Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of September 2022



Sept 1

While on patrol in the area of Arlington Pointe, officer found a black leather purse/backpack wedged beneath a vehicle. While recovering the property, officer was flagged down by a resident who advised that more property was scattered about the area. Officer made contact with the victim who advised that her bag was stolen the night before from her vehicle and that nothing was missing aside from her work ID. A neighbor also made contact with the officer and stated his vehicle was entered as well, but nothing was taken.

Sept 1

Officer observed a vehicle speeding on US-33 and initiated a traffic stop. Officer discovered the driver was a juvenile and did not have a valid driver's license. Officer issued a citation for speeding and for operating a motor vehicle without a valid license. The vehicle was impounded, and the juvenile transported to his home address.

Sept 3

Officers were dispatched to the 6000 block W Dublin Granville Rd for a mutual request by the Dublin Police Department on threats received over social media. Officers spoke with callers. It was determined that they were in Columbus Police's jurisdiction, and they were called to the scene. Officers cleared the scene after Columbus Police arrived and were informed of the situation.

Sept 3

Officers responded to a non-injury blocking accident on US-33 near Fairfax Dr. A driver failed to maintain assured clear distance ahead as traffic slowed down and rear ended the vehicle in front of them, which was then pushed into a third vehicle ahead of that one. The at-fault driver was issued a citation for ACDA.

Sept 3

Officer was dispatched to the 6000 block of Winston Ct on a resident being locked out of their home. Officer arrived on scene and spoke with the caller. Officer was able to unlock the door to the home for the resident.

Sept 3

Officers were dispatched to a domestic complaint in the 100 block of Rosslyn Ave on a mutual aid request with Sharon Township. After speaking with the caller, Sharon Township Officer stated that they were going to document the interaction in a report and informed Perry Township Officers that they could clear the scene.

Sept 4

While returning to police headquarters, officer was flagged down by a civilian. The individual stated she was being followed while trying to make an Uber Eats delivery. Individual requested that the Officer escort her. While making the delivery, Officer observed a silver vehicle

attempting to follow them before noticing the Police cruiser and changing direction. After the delivery was completed and the individual stated they would be fine, Officer cleared.

Sept 7

Officer was dispatched on mutual aid to Sharon Township on a three car non-injury crash with vehicles blocking the roadway. Officer assisted Sharon Officers by collecting exchange information for all involved vehicles. Officer then cleared the scene and resumed patrol.

Sept 7

Officers were dispatched to the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Run Rd on an injury crash with one person trapped. As officers were collecting information for the report, it was discovered the at-fault driver had an expired driver's license. The at-fault driver was cited for having no valid license and failing to yield when turning left.

Sept 7

As officers were finishing up a crash report at the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Run Rd, they heard a loud crash and observed three vehicles involved in an accident. After checking on the drivers, it was discovered that two parties were injured. Officers requested medics respond to the scene. It was discovered that the at-fault driver was a juvenile with no valid license. The at-fault driver was cited for no valid license and failure to yield when turning left.

Sept 7

Officers were dispatched to the 3000 block of Bethel Rd after an off-duty CPD officer reported a non-injury crash at the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Run Rd. Officers gathered information for the report and determined that the at-fault driver did not have a valid driver's license. The at-fault driver was cited for no driver's license and a marked lanes violation.

Sept 8

Officer was conducting a routine business check and observed a suspicious individual. Officer asked the individual to identify themselves and discovered that they had three outstanding warrants through the City of Columbus. The individual was placed under arrest and transported to Perry Township Police Headquarters, which was the predetermined location for the poisoner relay with CPD.

Sept 8

Officer was approached by an employee of the Worthington Hills Country Club and informed that he had found a bicycle on the golf course and wanted to turn the bike over to the police. The bicycle was impounded for safekeeping.

Sept 9

Officer was dispatched to the Perry Township Police Headquarters on a harassment call. Officer assisted the parent of the victim with creating a report and told them that they would be advised by Perry Township Detective.

Sept 10

Officers were dispatched on a non-injury crash at the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Run Rd. Officer took information for a report and verified that both parties exchanged information.

Sept 10

Officers were dispatched to assist the Ohio State Highway Patrol on I-270 just west of US-23 on an injury accident. Officers provided traffic control while Worthington Medic worked on scene.

The responding OSP trooper performed sobriety tests on the at-fault driver and determined that he was too impaired to operate a motor vehicle and placed under arrest. Officer and Trooper conducted a BAC test at Perry Township Headquarters.

Sept 11

Officers were dispatched to the Brookside Country Club on an alarm drop. On scene, officers found an open door on the west side of the building. After checking the interior and securing the scene, officers left an alarm notice on the side door.

Sept 12

Officers responded to a non-injury accident in the 800 block of Clubview Blvd N. The driver fell asleep at the wheel and collided with a kids' library book holder. The driver was cited for failure to control.

Sept 13

Officers were dispatched to a non-injury crash at the intersection of SR-161 and Linworth Rd. One vehicle rear ended another at a red light. Both parties stated they did not have injuries and did not require medical attention.

Sept 14

Officer was dispatched to the area of Henderson Rd near Charlbury Dr on report of a non-injury accident. A vehicle traveling east on Henderson collided with a deer after it ran out in front of the vehicle.

