Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of July



July 1

Officer was dispatched to assist Sharon Township Police with a stolen vehicle found abandoned on SR-315 south of I-270. Officer arrived to assist with possible containment of suspect(s). It was determined that the unknown suspect(s) had fled the area, leaving the car abandoned. Officer remained on scene to provide additional emergency lighting along the roadway while the Sharon Officer conducted his investigation.

July 2

Officers were dispatched on a possible domestic dispute. Officer interviewed both parties. Officers found there was no probable cause to effect an arrest.

July 2

Officer was dispatched to the Speedway on SR-161 on a suspicious person call. Officer spoke with the caller, who stated he called the police after dealing with a customer mistreating an employee and shoved him. Officer advised the caller to call the police if the parties returned and to have the motorcycle left behind towed.

July 3

Officer was dispatched on a domestic violence report. Two individuals stated they were drinking and got into a physical altercation.

July 4

Officers responded to an incident on Clubview Blvd S at night. One driver was backing out of their driveway as a golf cart was traveling east on Clubview Blvd S. The vehicle backed in front the golf cart, which the driver could not see due to decorations obstructing the golf cart's headlight. The golf cart struck the vehicle, and the driver was ejected. All parties exchanged information.

July 6

Officers responded on mutual aid to a report that an officer had been shot on I-70 at Mound St. Officers assisted in setting a perimeter of the area with surrounding police agencies. Officers helped secure the scene as OSHP SWAT arrived. Officers were informed that they could clear while Columbus and Franklin County would check the surrounding areas.

July 6

While on routine patrol Arlington Pointe, an Officer was approached by an individual who asked for assistance in locating her intoxicated boyfriend. She searched the area for him after he left their apartment and found his cellphone on a concrete pad near the Scioto River. Officer located the man clinging on to a tree branch in the river, standing upright. He was not in a panic and unharmed.

July 7

Officers were dispatched on a dispute between a father and a son. The father called the police to deescalate the situation. Officers helped calm down the son. The father agreed to allow his son to stay with him so long as he calmed down, which he agreed to.

July 7

Officers were dispatched to an injury accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Fishinger Rd. Officer met with a motorcyclist, who stated that she took a wide left turn onto Fishinger Rd from Riverside Dr and rubbed the curb with her front tire, causing her to leave the bike and fall over the guardrail. The driver was evaluated by UA Medic 71 and released with no injuries.

July 8

Officer was dispatched to the 1300 block of Hickory Ridge Ln on a vandalism complaint. Officer met with the complainant, who advised that sometime overnight an unknown person cut the back two tires on their vehicle which was parked in the driveway.

July 9

Officer assisted Sharon Township Police on mutual aid with a drunk individual sleeping in his vehicle. Officers remained on scene with the individual until he could be picked up by a sober party.

July 9

Officer responded to a dump truck blocking the curb lane on Riverside Dr south near Fishinger Rd. Upon arrival she observed a white Ford 350 with an open hood and a hole where the ignition used to be located with no readable VIN. The license plate was expired and assigned to a GMC. The vehicle impounded by Capital Towing.

July 10

While on routine patrol in the Skyline area, officer observed destroyed mailboxes underneath the front bumper of a vehicle. The driver of the vehicle was observed to be passed out with regurgitation covering his body. As the properties were in the City of Columbus, Officer notified Dispatch requesting CPD to respond. Officer remained on scene to assist City of Columbus.

July 10

Officer was called to the Brookside Country Club on report of vandalism. Officer met with the Director of Grounds, who told the Officer that sometime overnight unknown suspect(s) drove onto the golf course from Greenvale Dr and around the green on hole number 12, snapping the flag pin and causing tire depressions on the green.

July 10

Officer responded to a report of a theft at the Brookside Country Club. The general Manager stated that an unknown individual cut the screen on the front of the building. Once inside, they stole beer, seltzer, and Gatorade from the fridge.

July 11

Officers were dispatched to the Worthington Hills Country Club on report of an intoxicated male passed out by the pool. Upon arrival, Officers were advised that the male had fallen into the pool and lifeguards were in the water. Once out of the water, medics checked his vitals and both medics and officers observed indications of consumption of alcoholic beverages. After discussing the situation with witnesses, and learning that the male had been asked the previous

day to leave the pool, the male was placed under arrest for disorderly conduct intoxicated and annoyance.

July 11

Officers responded to an accident on US-33 near Lane Rd. A vehicle failed to slow down for a car stopped in front of them at the red light and struck the rear left bumper. No injuries were reported. The at-fault driver was cited for ACDA.

July 12

Officers responded to a non-injury accident on Henderson Rd. A vehicle was stopped for traffic. The at-fault driver failed to notice the other vehicle and rear-ended the other vehicle. All involved parties were not injured. The at-fault driver was cited for ACDA.

July 12

Officers responded to a non-injury accident involving three vehicles at the intersection of US-33 and Cranston Dr. Unit 3 began turning right at a red light from Cranston. Unit 2 swerved to avoid unit 3 and struck the rear of unit 1. Unit 3 was cited for failure to yield.

