Chief Code Enforcement Officers' Report

The Board of Trustees, Board of Zoning Appeals, Zoning Commission and Zoning Officers have revised the zoning text and map. The Board approved zoning code is now accessible via our website at www.perrytwp.org by clicking on the Zoning tab and

link: Zoning Resolution.

The spotlight for this quarter is on zoning code changes related to the storage of **Boats, Recreational Vehicles and Utility Trailers (Section 531.09)**. Due in large part to concern expressed by residents, vehicles of this type can no longer be parked in the open on residential lots or streets for more than 72 hours.

If you have already received zoning approval to store this type of vehicle on a side or rear yard location prior to November 17, 2008, you will not be required to relocate it. We ask all residents in this situation to complete the enclosed **Property Owner Certification Form** and return it to the Zoning Department by January 31, 2009. We will then take a picture of your vehicle which will be attached to the completed form. This will verify the non-conforming use until such time the vehicle is removed from the property.


Chief of Police Report

Superintendent's Report

It is hard to believe; but, welcome to 2009!

Last year was a very busy and productive time for the Road Department. We began with 22 snow & ice events in which we salted and/or plowed the roads. We continued with crack sealing several streets throughout the township.

The spring brush chipping yielded 19 box loads of chips (over 250 cubic yards) and we repaired numerous storm sewer, tile and catch basins. As we neared the end of the year, a large asphalt repair project on Clubview Blvd. was also completed successfully.

Following the wind storm of September 14th, we picked up over 2,500 cubic yards of debris. That's **10 times** what we collected during the spring cleanup! At the time of this submission, we had completed the fall leaf collection and picked up over 3,100 cubic yards of leaves.

We are now preparing for another snow season. Rest assured that Perry Township has secured a contract for the salt supply and we will continue to provide the snow removal service you are accustomed to. As in years past, we ask that you move your cars from the roadway during snow events so that we can safely and efficiently clear the roads.
