Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of September 2023



Sept 1

Officers were dispatched to Arlington Pointe on an unwanted person. The caller stated that he did not want his mother inside his condo. He stated that they were at odds. The mother was informed that she was no longer welcomed by her son and left the condo without incident.

Sept 1

Officers responded to a non-injury accident on US-33 near Hayden Run Rd. Units 1 and 2 were southbound on Riverside Dr. Unit 2 attempted to merge into the right turn lane and side swiped the rear driver side of Unit 1. The at-fault driver was issued a citation for unsafe lane change.

Sept 1

Officer was dispatched to the Worthington Hills Country Club on two highly intoxicated individuals trying to leave the club. While officers were enroute, a Sharon Township Officer arrived on scene and pulled the driver out of their car. The vehicle was blocked by country club employees. Officers arrived on scene and removed the passenger from the vehicle. The driver's wife arrived to pick him up. Worthington Medic 101 arrived to check on the passenger as he was vomiting and passed out. Medic 101 stated his vitals were good. The passenger's wife was contacted and arrived to take him home.

Sept 2

Officers were dispatched on a male passed out on the ground behind the Fairfield Inn Suites. Officers found the individual who stated that he had drank too much alcohol and fell. The individual was assessed by Worthington Medics and cleared to return to his hotel room.

Sept 3

Officers responded to a hit-skip on Riverside Dr approaching Squires Ridge Dr. Unit 1 was traveling northbound and went left of center, striking southbound Unit 2, breaking the driver side mirror. The mirror then struck two vehicles behind Unit 2. Unit 1 fled the scene. Officers were unable to locate Unit 1. No injuries were reported.

Sept 4

Officers were dispatched to the 2000 block of Merbrook Rd on a noise complaint. Officers made contact with the homeowner who advised that he would turn his music down.

Sept 5

While working a school-sponsored 5K run event in Worthington Hills, an individual in a truck with a TSA uniform drove past the marked cars that were parked on the roadway. Officer stopped him and explained the road was closed and that he would need to turn around. He grabbed his retractable TSA D badge and discourteously stated he was a federal DHS employee and could go wherever he wanted. Officer reiterated the road was closed by barricades. The man was upset but did eventually comply. The incident was turned over to the Detective Bureau. The detective made contact with the individual and his supervisor at his place

of work. The detective informed him that he was not law enforcement and should not present himself as such. The detective advised that he interferes with officers in the performance of their duties again that he would be arrested and charged.

Sept 6

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Dublin Granville Rd and Linworth Rd. Unit 2 struck the right rear of Unit 1 from behind. No injuries were reported, and no citations were issued due to conflicting statements.

Sept 6

Officer was dispatched to Arlington Pointe on report of communications harassment. Officers made contact with the harassing individual and ordered them to cease and desist all communication.

Sept 6

Officers were notified of a suspicious person in the 900 block of Bethel Rd. The suspect made strange remarks and questions to the owner of the gun store there. After making the strange remarks the suspect returned to their vehicle and left the scene.

Sept 7

Officers responded to a non-injury accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Hayden Run Rd. Unit 1 failed to yield when turning left and was struck by southbound Unit 2. Unit 1 was cited for failure to yield.

Sept 7

Officer was dispatched on report of a burglary that occurred at the Arlington Pointe clubhouse. An employee stated that when he arrived for work, he saw that the officer door inside the clubhouse had been forced open. He immediately contacted the property manager and police. No property was reported stolen.

Sept 7

While on patrol on Riverside Dr, officer observed a vehicle traveling at 85 mph in a 45-mph zone. Officer initiated a pursuit as the vehicle increased speed to evade. The vehicle was last seen entering SR-315 south from Bethel Rd. The vehicle was later recovered by Franklin Township PD.

Sept 7

Officers responded to a report of suspicious activity in the area of Arlington Pointe. Police interviewed a caller, who stated she observed suspicious men with ski masks on outside the apartments. She yelled at them, and they shouted profanities back before getting in their vehicles and fleeing the scene.

Sept 10

Officers were dispatched to the 2000 block of Billingsley Rd on an unwanted male on the property.

Sept 11

While monitoring traffic on Dublin Granville Rd, officer observed a speeding vehicle traveling eastbound. Officer initiated a traffic stop and discovered the driver did not have a valid license. Officer cited the driver for speeding and driving without a license. The vehicle was impounded.

Sept 11

Officer responded to a vehicle crash at the intersection of Dublin Granville Rd and Fiesta Dr. The driver lost control of the vehicle and it veered of the right side of the west bound lane into vegetation and an AEP utility pole. The driver was cited for failure to control and for driving without a valid license.

Sept 11

Officers responded to a vehicle accident at the intersection of Snouffer Rd and Bride Water Rd. The at-fault driver was making a right turn onto Bride Water when they struck a street sign at the intersection. The driver was cited for failure to control.

Sept 12

Officer was dispatched to assist Sharon Township PD on a traffic detail while they investigated a rollover crash on SR-315 south.

