Police Reports and Activity in Perry Township
Month of June 2024



June 1

Officers were dispatched to a possible injury accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Fishinger Rd. It was determined that this was a single vehicle incident involving a motorcycle. Officers spoke with the driver of the motorcycle, who stated that he was traveling northbound when a vehicle pulled in front of him causing to brake. He stated that once he began to brake, he felt them lock up causing him to fall off his motorcycle. The driver was treated on scene for minor scrapes by UAFD Medic #71.

June 2

Officers responded to a non-injury accident on SR-161 at the intersection with McVey Blvd. Unit 2 was traveling eastbound on SR-161 and struck the rear of Unit 1. The driver of unit 2 was cited for ACDA.

June 2

Officer was observing traffic in the Brookside Estates neighborhood. Officer observed a vehicle fail to stop at the stop sign at McVey and Millbrae. Officer initiated a traffic stop. Officer discovered that the driver did not have a valid driver's license or Ohio ID, nor proof of insurance. Officer cited the driver for no operator's license and failing to obey a traffic control device. The vehicle was impounded.

June 2

Officer observed a black sedan traveling northbound on Riverside Dr. Officer noticed that the vehicle registration sticker had expired in October of 2023. Officer initiated a traffic stop and made contact with the driver. Officer determined that the driver's license had expired in April 2023. The driver was cited for failure to register a motor vehicle and operating with a license expired greater than six months.

June 3

Officers were dispatched to Worthington Hills on report of an overdose. Worthington Medic 101 arrived shortly after and immediately transported the victim to the hospital in stable condition.

June 3

Officer was dispatched to Snouffer and Snouffer Pl on a non-injury crash. A 14-year old was riding on an electric dirt bike and failed to maintain assured clear distance ahead, striking another vehicle. The driver of the dirt bike was cited for ACDA, no driver's license, and failure to register.

June 4

While conducting a business check on Snouffer Rd, Officer heard through the scanner that Dublin Police was receiving a call for an active theft of an ATM on Sawmill Rd. Due to his proximity, Officer decided to head towards the dispatched location to see if he could locate the truck leaving the scene. Officer arrived on scene and assisted in Dublin PD in securing the scene and blocking the entrances. Officer secured the suspects' vehicle until the first suspect

was secured and the second suspect was located. Officer helped provide cover with Columbus Police while Dublin conducted a felony arrest.

June 5

Officers responded to a hit-skip accident on W Dublin-Granville Rd at the intersection with Linworth Rd. Unit 2 failed to maintain stopping distance and struck unit 1 in the rear. Unit 2 left the scene of the accident without giving their information to unit 1. Unit 1 was able to take a picture of the plate, but it was only partially readable.

June 6

While on patrol in the area of Brookside Estates, Officer observed a vehicle driving south on McVey Blvd. There was a temporary tag in the window that was not readable where it was placed. Officer initiated a traffic stop and discovered that the driver did not have a driver's license or insurance. The driver was cited for display of plates and driving without a license. The vehicle was impounded.

June 6

Officers responded to a non-injury accident on Riverside Dr approaching 3220 Riverside Dr. Unit 1 slowed down to attempt a left-hand turn into 3220 Riverside Dr. Unit 2 failed to keep assured clear distance and struck the right rear of unit 1. The driver of unit 2 was cited for failure to maintain assured clear distance ahead.

June 7

Officer was dispatched to provide mutual aid to Sharon Township on an intoxicated individual making suicidal statements. The individual was eventually transported to the hospital safely.

June 7

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Fishinger Rd. Both units 1 and 2 were stopped at the light. Unit 2 started moving before unit 1 and struck the center rear of unit 1. Unit 2 was issued a citation for ACDA.

June 7

Officer observed a vehicle fail to yield on a left-hand turn. Officer conducted a traffic stop and discovered that the driver was driving under suspension and had multiple felony warrants. Officer conducted an arrest for the outstanding warrants and the vehicle was released to the registered owner.

June 8

While traveling on Henderson Rd, officer observed a vehicle approaching in the opposite direction with their high beams activated. Officer initiated a traffic stop and explained why he conducted the stop. Officer discovered that the driver's license was not valid and he had multiple non-compliance suspensions. Officer cited the driver for driving under suspension. Officer asked if the front seat passenger, the registered owner, was able to drive the car to avoid impoundment. She agreed to, and they were released from the scene.

June 8

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr just south of Cranston Rd. Northbound unit 2 swerved into the southbound lane, striking southbound unit 1 on the passenger side. Unit 1 lost control and drove off the east side of the roadway. Neither party reported any injuries. Unit 1 was treated on scene by Norwich Township Medica 83. Unit 2 was issued a citation for a marked lanes violation.