July 13

Officers were patrolling Cleveland Ave as part of Operation Unity. Officers identified an individual loitering to solicit for prostitution. The individual was issued a summons into Franklin County Municipal Court.

July 13

Officers were working traffic enforcement on Cleveland Ave as part of Operation Unity. Officers initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle with an expired temporary tag. Officers discovered the driver had no valid license and had no valid ID of any kind from the United States. The driver was cited for operating a motor vehicle without a license and the vehicle was impounded.

July 13

While working Operation Unity in Clinton Township, officers witnessed a vehicle operating with no license plate. Officers initiated a traffic stop. The driver provided the temporary tag which was folded and not readily visible. Officers discovered the driver had a suspended license. The driver was cited for driving without a valid license.

July 13

While working Operation Unity in Clinton Township, FCSO requested a marked vehicle to assist with a traffic stop. A traffic stop was initiated. The vehicle registration had expired, and the driver had a suspended license. The driver was cited.

July 13

Officer was dispatched to the Brookside Country Club on report of a theft. The manager advised that there was a break in at their outside food and beverage shop. Officer was provided a list of items which were taken.

July 13

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Henderson Rd. Unit 2 attempted to make a left turn onto Henderson Rd. Unit 1 struck the passenger side of the vehicle. The driver of unit 2 was transported to the hospital. Unit 2 was cited for failure to yield when turning left.

July 13

Officers were working traffic enforcement on Cleveland Ave as part of Operation Unity. Officer witnessed a vehicle turn left on a red light. The driver was discovered to have no valid license. The driver was cited for operating a motor vehicle without a valid license.

July 13

Officers were working traffic enforcement on Cleveland Ave as part of Operation Unity. Officers initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle with no visible registration tag. Officers discovered the vehicle operator had no valid license. The driver was cited for operating a motor vehicle without a valid license.

July 14

While on patrol, officer observed two vehicles traveling at a high rate of speed. Officer pulled alongside the lead vehicle, which quickly fled the scene. Officers collaborated with FCSO and CPD and were able to locate one of the vehicles, abandoned but still running. The vehicle was likely stolen, and officers asked CPD to contact the owner of the vehicle.

July 14

Officer was dispatched to the 800 block of Blind Brook Dr on a suspicious person. The individual had left by the time of the officer's arrival. The caller told the officer that they confronted a woman opening their neighbor's mailbox. When confronted, the woman claimed they lived there. When told that she did not, she left the scene in her car.

July 14

Officers responded to the 3000 block of Greenvale Dr on a stolen vehicle. The victim stated that her vehicle was stolen from her driveway. The stolen vehicle was later recovered by Bellefontaine PD. The vehicle may have been used for a burglary.

July 14

Officers responded to a non-injury accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Zollinger Rd. Unit 2 was traveling south on Riverside Dr. Unit 1 was traveling west on Zollinger Rd and attempted a left-hand turn at the stop sign. Unit 1 failed to notice Unit 2 and struck the rear left of the vehicle. The at-fault driver was cited for failing to yield on left turn.

July 14

Officers responded to Arlington Pointe apartments on report of lost property. The complainant stated that his son's phone had been lost and located it via find my iPhone at the apartments. Officers met with the individual who had found the phone and it was turned over to the complainant without issue.

July 14

Officers responded to assist Worthington PD in locating a high-risk kidnapping suspect. Officers assisted in searching for the suspect's vehicle but were not able to locate it.

July 15

Officers responded to an injury accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Zollinger Rd. Unit 2 failed to yield while turning left onto Riverside from Zollinger and was struck by unit 1. The driver of unit 2 was transported to the hospital.

July 17

Officers came upon a non-injury crash at the intersection of Sawmill Rd and Billingsley in Columbus' jurisdiction. CPD advised they were not responding to non-injury crashes. Officer had both parties exchange information and file a report with CPD online.

July 17

Officers escorted Clinton Township Detective to the 8000 block of Evangeline Dr to assist with a search of a home.

July 18

Officers were dispatched on an alarm at the Brookside Country Club treehouse. Upon arrival, officers found the rear entry door of the treehouse to have been forcibly opened. Nothing inside appeared to be disrupted or broken. Officers made contact with country club staff to have the door resecured as best as possible.

July 18

While on patrol, officer observed a male wearing a polo and holding a clipboard going door-to-door in the area. The individual stated he was going door-to-door to provide homeowners with information on solar panels for Aptive Solar Company. Officer provided contact information for Perry Township in order to obtain a permit for solicitation and advised him to leave the area.

July 18

Columbus Police located a black van with a rear window busted in their jurisdiction. CPD requested Perry Officers make contact with the registered owner to determine if the vehicle was stolen. Officer went to the registered owner's address in Worthington Hills and learned that the registered owner of the vehicle is deceased. Officer passed along the information to CPD.

July 19

Officer was advised that there was an incident occurring at Sawmill Rd and I-270. Officer located the suspect in the westbound lanes of I-270 and observed several cruisers stopped in the eastbound lanes. Officer pursued the suspect in the westbound lanes. The suspect slipped and fell down in the grass, at which time the officer exited his cruiser and handcuffed the suspect. The suspect was turned over to the Dublin Police Department.

