come drive the vehicle.

July 17

Officer responded to a report of vandalism on Hole 4 of the Worthington Hills Country Club. Officer spoke with the caller and prepared a report.

July 18

Officer responded to a report of vandalism in the 1300 block of Clubview Blvd S. Officer spoke with the resident, who stated that the lug nuts had been removed from the rear tire of one their vehicles parked in the street.

July 19

Officers were dispatched to the 3000 block of Greenvale Dr on report of a plane crash. Officers spoke with the callers and witnesses, who advised that they heard a loud explosion and saw a red twin engine plane flying overhead and noticed the engine had shut off. They saw the plane lose altitude and go behind a line of trees. Multiple fire departments responded. Contact was made with the OSU airport, who stated that all their planes were accounted for, and that the airport was training new pilots on what to do if their engine fails in flight. That requires the shutting off of the engine while in flight. OSU confirmed that the plane in question had landed safely at their airport.

July 19

Officers were dispatched to an injury crash in the area of US-33 and Fishinger Rd. Officers discovered the at-fault driver did not have a valid driver's license and was cited for ACDA and no operator's license.

July 20

Officer was dispatched on a report of larceny. Officer spoke with the victim, who stated fraudulent transactions from their bank had occurred. Officer suggested the caller contact their bank to verify their debit card was deactivated and request a new one with a new number.

July 20

Officer was dispatched to the 6700 block of McVey Blvd on report of larceny. Officer spoke with the victim, who stated that firewood was stolen from their yard.

July 22

Officers were dispatched to the 6100 block of McVey Blvd on a vehicle crash. The driver went off the right side of the road while traveling southbound and crashed into the side of the garage of a home on McVey. The driver was transported to the hospital by Worthington Medics.

July 22

Officers took a report for a resident who stated that multiple checks had been cashed that they were not aware of and possible identity theft.

July 22

Officer observed a vehicle serving in the lane of travel. Officer initiated a traffic stop and discovered the driver did not have a valid ID, and the passenger/vehicle owner did not have a valid ID either. Officer issued a citation for driving in marked lanes and driving without a valid license with a mandatory court appearance. The vehicle was impounded.

July 23

Officer was dispatched to the intersection of US 33 and Fishinger Rd on a vehicle crash. A driver drove through the red light while traveling along Fishinger Rd and collided with another vehicle. Both parties were checked on scene by Upper Arlington Medics.

July 23

Officers were dispatched to the assist Worthington Police in the 400 block of Schrock Rd. Worthington advised their officers were with a stolen vehicle and juveniles were in the area smashing bottles. Perry officers assisted Worthington Police and were advised they could clear once Worthington was done interviewing the suspects.

July 24

Officer was dispatched on an alarm drop in the 800 block of Clubview Blvd N. Officer made contact with the occupant, who advised she was the homeowners' daughter and was housesitting. She accidentally set off the alarm while letting the dog outside. Officer cleared the scene.

July 24

Officers were dispatched to Brookside Elementary School on report of an individual riding a go-cart on the school grounds, tearing up the property. Officers made contact the individual and his parents. Officer explained that the go-cart could not be driven on public roads and would need written permission from the school to ride on school property. Officers observed no damage to the school grounds. Officers cleared and resumed patrol.

July 26

Officers were dispatched to area of US-33 and River Park Dr on report of a hit-skip accident. Officer spoke with the victim, who explained he had swerved to avoid a vehicle turning onto US-33 from Oxford Dr and hit a tree that had fallen from the previous days' storms. Neither vehicle made contact with each other. The driver of the other vehicle assisted the victim and attempted to move the log from beneath his vehicle. Upper Arlington Fire arrived to assist and remove the log. Once the scene was cleared, all parties were able to drive away.

July 28

While on routine patrol, officer responded to a Columbus Police request of an ongoing situation at the El Vaquero off of SR 161 and Sawmill Rd. Officer positioned himself at the entrance of Brookside on SR 161 in the event the suspect attempted to flee that way. Officer responded to Columbus Dispatch airing an "officer in trouble" call, and Officer informed Franklin County Dispatch that he would be in the area until other cars arrived. Officer arrived on scene and found CPD detaining the suspect. Officer stayed on scene as multiple CPD and Dublin PD cars arrived. Officer cleared the scene.

July 28

Officers responded to an injury accident on US 33 in the 4000 block of Riverside Dr. A vehicle failed to maintain control and struck a telephone pole. The driver was transported to the hospital.

July 29

Officer was dispatched on report of stolen property. Officer located a family with the same last name as on the recovered property, but all said it did not belong to them. Officer impounded the property for safekeeping.

July 30

Officers assisted Sharon Township with a non-injury crash at Home Acre Dr. Officer assisted the Sharon Township officer with the investigation and cleared the scene.

July 30

Officers responded to a non-injury accident on US 33 near Lakinhurst Dr. Three vehicles were involved in the incident. One driver was cited for failing to maintain assured clear distance ahead.

July 30

Officer initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle observed speeding. Officer discovered that the driver's temporary license had expired and that he did not have a valid driver's license. Officer had the vehicle impounded and cited the driver for speeding and driving without a valid license.

July 31

Officer assisted Sharon Township police with a wellness check on Forest Ridge Dr. After performing the check and requesting CPD to perform an additional check on a Columbus address, officers cleared the scene.