June 11

Officers were dispatched to the Brookside Country Club on report of a suspicious person. After speaking with country club employees, officers located the individual and advised him per country club management that he was unwelcome and needed to leave. He was further advised that coming back in the future could lead to criminal charges. The individual stated he understood and left the property.

June 12

Officers were dispatched to the intersection of Henderson Rd and Riverside Dr on a non-injury accident. Unit 2 was southbound on Riverside Dr and attempted a left-hand turn onto Henderson Rd. The driver admitted the light was yellow and that she thought she had enough time to get through the intersection. Unit 2 struck northbound unit 1. The driver of unit 2 was cited for failing to yield on a left turn and driving without a valid driver's license.

June 12

Officers were dispatched to the intersection of W Dublin Granville Rd and Linworth Rd. Unit 2 was traveling westbound on W Dublin Granville Rd. Unit 1 was northbound on Linworth Rd and had to slow for traffic while passing through the intersection. Unit 2 proceeded to make a right-hand turn onto Linworth Rd and struck Unit 1. The driver of Unit 2 was cited for failure to yield right of way.

June 13

Officers were dispatched to the 2400 block of W Dublin Granville Rd on an injury accident. Unit 1, a bicycle, was riding outside of the solid white line while other vehicles were stopped in traffic. Unit 2 was westbound on W Dublin Granville Rd and was waved to make a lefthand turn into a parking lot. Unit 1 struck the rear of unit 2. The rider was transported to the hospital. Unit 1 was determined to be at fault with no citations being issued.

June 13

While participating in Operation Unity on Cleveland Ave, officers observed a vehicle with window tint that appeared to be beyond the legal limit. Officer initiated a traffic stop and discovered that's license was suspended. The driver was issued a summons for a non-valid operator license, driving under FRA suspension, and illegal window tint.

June 13

While participating in Operation Unity on Westerville Rd, officers observed a vehicle make an improper left turn. Officer discovered the driver had a temporary driver's permit but was not accompanied by another licensed driver. The vehicle was released to a valid driver and the driver was issued a citation for driving without a valid driver's license and violating rules for turns.

June 13

Officers were dispatched to the 1000 block of Blind Brook Dr on a neighbor complaint. Officers spoke with the caller, who stated that her neighbor had been playing his music too loud. Officers could hear the music, but it appeared to be within acceptable range for the time of day and area.

June 13

Officers responded to the area of S Hamilton Rd and US 33 to assist in searching for an escapee. Officers deployed an Unmanned Aircraft System to assist. Officers were unable to locate the escapee after an extended search and cleared the scene.

June 13

While participating in Operation Unity on Morse Rd, officers observed a vehicle traveling eastbound with no visible expiration sticker. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The driver was issued a summons for expired tags, driving while under a non-compliance suspension, and driving without a valid license.

June 14

Officer observed a black car traveling eastbound on Billingsley Rd with what appeared to be solid red headlights. Officer initiated a traffic stop and informed the driver that the headlights were illegal and unsafe. The driver did not have a license and could not provide proof of insurance. Officer discovered that the driver's license was suspended and that he had been arrested by OSHP for OVI. The driver was issued a citation for driving under suspension and a warning for improper lights.

June 14

Officer was dispatched to the 900 block of Bethel Rd on an accidental shooting. The victim was transported to the hospital. The victim had accidentally shot the tip of his index finger with a .223 handgun.

June 14

Officers responded to an accident on W Dublin Granville Rd at Flora Villa Dr. Unit 2 was traveling westbound and failed to stop in time for Unit 1. Unit 2 corrected to avoid a collision and the passenger side of unit 2 struck the driver side of unit 1. The driver of unit 2 was issued a citation for a marked lanes violation.

June 15

Officers observed a vehicle stopped on McVey Blvd and someone squatting and urinating in someone's front yard. The driver pulled away and officer witnessed the vehicle go through two stop signs. Officer initiated a traffic stop near McVey Blvd and Darwin Dr. Officer wrote warnings for the traffic violations and public urination.

June 16

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Hayden Rd. Unit 2's driver stated they attempted a left turn from Riverside onto Hayden with a green arrow. Unit 1 stated they were continuing through the intersection on a green traffic signal. Due to conflicting statements, no citation was issued.

June 17

Officer observed a black vehicle traveling eastbound on Henderson Rd with high beams on. The vehicle failed to turn off the high beams for both oncoming traffic and traffic in front of it. The vehicle additionally had a broken left taillight, brake light burnt out, and the license plate was displayed and partially obstructed in the rear window. Officer discovered that the driver did not have a valid license. The driver was cited for operating a motor vehicle without a valid license and white lights to rear of a moving vehicle.

