
2025 Road Improvements Project

The Perry Township Road Improvements Project is part of the Franklin County Engineer’s Office’s countywide Township Resurfacing Program. The Shelly Company was awarded the bid for the 2025 Township Resurfacing Program, and received LTIP grant money to fund the project. Candlewood Dr, Candlewood Ln, Beechlake Dr, Markhaven Dr, and Markland St will be rehabilitated as part of the project.

Safe Routes to School Sidewalk Construction Projects

Perry Township applied for Safe Routes to School (SRTS) funding with the Franklin County Engineer’s Office and the Worthington schools District in 2022. Projects at both Brookside Elementary and Worthington Hills Elementary were approved for funding by ODOT.



The SRTS projects include the construction of sidewalks near both elementary schools, as well as the installation of high visibility crosswalks and ADA compliant curb ramps. Aqua Waterline Replacements

Aqua will replace around four-hundred feet of waterline in the area of Tennyson Ct. The project is expected to begin after the 4th of July.

Additionally, Aqua will replace waterline on Mission Hills Ln and Singing Hills Ln. This project is expected to begin at the end of July, or at the beginning of August. While the majority of this work will be in the Sharon Township portion of Worthington Hills, Perry Township residents are advised that there will be open cuts down the roads which will limit traffic on both roads. The line will also need to be extended across Clubview Blvd, which may temporarily interrupt traffic.



Once the construction dates for the Aqua projects are confirmed by the Road Department, notices will be posted to the Construction Updates page on the Perry Township website.

REGULATION OF SOLICITATION & TRANSIENT VENDORS



The Police Department would like to remind residents that commercial solicitors and vendors are prohibited from going door-to-door without a permit in Perry Township. Pursuant to Township Resolution 107-08 and O.R.C. § 2911.21, solicitation without a permit is prohibited in the unincorporated areas of Perry Township. Salespersons are required to obtain a transient vendor permit from the Police Department. They must present their transient vendor permit to residents upon request. It is unlawful to solicit in Perry Township without a permit.

The Police Department encourages residents to always request a door-to-door salesperson present their transient vendor permit. If the salesperson fails to present their permit or claims they do not need one, we suggest residents ask the salesperson to leave their property. Report the incident to the Police Department by the non-emergency line at 614-889-1231 to have an officer dispatched to assist you.

PERRY TOWNSHIP STUDENT SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Perry Township offers an internship program for high school students which provides a work-based learning experience. The program is open to students entering their Junior or Senior year in the Fall of 2025. Applicants must be at least 16 years old, legally eligible to work in the United States, must not have any recorded disciplinary or criminal charges, and must be able to commit to fulfilling the dates and times of the internship period.

PERRY TOWNSHIP POLICE DEPARTMENT CADET PROGRAM

The Police Department offers a cadet program to 15 to 20 year-olds interested in a future in law enforcement. Cadet candidates will go through a training period before being able to participate in ride-alongs with Police Officers. Training includes first aid and CPR, directing traffic, report writing, and officer safety.

Franklin Soil & Water Conservation District's Pick Up Poop (PUP) campaign encourages residents to clean up after their pets to protect our waters and promote a healthy community.

During rain events, dog waste left on the ground can wash away through the sewer systems and end up in lakes and rivers, polluting fresh water supplies. Nutrients in dog waste, like nitrogen and phosphorous, dissolve and can contribute to algal growth, depleting oxygen for fish and other aquatic life. Bacteria and other organisms in pet waste can also spread through water to other animals and humans.

Instead, pick up your pet's waste with a bag or a scooper, and throw it away in the trash. Not only is it environmentally healthy, it's the courteous thing to do.

Perry Township requires the proper disposal of animal waste pursuant to Home Rule Resolution LHR-126-17. It's not just a good idea to dispose of your pet's waste, it's the law!

SPECIAL EVENT PERMITS IN PERRY TOWNSHIP



Residents and organizations who would like to host an event, such as a block party or race, which closes off any part of a road in Perry Township are required to submit a Special Event Application.

Special Event Applications are reviewed by the Perry Township Road and Police Departments, as well as either Worthington Fire & EMS or the Upper Arlington Fire Division, depending on the location of the event. There is a \$25.00 permit fee for individuals and organizations. For community HOAs, civic associations, and school events, there is no fee.

GOLF CART & UNDER-SPEED VEHICLE INSPECTIONS



Golf carts and similar under-speed vehicles are popular in Perry Township, especially during the summertime around the 4th of July. Golf carts and under-speed vehicles are permitted in both Brookside Estates and Worthington Hills. However, before you can begin driving your golf cart on the road, it must meet several legal requirements to be certified for use on public roadways.

The Perry Township Police Department provides inspections for getting your golf cart certified. Inspections can be arranged by calling the Department at (614) 889-9508. Once all inspection requirements have been met, you will be given an Inspection Certificate to take to the Title Office in Franklin County.

Unclaimed Funds

& How to Claim Them

Franklin County has one of the largest amounts of unclaimed funds in Ohio. The Ohio Department of Commerce (ODC) safeguards unclaimed or abandoned money and other assets not used for a length of time or whose rightful owner cannot be located and turned over to the Division of Unclaimed Funds. This includes bank accounts, rent or utility deposits, uncashed checks, undelivered stock certificates, uncashed insurance policies and more.

SAFER SOCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR EMERGENCY REDUCTION

SAFER is a social wellness program operating within the Worthington Division of Fire & EMS, designed to connect at-risk populations with necessary community resources and interventions at no cost to participants. SAFER is designed to especially help:

- Frequent users of emergency services
- Isolated and/or vulnerable older adults
- Individuals diagnosed with substance abuse/mental health issues
- Individuals or families facing food insecurity

SAFER is staffed by a part-time social worker assigned as a service coordinator who specializes in connecting at-risk populations with necessary community resources at no cost to those being served.