Sept 17

Officers responded to an injury accident on US-33 near Chateau Circle. One vehicle was attempting to turn left into Griggs Reservoir and failed to yield and was struck by another vehicle traveling southbound on US-33. All parties were treated on scene by Upper Arlington Medics 71 & 72. The at-fault driver was cited for failure to yield.

Sept 17

Officer assisted Sharon Township on a mutual aid request in performing a blood alcohol breath test on a suspected intoxicated individual out of a traffic stop. The test was performed at the Perry Township Police Headquarters.

Sept 18

Officers were dispatched on report of a male possibly wanting to harm himself. Officers made contact with the individual and determined that there was no threat and that there was potential a third party had sent a false alarm.

Sept 19

Officers responded to a hit-skip accident on SR-161 at McVey Blvd. The collision occurred in stop-and-go traffic, eastbound on SR-161. The driver called in to report the accident after discovering damage on the rear of their vehicle upon returning home.

Sept 20

Officers responded to a non-injury accident at the intersection of US-33 and Hayden Run Rd. The collision occurred in the intersection; however, officers were not able to determine the at-fault party due to conflicting statements.

Sept 20

While on patrol on Sawmill Rd at I-270, officer observed two vehicles stopped at the green light. One vehicle left the scene, while the driver of the other vehicle fled on foot. Officer remained with the passenger and verified the vehicle was stolen. Officer communicated information to another Officer, who was able to locate the fleeing suspect and pursued them on foot. Officer successfully arrested the suspect. Both suspects were slated at the Franklin County Sheriff's Office.

Sept 22

Officer was dispatched to the 8000 block of Blind Brook Ct to make contact with a resident concerning a vendor that was creating issues for the residents. Officers made contact with all parties involved and advised the vendor not to service the property any further.

Sept 24

While on patrol near the Brookside Country Club, Officer was flagged down and informed that there was a report of an intoxicated employee. The employee had been seen in the parking lot barefoot with blood on their left elbow and reportedly had the smell of alcohol on or about their person. They left prior to the Officer's arrival. Via a phone call, the employee told their manager that they were not under the influence and would return to work. Upon agreeing to take a test to determine sobriety, the manager stated that he would determine if she appeared to be under the influence and would call the Officer if there was an issue.

Sept 25

Officer was dispatched to the 900 block of Circle on the Green on report of a stolen or abandoned bicycle. Officer made contact with the owner of the residence the bike was found on and explained it had been there for two days. The bike was retrieved and transported to the police department headquarters for safekeeping.

Sept 26

Officers were dispatched to assist Worthington Fire with an active fire at the 1600 block of Shelly Ct. Upon arrival, all occupants were successfully evacuated. Officers provided crowd control for Worthington Fire as they worked to put out the fire. They were able to extinguish the fire before it could spread to the rest of the home. Officers interviewed the homeowner, took photos of the damage, and cleared the scene without incident.

Sept 27

Officers were dispatched to SR-161 near Linworth Rd on report of an injury accident. One driver failed to yield when turning left into a driveway causing another vehicle to hit it. Both parties were treated and released on scene by Worthington Medics 101 and 102. The at-fault driver was cited for failure to yield on left turn.

Sept 28

Officers were dispatched to the 3500 block of Henderson Rd on report of an injured deer. Upon arrival, officers located a badly injured fawn. Officers dispatched the deer with a single slug. The Road Department was notified of the need for disposal of the carcass.

Sept 29

Officer was dispatched to a non-injury accident on US-33 south of Hayden Rd. One driver failed to maintain assured clear distance ahead and rear ended the vehicle in front of them as they slowed to turn. The at-fault driver was issued a citation for ACDA.

Sept 29

Officers were dispatched to a non-injury accident on SR-161 approaching Linworth Rd. One vehicle failed to maintain assured clear distance ahead and rear ended another vehicle in slowing traffic.

Sept 29

Officers responded to a multi-vehicle crash on US-33 near Palatas PI. One vehicle failed to maintain assured clear distance ahead and rear ended the vehicle in front of them. Said vehicle was then pushed into a third vehicle from the force of the impact. Washington Medic 92 and Columbus Medic 11 treated parties on scene. The at-fault driver was issued a citation for ACDA.

Sept 29

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Shore Line Ln on report of a suspicious person. Dispatch advised that the caller observed three males appearing to take packages from the clubhouse. Officers checked the clubhouse entrances and found no signs of forced entry. Officers checked the interior of the building and found no evidence that any packages were taken without consent. Officers cleared the scene without incident.

Sept 29

Officers were dispatched to the 1400 block of Candlewood Dr to provide traffic control for the fire department while they worked on a house fire.

Sept 30

Officer was dispatched to the 2500 block of Shoreline Ln on a report of theft. Officer took information about the theft from the property manager. Packages were removed from the clubhouse.

Sept 30

Officer was requested per mutual aid by Sharon Township on a lock out. Officer assisted Sharon Township Officer with regaining access to their police cruiser after an accidental lockout.

Sept 30

Officers were dispatched to assist Sharon Township with an injury accident involving a single motorcycle. Once on scene, both officers assisted by shutting down areas of the roadway. Once they were able to, they opened the roadway and cleared the scene.