June 17

Officer responded to a single car incident on Riverside Dr near Griggs Reservoir Frisbee Park. The vehicle swerved to the right into a guard rail after the vehicle in front of it was quick to stop for traffic. The vehicle was able to drive away from the scene and no citations were issued.

June 17

Officers responded to the area of Brookside Estates on a report of an Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) flying low and filming in complainant's backyard. The complainant stated that the UAS was retrieved by a white female with blonde hair, driving an orange & white car. Officer observed a vehicle and driver matching the description. She admitted that she was piloting a drone in the area and was capturing video of the neighborhood for her employer, "Homes.com". Officer gathered contact information and collected pertinent information.

June 17

Officer observed a pickup truck traveling southbound on Riverside Dr at a high rate of speed. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The driver was issued a citation for speed and operating a motor vehicle without a valid license.

June 18

Officers were dispatched to on a well-being check. The caller was concerned the individual was depressed and may harm herself. Officers were unable to contact the individual in person but were able to contact them by phone. She responded that they were okay and did not wish to harm herself.

June 19

Officers were dispatched to the Worthington Hills Country Club on a hit skip accident. Officers spoke with the owner of the struck vehicle. The owner stated that he observed an SUV parked to the right of his vehicle before he went into the country club. After exiting the club, he observed scratches and dings on the passenger side of his vehicle, and the SUV was gone. Officers were not able to locate the suspect's vehicle.

June 20

Officers responded to a non-injury accident at the intersection of Henderson Rd and Charlbury Rd. By the time officers arrived, one vehicle left the scene. Officers spoke with the remaining driver, who explained she struck the rear of the vehicle ahead of her when traffic stopped. The other driver told her that they had a family emergency and needed to leave. Officers did not create a crash report due to no victim reporting the incident.

June 20

Officer responded to the 2700 block of W Dublin Granville Rd on a request for a deer carcass tag. The driver had struck a deer in her vehicle. She was uninjured, refused a report, and did not request police assistance. A witness called and requested that an officer be dispatched so that he could claim the deceased deer for harvest. Officer completed an ODW Deer Carcass Receipt for the witness.

June 20

Officers were dispatched to the 6600 block of Merwin Rd on a juvenile complaint. The caller stated that two teenager males were running up to their house, ringing the doorbell, then running. Officers began high visibility patrols looking for the suspects. Officer located the teens at the same address and instructed them to come. The suspects did not follow Officer commands. Officers were able to detain the suspects and vehicle and gave them warnings to not ring doorbells and run, and not to run from the police.

June 21

Officer responded to a report of ding-dong ditching in the Worthington Hills neighborhood. A ring doorbell captured a young white male ring the doorbell then quickly flee on foot. The male was

concealing his face with dark fabric and wearing a hat. Officers also responded to similar incidents in the Brookside neighborhood on the same night. The subject did not appear to be attempting entry nor damaging anything. Sharon officers assisted by circulating the area.

June 22

While passing the 8200 block of Sawmill Rd, officer observed a vehicle approaching his cruiser from behind at a rapid speed. The vehicle passed the officer's cruiser. The radar antenna indicated a speed of 58 MPH. Officer allowed the driver to pass and conducted a traffic stop. Driver did not have a license on his person and presented expired registration. He was unable to provide proof of current insurance coverage. Officer issued a citation for no license and speeding. A friend of the driver arrived to pick up the driver and the vehicle.

June 22

Officers were dispatched to the 850 block of Old Woods in Sharon Township on mutual aid for a domestic violence incident.

June 22

Officer was dispatched to the 2500 block of Scioto View Ln on a theft of a vehicle. Grove City PD located the vehicle and the suspect on the same day.

June 23

Officers were dispatched to the 8100 block of Fairway Dr on a complaint from a resident that their son had not returned their car. The caller expressed that she would like her car back after her son had taken it sometime in January. The caller does not have a valid driver's license and her husband has dementia and is unable to drive. Officers made contact with the son, who advised that his parents' neighbors expressed concerns about his mother's driving. He felt it was best to take the vehicle away. Officers advised the caller to take a driver's exam to obtain a valid license first and that her son would be in touch to talk about her vehicle.

June 24

Officers were dispatched to the 2500 block of Scioto View Ln on a wellbeing check. Officers made contact with the subject.

June 25

While on patrol, officer observed a vehicle traveling westbound on SR-161. Officer observed that the vehicle's registration had expired in July of 2022. Officer initiated a traffic stop and determined that the driver had a temporary permit and did not have a valid licensed passenger. The driver was also unable to provide proof of insurance. Further inspection revealed that the driver was driving under an active non-compliance suspension. Driver was issued a citation for driving under suspension, operating a motor vehicle without a valid license, and failure to register a motor vehicle.