Sept 15

Officers were dispatched on report of a theft in the 2000 block of Billingsley Rd. Officers learned that a storage unit had been broken into.

Sept 15

While on routine patrol, officer was waved down by witnesses who stated they observed a vehicle driving erratically on SR-315. Officer then located the vehicle, which pulled into a nearby parking lot. Officer and a Sharon Twp officer secured the vehicle after observing the driver to be asleep. There was a strong odor of alcohol coming from the vehicle. Officers turned the scene over to Columbus PD as it was in their jurisdiction.

Sept 16

Officers were dispatched to the area of SR-161 at Olentangy River Rd to assist Sharon Twp PD with a non-injury, blocking crash.

Sept 18

Officers responded to a non-injury crash at the intersection of US-33 and Fishinger Rd. Unit #2 made a left-hand turn from Fishinger Rd to US-33. Unit 1 was proceeding straight with a yellow light and struck Unit 2. Unit 2 was cited for failure to yield on a left turn.

Sept 18

Officer was dispatched to take information from a caller regarding an accident that had occurred a few days prior at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Hayden Run Rd.

Sept 19

Officer was dispatched to speak with a caller about her mailbox being damaged/destroyed.

Sept 19

Officers responded to a rollover crash at the intersection of Fiestra Dr and Dublin-Granville Rd. A witness stated that the vehicle lost control, hit the curb, then flipped over on the side of the road. The driver was taken to the hospital by Worthington Medic 101 in stable condition.

Sept 20

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr near Arlington Pointe. Unit 2 failed to come to a complete stop before striking the rear of Unit 1. The at-fault driver was cited for failure to maintain assured clear distance ahead.

Sept 20

Officers responded to an accident near the intersection of Linworth Rd and Dublin Granville Rd. Unit #2 made a left turn onto Linworth Rd without yielding and was struck by Unit 1. The at-fault driver was not issued a citation due to an accident occurring in the City of Columbus's jurisdiction.

Sept 20

Officers responded to an injury accident on Riverside Dr near Arlington Pointe. An emergency was present with beacons activated near the northbound lanes. Vehicles merged to give caution to the emergency vehicle. Unit 2 was traveling at a distance too close to unit 1 and was unable to slow down before striking the rear of Unit 1.

Sept 20

Officers were dispatched to Brookside Elementary School on report of two juveniles riding mini bikes and four-wheelers in the park. Officers were able to make contact with the juveniles and informed them that they could not be riding the bikes on roadways or in the school playground. Officers were able to contact the juveniles' parents, who arrived a short time later and picked them both up.

Sept 21

Officer was dispatched to a business in the 900 block of Bethel Rd on report of a suspicious person causing a disturbance. Officer made contact with the individual and issued them a warning for criminal trespassing, advising them that they were not to return to the business.

Sept 23

Officer was dispatched to the 8000 block of Copperfield Dr on report of an elderly female that seemed confused and didn't know where she was. Officer located the woman and had medics arrive on scene to assist her.

Sept 23

Officer was dispatched to the 6000 block on a report of theft. The victim's bank required a police report.

Sept 24

Officers received an anonymous complaint regarding a potentially impaired motorist struggling to park his vehicle and disturbing the peace by repeatedly honking his horn.

Sept 25

Officers responded to a non-injury crash at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Hayden Run Rd. Unit 1 failed to notice Unit 2 stop for traffic and struck the rear of Unit 2.

Sept 25

Officers responded to a single car accident on Henderson Rd. The driver stated she felt she was going to black out and swerved off the roadway. The driver was transported to the hospital. No alcohol or drugs were detected.

Sept 25

While on patrol, officer observed a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed on SR-161. Radar clocked the vehicle going 65 MPH in a 35 MPH zone. Officer initiated a pursuit and the vehicle increased speed. Officer aired a description of the vehicle over the radio and marked their location. Officer maintained pursuit but disengaged once the vehicle reached SR-315.

Sept 26

Officer was dispatched the area of Darwin Dr on an identity theft complaint. Officer made a report for the caller.

Sept 27

Officers responded to a non-injury accident on US-33 at Chateau Circle. Unit 2 was approaching Chateau Circle and did not see Unit 1 stopped ahead of them and struck the rear of Unit 1. Unit 2 was cited for ACDA.

Sept 27

Officer was dispatched to police headquarters on a theft complaint. Officer prepared a report for the individual.

Sept 27

Officer was dispatched to the 6000 block of McVey Blvd about a complaint.

Sept 27

Officer was dispatched on a standby for property exchange. Officer stood by while a man retrieved his property from the residence per a court order.

Sept 29

Officers were dispatched on a non-injury crash that occurred on SR-161 and Linworth Rd. It was determined that the crash occurred on private property in the City of Columbus.

Sept 30

Officer conducted a traffic stop on Linworth Rd after observing an expired license plate on a vehicle. The driver admitted to having no valid license. Officer learned that he had a suspension issued by the Ohio BMV. The vehicle was impounded, and the driver was cited with a mandatory court appearance.