July 19

Officers responded to an injury accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Lane Rd. Unit 3 was southbound on Riverside Dr and failed to slow in time for traffic, striking the rear of Unit 2 with enough force to push it into Unit 1. The driver of Unit 3 was checked for chest pains by Upper Arlington medics. The at-fault driver was issued a citation for ACDA and driving under license suspension.

July 20

Officers responded to a single car accident at the intersection of Hayden Run Rd and Riverside Dr. The driver left the scene prior to the police arriving. A witness to the accident saw the driver leave with a dog. An officer later made contact with the driver at their home. The driver was issued a citation for leaving the scene of an accident and for failure to control.

July 21

Officer observed a vehicle traveling very slowly with hazard lights flashing on Riverside Dr near Ravello. The vehicle eventually came to a stop. Officer made contact with the driver, who admitted that he should not be driving. Officer observed an open can of beer in the front center

arm rest. The man admitted to not having a United States driver's license and presented a Guatemalan Identification card. Officer cited the individual with a mandatory court appearance.

July 21

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Henderson Rd and Riverside Dr. Unit 3 attempted to pull out of a driveway parallel to Henderson Rd and failed to yield. Unit 3 struck Unit 1, a southbound vehicle on Riverside Dr, striking a third vehicle, Unit 2, which was northbound. No parties were injured. The driver of Unit 3 was cited for failure to yield.

July 22

Officers were dispatched on mutual aid to Olentangy River Rd on a female throwing objects at her husband. Officers found the scene calm upon arrival, then turned it over to Sharon Township PD.

July 23

Officers were dispatched to the area of Riverside Dr and Fishinger Rd on report of a vehicle that struck the guardrail located at the southwest side of the intersection. Dispatched advised that after striking the guardrail the vehicle fled the scene. Officers followed skid marks into the Griggs Reservoir and found the vehicle and driver. Officers observed the driver to have bloodshot and glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an inability to maintain his balance. Officers could detect the odor of an alcoholic beverage. After intoxication tests, the driver was cited for failure to maintain reasonable control and operating a vehicle while intoxicated.

July 23

Officers responded to a noise complaint in Worthington Hills. Officer recognized the home address as a location to which he had responded to before. Officer made contact with the resident who apologized and turned the volume down.

July 24

Officer responded to report of person(s) banging on the front door of a resident with force. Unknown suspect(s) returned moments later, honking a horn on the street in front of the complainant's house. Witnesses could not describe the occupants of the vehicle in question. Officer conducted a high-visibility patrol of Worthington Hills for crime prevention.

July 24

Officers responded to a single car accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Hayden Run Rd. The vehicle was westbound on Hayden Run Rd. The driver failed to control the vehicle through the construction zone at the bridge, striking several barriers in the intersection. The driver was cited for failure to control.

July 25

Officers responded to a multi-car accident on Riverside Dr at the intersection with McCoy Rd. Unit 3 failed to maintain control while turning left from McCoy Rd onto Riverside Dr, striking the side of two other vehicles. The at-fault driver was cited for failure to maintain control.

July 26

Officers responded to a non-injury accident at the intersection of Hayden Run Rd and Riverside Dr. Two vehicles traveling in opposite directions on Riverside Dr collided while one attempted to turn. No citations were issued due to conflicting statements.

July 26

Officer was dispatched on a theft report. The complainant stated that money was taken from their bank account without prior authorization.

July 26

Officers responded to a two car accident on Riverside Dr south of Fishinger Rd. Unit 1 was slowing/stopping for traffic. Unit 2 failed to stop and rear-ended unit 1. The at-fault driver was issued a citation for failure to maintain assured clear distance ahead.

July 27

Officers were dispatched to Henderson Heights on a dispute between neighbors. The complainant stated that her neighbor was being loud and breaking what sounded like glass. She stated she went over to complain about the noise and he grabbed a bat and told her to get off her property. Officers attempted to make contact with the neighbor but were unsuccessful. Officers observed a large amount of beer cans and excess trash. Officers advised the complainant to call the police in the future due to the risks in dealing with an intoxicated individual.

July 28

Officer was dispatched to the Brookside Country Club on a report of vandalism. The general manager stated that an unknown vehicle drove on the 14th and 18th green, damaging a tee box and a bunker.

July 28

Officer responded to an accident on Riverside Dr north of Fishinger Rd. Unit 1 was traveling in the right lane behind unit 2 and failed to notice unit 2. Unit 1 struck the rear right side of unit 2. Unit 1 left the scene without stopping.

July 29

Officers responded to a civil complaint in Brookside Estates. An AT&T contractor reportedly ran a line through a residents' yard without consulting the resident first rather than through the easement.

July 30

Officer was dispatched to the area of Riverside Dr and Courtyard Landing on a pedestrian on the highway. On arrival, officer observed the pedestrian on the southbound shoulder. Officer made contact with the individual who acknowledged he had consumed alcoholic beverages and had been in a verbal argument with his wife. The individual stated he was going to a friend's but indicated that the price from a rideshare app would be too expensive. Officer suggested to check the fares from Tuttle Mall, which he found affordable.