June 26

While conducting business checks in the 900 block of Bethel Rd, officer observed a heavily damaged vehicle with a missing front tire grinding along the roadway. The vehicle was starting to travel completely left of center as officer began to follow. Officer initiated a traffic stop. The driver had fumbling his speed and appeared to have heavy slurred speech. Officer could not smell an odor of an alcoholic beverage, but the driver's speech continued to be slurred. Officer conducted field sobriety tests. Officer conducted a BAC test which came at zero, and a urine test to be submitted to OSP lab. The driver was released to a responsible party and was not placed under arrest due to unknown test results of the urine sample.

June 26

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr near Zollinger Rd. Unit 1 was southbound and changed lanes to the right lane and struck unit 3 on the left side, then struck unit 2 on the right side. Unit 1 was issued a citation for changing lanes unsafely. All parties declined medical attention.

June 27

While on patrol on Sawmill Rd, officer observed a vehicle traveling at an excessive speed. Digital radar indicated a speed of 64 mph, which increased to 67 mph. Officer activated emergency lights. The driver made no effort to yield. The driver continued for nearly a mile and continued driving. The driver did not have a license. The driver eventually pulled over. The driver was issued a citation for speed, failing to comply with the signal of a police officer, and driving without a license.

June 27

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and Bethel rd. Unit 2 was northbound on Riverside Dr and attempted to pass Unit 1 on the right side, striking unit 1 while unit 1 attempted a right turn. Unit 2 had no driver's license or insurance. The driver of unit 2 was cited for no operator's license and improper passing.

June 27

Officer was driving north on Riverside Dr near Cranston and observed a vehicle fail to stop at a red light and make a right turn. Officer initiated a traffic stop and discovered that the driver did not have a valid driver's license. Officer also discovered that the driver had two previous cases for no operator's licenses from Franklin County. Officer issued a citation for failure to obey a traffic control device and operating a motor vehicle without a valid license.

June 28

Officer observed a vehicle traveling westbound on SR-161 west of Linworth Rd. The vehicle did not have any of its driving lights on, despite it being past midnight. Officer initiated a traffic stop. Officer determined that the driver was driving under an active non-compliance suspension. The driver was issued a citation for driving under suspension and failure to display lighted lights.

June 28

In Arlington Pointe, officer observed an occupied and running car parked perpendicular to the parking spaces, pulled up to the rear of parked and unattended vehicles. Officer activated their blue light bar upon entering the property. Officer observed a thin black male run from the west side of the parking lot to the occupied car and quickly jump in the rear driver's side seat. The vehicle rapidly came around the corner and drove directly at the cruiser. The driver drove his vehicle directly at the front right portion of the cruiser and impacted the area, causing minor damage to the patrol car. Officer attempted to follow the vehicle but was unable to see the tail lights. Officer alerted Dispatch and requested notification to neighboring agencies.

June 28

Officer was dispatched to the 2800 block of Nottingham Rd on a report of a road rage incident where the caller was assaulted. Officer was able to make contact with both parties and receive their respective stories.

June 28

Officer arrived at the 2500 block of Scioto View Ln to recover a confirmed stolen vehicle.

June 28

Officer was dispatched to the Arlington Pointe Apartments regarding a possible physical domestic altercation. The caller was a neighbor who was concerned about a male voice yelling and pounding on floors and walls next door and was concerned a woman was being abused.

June 29

Officer was traveling westbound on Billingsley Rd and observed Columbus Fire vehicles also traveling westbound. Officer observed large smoke clouds billowing north from the property. Officer was informed that there was a fire at the storage units in the 2600 block of Billingsley Rd. Columbus Fire requested Perry Officers to shut down Billingsley Rd to protect the fire hose that was running across the street. Worthington Battalion Chief and Perry Detective arrived on scene to conduct the investigation.

June 29

Officer was dispatched to the 2500 block of Scioto View Ln on a suspicious vehicle. Officer determined that the vehicle was stolen out of Columbus. The owner was notified that the vehicle was recovered.

June 29

Officers were dispatched to the pond behind 6700 McVey Blvd on report of a juvenile complaint. Officers located the group of kids, who admitted to breaking the glass bottles and kicking the deck railing. A parent of one of the children took custody of the group and transported them home with their respective parents' permission.

June 29

Officers responded to an accident on Riverside Dr near Griggs Park. Unit 2 spun while attempting to avoid vehicles racing on Riverside Dr, striking a guard rail. Unit 1 then struck unit 2. There were no further details for the alleged racing vehicles. No injuries were reported.

June 29

Officers responded to an accident at the intersection of Riverside Dr and McCoy Rd. Unit 1 failed to notice unit 2 was stopped and struck unit 2 in the rear. The driver of unit 1 was transported to the hospital. The driver of unit 1 was issued a citation for assured clear distance ahead.
