The Board of Township Trustees (the "Board") of Perry Township (the "Township"), Franklin County, Ohio, met in regular session on March 7, 2022, at 6:30 p.m. at 7125 Sawmill Drive, Dublin, Ohio 43016, with the following members present:

Mr. Chet Chaney introduced the following resolution in writing:

PERRY TOWNSHIP LIMITED HOME RULE RESOLUTION NO. 128-22

**RESOLUTION ENACTING REGULATIONS FOR THE PARKING OF VEHICLES
ON DESIGNATED STREETS AND RIGHTS-OF-WAY IN PERRY TOWNSHIP,
FRANKLIN COUNTY, OHIO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the Township adopted a limited home rule form of government pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("R.C.") Chapter 504; and

WHEREAS, the Board, pursuant to R.C. Section 504.04, has the authority to exercise all powers of local self-government within the unincorporated area of the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is in the best interest of the residents and the Township and that the public safety and welfare would be served by the following parking regulations; and

WHEREAS, the regulations adopted herein do not conflict with the Uniform Traffic Act, and are applicable only to the unincorporated areas of the Township.

Resolution

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Perry Township, Franklin County, Ohio that:

Section 1. No person shall stop, stand, or park any vehicle on or along the side(s) of the following Township roads, including the rights-of-way, where designated as no-parking areas by traffic control devices such as signage:

- A. Courtyard Landing
- B. Scioto Bluff Avenue
- C. Scioto Highland Road
- D. River Hollow Road
- E. Water Bank Street
- F. Deer Cliff Road

Section 2. The prohibition in Section 1 of this Resolution notwithstanding, all police, fire, ambulance operators, mail carriers, delivery persons, garbage and trash removal personnel, all similar persons, and the local governmental authorities may stop, stand, or park their vehicles for a reasonable time in the performance of their official duties.

Section 3. The Board hereby orders into storage any vehicle stopped, standing, or parked in violation of these regulations. The owner or any lienholder of a vehicle ordered into storage may claim the vehicle upon presentation of proof of ownership, which may be evidenced by a certificate of title to the vehicle, and payment of all expenses, charges, and fines incurred as a result of the parking violation and removal and storage of the vehicle.

Section 4. In addition to all other applicable penalties, whosoever violates Section 1 of this Resolution shall be subject to a civil fine punishable according to the civil fine schedule as follows:

1st Violation: \$150.00.

2nd Violation within 12 consecutive months: \$250.00.

3rd and Subsequent Violations within 12 consecutive months: \$500.00.

Section 5. The parking areas regulated as stated above shall be designated by the installation of traffic control devices conforming to R.C. Section 4511.09.

Section 6. The Fiscal Officer shall publish this Resolution and/or a summary of this Resolution on the Township's website.

Section 7. Should any part or Section of this Resolution be adjudged unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by any court or other body or person empowered to do so, this adjudication shall not invalidate those other parts or Section(s) herein.

Section 8. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including, without limitation, Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 9. This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the Township and its inhabitants for the reason that such regulations are necessary to protect residents' health, safety, and access along Township streets and rights-of-way. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest time allowed by law.

Following its introduction, the Resolution was read by the Township Fiscal Officer by title only.

Mr. Chet Chaney moved to waive the second reading of the of the resolution and authorize adoption on the first reading and the motion was seconded by Mr. Jim Roper. Roll was called on the question of waiving and the results were:
